IRON BRIDGE

Kingsweston Lane Bridge is a grade II listed cast iron footbridge that was built around 1800 and spans Kingsweston Lane, linking Blaise Castle Estate to Kingsweston Fields. It was closed in 2015 after a series of strikes by trucks made it unstable and unsafe. Since then, it has been secured and propped up by scaffolding. At a meeting in June 2023, cabinet agreed proposals to dismantle the bridge and repair it off-site and reinstate it using £1 million from the **Highway Infrastructure Bridge Investments fund**. Repairs are due to be completed by December 2024



Warhorses - Shirehampton Remount Depot

Continued from page 1.

Avon Local History & Archaeology ("ALHA") group has recently published a well-researched booklet about this Depot which was established at the commencement of the First World War and represents one of the most important episodes in the history of Shirehampton and Avonmouth.

As the author, **Professor Richard Coates**, explains, the term "remount" originated in the late eighteenth century and meant a 'stock of horses suitable for use by the cavalry'. This later extended to mean 'an individual horse suitable to replace one that is exhausted, injured or has died' (Oxford English Dictionary).

When the First World War broke out, the then Minister for Munitions, Lord Kitchener appreciated that the environment of Shirehampton was an ideal place to have such a depot because of its proximity to the Avonmouth Docks (where horses could be transported to the western front), its good railway connections and the potential fields for such a base. Thus one of the largest remount depots in the UK was erected.

The size of the depot was huge - it stretched from Station Road to the present location of the Portway roundabout (over a mile) and from the Bristol-Avonmouth railway line to the present Avonmouth Road north of West Town Road. There were 35 paddocks each with two stables capable of holding a troop of horses (i.e. 100). Therefore, the depot was capable of holding 7,000 horses. Many horses and mules were sourced from as far as Canada, USA and even New Zealand.

In addition, there was a veterinary hospital, forage barns, and accommodation for the vast military, auxiliary personnel, vets, cooks.

The Remount processed horses for heavy and light haulage duties and mules for pack duties - especially for ferrying supplies to the front line - and here they received health checks and basic training before being shipped to the western front.

The author of ALHA's booklet has pieced together the history of this Depot from extensive research and records held from such sources as the British Archives, Bristol Museum & Galleries and community papers - primarily the Western Daily Press - to build a picture of life at the depot during the First World War. The booklet describes the personnel who ran the depot, the treatment of the horses, the military based at the camp and the social impact it had on Shirehampton as well as extracts from some personal letters of life at the depot.

The Fate of the Remount

In the final chapter the author details the fate of the remount after 1919. After the war was over, the Remount Depot was disbanded as quickly as it had been established and no sentiment was spared on its removal. The sale of the horses commenced a week after Armistice at Bristol Cattle Market and the buildings progressively dismantled.







King Charles III England Coast Path NOW Open Old Passage, Aust to Wain's Hill, Clevedon England Coast Pith (commenced june 2022)

July saw the opening of the latest stretch of the King Charles III England Coast Path, extending from Aust to Clevedon.

The new path stretches from **Old Passage near Aust** just south of the Old Severn Bridge in South Gloucestershire through to **Wain's Hill, Clevedon**, in North Somerset. It is the second phase of the path between Aust and Brean Down. 23 miles of these lengths of King Charles III England Coast Path adds to the 12 miles already open in this stretch.

Route highlights include excellent views of the **Severn Estuary** and the crossings to **Wales** contrasting with the industrial landscape near the **Port of Bristol**. It also runs through the **Portbury**

Wharf Nature Reserve on the edge of the Severn Estuary between Portishead and Royal Portbury Dock, which consists of wetlands and saltmarsh.

There are national plans to secure a long-distance walking trail around the open coast of England, together with public access rights to a wider area of land along the way for people to enjoy. **Natural England** is working on the entire coastal route.

An important barrier is that public speaking – a quintessential skill in politics - is not generally taught in state schools.

We need people from all backgrounds to enter politics if we want everyone to feel truly represented in Parliament. And to achieve this, we need to equip all children with the necessary skills for the job.

During summer recess, my wife and I welcomed our From October, I'll be heading into local secondary schools to share what I've learned from working in law and politics about crafting an argument and delivering it to an audience with confidence.



The Strange An original story by Gil Osman

(Previously: the new and first chieftain of the Stone Age village (on the site of the present Shirehampton) had decreed, after taking his father's advice, that all village land belonged to the villagers themselves and not to any individual - the very first law in village history. The new chief's house was being built by four village experts in honour of their new Chieftain and to show their thanks for having a leader at last)

Chapter 13

he new Chieftain had made an impressive start. He adopted the sign of a chieftain, a blue mark in woad (blue dye) on his forehead (remembered in tribal memory from hunter/gatherer days).

During the week when the Chief's House was being built, the Chieftain himself became like a man possessed. All sorts of ideas came into his head from where he did not know. His father was amazed, for his son had shown little interest in the village before. Influenced by his father's previous advice on the First Law, he decided to form an advisory group of village elders (including his father) to meet regularly and discuss village matters. As he himself knew none of the older men in the village, he asked his father, who knew them well, to choose about twelve of the wisest ones and invite them to a meeting in his family's house to discuss his plans for the future.

At the meeting he first explained that all new village matters would be discussed by the group and then a decision taken; the Chieftain having the final say, if necessary. The elders were impressed and flattered by this. Many had felt that they were ignored by other villagers, despite their age and experience. This gave them a new status in the community. Then the Chieftain outlined other plans.

He had noticed that the four builders, who were building his new house and had suggested the idea in the first place to honour their new leader, usually competed with each other for work. However, in this case they worked happily on the project together and had attracted many willing volunteers to act as labourers. Seeing how this engendered a sense of co-operation and ownership among the villagers, he thought of other community projects. The first being a water preservation plan.

His next big idea was to form a group of young men (armed hunters) to protect the village and help the Chieftain to restore law and order. He called a meeting of the hunters, and they also welcomed the move; there was no want of volunteers. The hunters already enjoyed greater status in the community, when the Chieftain, a hunter (one of their own) was made leader after killing the giant stag, and now they would enjoy even greater status as protectors of the village. They were called The Guardians, a new word in the tribal dialect.

All this activity had created a sense of excitement among the villagers and got them talking together, especially those who volunteered to work on the Chief's New House, some of whom had never conversed before. The Chieftain's father was extremely pleased that his son's actions were the cause of this. Even The Strange and Friend felt the excitement and watched all the increased activity among the villagers through the spyholes in their isolated house with great interest.

The tribal language was expanding rapidly to accommodate all these activities and the discussion needed amongst all those involved to understand what was required. Sometimes it was necessary to draw rough plans on the ground with a stick to explain what was needed (the beginnings of a written language and simple arithmetic).

DREAMLINES: Picturing Bristol High Streets

The stories of Bristol's high streets and the communities who inhabit them are being told in collaboration with leading Bristol-based and international photographers this autumn as part of DREAMLINES, a photography project by Bristol Photo Festival. Photographers have worked alongside a range of communities and businesses including the nearly 100-year Bakers Corner, Shirehampton Men's Social Club, Filton Avenue's food bank, the Shire Stitchers textile club, a young mums group in Stapleton Road and Two Mile Hill's Salvation Army brass band.

Free family workshops will be held at the **Methodist Church** inviting people to experiment with alternative photography techniques and archival images from Shirehampton held at **Bristol Archives**.





The generosity of everyone who has supported the walk either by coming along or by donating has been overwhelming. The current total is £1,683.00.


