
If you have a club or have a friend or family member attending a club that you think others should know about and enjoy, please get in touch with me, with an article or a report that can be worked up by our editorial staff.



# Seed Swap

On the afternoon of Saturday 17th February, the Cotswold Community Centre opened its doors for a community seed swap. Sprouted out of an idea at short notice, it was none-the-less a success, with around thirty people dropping in during the hour, and over 150 packets of seeds swapped.

Best of all, a great range of people came. We had folks from three of the local five allotments, some of whom have been growing for decades, some getting ready for their first season. We had staff from **Nova Primary School** choosing seeds for the kids to plant. We had people wanting to try a few varieties of veg at home, and others bringing fascinating unusual edibles like purple orach.

There were seeds in abundance. People brought seeds they had saved from last year's crops, especially beans which are easily dried and stored. They brought spares from large packets that they won't need this year – after all, who needs 20 courgette plants?! We also made good use of spare seed from the previous year: some varieties stay viable for many years, and you don't need to buy a packet each year.

Across four tables we had tiny packets of potential sweetcorn, carrots, onions, kale, at least five types of beans and peas, squash, tomatoes, leafy salads, radishes, cucumbers, courgettes, herbs, flowers and even some woad.

We talked with the kids about how communities have been saving and swapping seeds for as long as people have been growing plants for food. And over a cup of tea and homemade cake we shared plans for the season and tips for best results.

A huge thank you to the **Cotswold Community Centre** for use of the building, and to all those who made cake and put-up posters. A great thanks

## **Get Ready to Vote this May**

On the 2nd May Bristol will vote for local councillors and for the Police and Crime Commissioner. The outcome of this election will shape what happens in Bristol over the next years, our social care, libraries, and many other services are led by Bristol City Council.

Residents in Bristol will need to show photographic ID to vote in local elections on 2 May and are being urged to make sure they are ready to vote by checking they have an accepted form of ID, and that they are registered to vote. Accepted forms of ID include a UK, European Economic Area (EEA) or Commonwealth passport or drivers' licence; and some concessionary travel passes, such as an older person's bus pass or an Oyster 60+ card. Voters will be able to use expired ID if they are still recognisable from the photo.

Anyone who does not have one of the accepted forms of ID will be able to apply for free ID online at www.voter-authority-certificate.service.gov. uk or you can call 0117 92 23400 or email voterid@bristol.gov.uk - Bristol City Council's Electoral Service to receive a paper application in the post.

Anyone who wants to have their say in the elections this May must also be registered to vote.

It only takes five minutes to register online at **www. gov.uk/register-to-vote**. Voters wishing to apply to their council for free ID should first make sure they are registered to vote.

The requirement to show photo ID at the polling station was introduced by the UK Government's Elections Act and came into effect for the first time in May 2023.

## **A Spring Walk with Stoke Lodge Ramblers**

A hidden Cotswold valley, a former Tudor hunting lodge and a Norman church. Only just over 20 miles from Bristol, the Ozleworth Valley and Newark Park feel worlds and centuries away from modern life. With no major roads nearby and no through road along the valley, this is a peaceful area best explored on foot along quiet country lanes, tracks and way-marked paths.

The Cotswold Way runs nearby. Newark Park and its estate, in the care of the National Trust, stand high on the Cotswold escarpment, looking down over the Ozleworth valley. The house is a former Tudor hunting lodge, built around 1550 for the Tudor courtier Sir Nicholas Poyntz. Much enlarged over the centuries, it has an interesting but rather chequered history. In modern times, it was saved by American benefactor, Robert Parsons, who lived and worked at Newark Park for 30 years from the 1970's onwards, with major restoration undertaken during his time there. On a clear day, unspoilt views reach as far as the Mendips, with barely a sign of modern life to be seen. The estate opens in February for visitors to enjoy snowdrops and other early spring flowers along its woodland walks.

Our group from Stoke Lodge Ramblers enjoyed an unexpectedly spring-like day in mid-February for our short amble from Newark Park to Ozleworth and back. From Newark Park, our route took us gently downhill via peaceful country lanes to Ozleworth Park. On nearing the house via a public right of way (through a gate labelled "to the church"), we were treated to a wonderful display of early daffodils alongside the path. As we followed the signed path, the secluded little gem of an estate church came into view, set in its circular churchyard, alongside the house and stable yard (both private). The Norman church, dedicated to St. Nicholas of Myra, is in the care of the Churches Conservation Trust and is open to visitors. Particularly of note are the unusual hexagonal tower, Norman carvings and some mediaeval stained glass. Robert Parsons is buried in the churchyard. A spot to linger and take in history and atmosphere.

We returned uphill to Newark Park for simple refreshments in the NT tent, being entertained during lunch by displays from the estate peacocks. The afternoon held the possibility of a visit to the house or a wander along the estate paths (muddy in parts) to enjoy more snowdrops and views across the valley and lake.

All of us agreed that it had been a good day out away from it all.....helped by the weather, of course.

# An Update from Darren Jones MP,

## **Bristol North West**

Some things are worth the wait. Like the taste of your first chocolate egg when you've been good and waited until Easter Sunday to crack it open.

Many will say (and I would strongly agree) that the felt that a zebra crossing is needed. It sounds like a restoration of the Iron Bridge has taken far too long. However, on a recent visit to the warehouse where work is underway on the bridge for a progress report from the engineers, I was pleased to see that traditional techniques and original components are being used, wherever possible, to faithfully restore the bridge to its former glory. Sadly, though, when the truck crashed into the bridge, it damaged three of the four arches across the bottom of the bridge, and only one remains intact.

To prevent this from ever happening again, the restoration works include raising the bridge with heightened walls. I am also contacting Google to ask for a warning to be added to Google Maps to advise HGV drivers to use an alternative route. The bridge height issue aside, the road is not suitable for HGVs.

In other road safety news, plans to get a new zebra crossing installed on the Long Cross have taken a big step forward. Parents at Oasis Academy Bank Leaze Primary School in Lawrence Weston have long wanted a zebra crossing to be installed on the Long Cross. There's already traffic calming measures and a pedestrian crossing, but it is strongly

simple ask, but you'd be surprised how much one zebra crossing costs when you factor in replacing paving slabs with tarmac, dropping curbs, and adding tactile paving at the crossing for visually impaired and blind people. I've held several discussions with the housing association Curo to secure funding for this new crossing. Indeed, I had hoped that the zebra crossing might be installed as part of its ongoing redevelopment works in the area, but I've been told that this work has progressed too far to change the plans. Instead, Curo has committed to include funding for the new zebra crossing in its upcoming planning application for the redevelopment of the former Holly House Care Home, which they will be submitting for approval in late spring.

Finally, one thing that I think we can all agree that we're tired of waiting for is buses! Therefore, I was thrilled when I saw the headlines about First Bus introducing a new service from 7th April, the number 41, which will connect Kingswood and East Bristol with Sea Mills, Shirehampton and Avonmouth. But the news came alongside an announcement that the number 3 will no longer go to Avonmouth. Many constituents have already



contacted me about how this will impact kids who rely on the service to get to school; people who work at Cribbs Causeway, and night workers more generally; and how it could prevent people from being able to access the food bank. The concerns are many, valid and serious. I am therefore writing an urgent letter to First Bus about this route change, and I'll update you on the response in my next column.

# Flooded Again!

Tuesday 12 March

Trains from Clifton Down to Severn Beach were cancelled this morning because of flooding at Sea Mills. Eye witnesses report Station is inaccessible because of flooding beneath the viaduct.

We have just come through the wettest February ever. The ground has been squelching for days. And this morning **Shirehampton** is cut off by flooding along the train line. So, it seems appropriate that the **Climate Emergency Group** is planning a Saturday morning talk and workshop on the **Risk of Flooding in Shirehampton** and what we should do about it. We know some parts of Shire are at risk of flood from the river and the tide, but nowhere in Shirehampton, indeed nowhere in Britain, is safe from groundwater flooding.

We've invited speakers from Bristol City Council's Flood Risk Management team to come on Saturday 27th April to explain what we in Shire can expect from local flooding and what the Council is doing, or wants us to do, to minimize the danger and disruption we might face.

The Flood Awareness morning will be held in the Public Hall from 10:00 to 12:30 on Saturday 27th April (see our advert on page 6). There will be time for questions after the talks, and then we will ask all of you who come to take part in a workshop where you can explore what YOU think we can all do to prepare for such events. I know it's frightening to think about these possibilities, but facing them

together knowing we will be helping one another will make us all more resilient. So I hope many of you will come on the 27th. There will be posters and social media reminders nearer the time and free coffee and cake on the day.

I have to say how sorry we are that there was no Climate Fashion Café in March! Microsoft in its wisdom put all my requests to book the Hall for March 16th into junk!! By the time we had sorted it all out all available days before Easter had been booked! The Climate Fashion Café will be back on Saturday May 18th and we hope to see you and all your Easter finery then.





# Shirehampton Hub at the Methodist Church

The great news is that our Community Fridge activity is now doing much better, in that waste food from several more outlets are available through the week due to us signing up with Fareshare. We now have regular food from Tesco, Aldi, Sainsbury's, KFC and Nandos, to name a few. This is in addition to our previous sources, Avonmouth Coop and Redland Bakery. Plus some occasional M&S supplies the Foodbank couldn't quickly distribute. We also had that phenomenon with the eggs, earlier in February with 20,000 eggs distributed!

In the first two weeks of the new scheme the **Community Fridge** distributed 174kg of food which saves 423kg of CO<sub>2</sub> in wasted food. There's a new **WhatsApp group** for information as to food available each day – **Shire Hub Food Group**. Please note that you need to come to the Hub for this.

Special events coming up: **Darren** is developing an **Open Day for Wellbeing Groups**, and **Bristol City Council** has booked for a themed jobs and careers fair – for roles in Social Care and Parks & Green Spaces.

Well, that's it for this month other than one of my silly yarns - so here goes.....



The work done by the F.A. on reform of youth football has increased participation greatly but one of the most remarkable statistics, published last year by **The Guardian**, is that in 2023 there were 100,000 more girls playing football than five years previously. The recent success of The Lionesses has undoubtedly boosted and helped to maintain participation, but that success was itself built upon 2010 F.A. review.

The benefits for children involved in team sports are well known and include development of fitness, social skills, discipline, competitive spirit, self-esteem and pride as well as learning to be part of a team, learning to cope with pressure and learning to deal with both disappointment and success alike. We can only applaud wholeheartedly those people who are working from day to day in our communities to provide those benefits for our children.

The former Los Angeles Lakers basketball player "Magic" Johnson had this to say about what our children are looking for when they join a football club, "All soccer players and kids need is a little help, a little hope, and somebody who believes in them."

Two of our local clubs who are providing that help, hope and belief are Port of Bristol Youth and **Shire Colts**. Both clubs run teams from u7 to u18.

# Youth Football in Bristol North: Shine Football Squads

If you've read the "Football's more than just a game" article, then you'll be waiting for the answer to a question; just what are those young Shire golfers doing now? (If you haven't read it yet, maybe read it first and come back to this afterwards.) Well, here they are now, along with another colleague, Will Powell. The answer is that they are coaching football and other sports with the current generation of youngsters at Shine, a commercial organisation based in Henleaze offering coaching and competitive games in a range of sports as well as holiday clubs and other activities.

There are several children from, or who have family in Shire, who play in the **Shine squads**. **Ismael**, for example, has spent many hours honing his skills and fitness on the playing fields of the **PBA on Nibley Rd**, and our kids are so lucky to have that fantastic facility on our doorstep with so many dedicated people there doing fantastic work with our youngsters.

To give a flavour of the work that the Shine coaches do, here's an extract of a report done by a parent on one of Shine u9's matches:

"The first half ended 1-1 and the second half was equally competitive both teams having chances; Felix and Schcow both hit the post, as did the opposition. It was the other team who scored again though and then went further ahead to make it 3-1 as the match entered the final third. There was no sense of despondency from the Shine boys as they fought like tigers to bring the match back. Felix was persistently threatening on goal, drawing defenders to him and Schcow took advantage, his "trademark" industry and skill bringing us the second. Then with the match approaching its final minute or two, Ismael produced a goal that I believe only he saw coming. From outside a crowded penalty area, he looked up, saw the keeper slightly off his line and produced a sublime millimetre perfect lob that the goalie could only watch sail over his head and dip under the bar into the top centre of the net. 3-3 at full time. Liam said after the game that you can coach skills like this, but you cannot teach character and this team has that in abundance. Liam also said that at no stage did the lads let their heads drop, which would have been easy to do having undeservedly gone two goals down late on. Dom nominated Charlie for man of the match; nobody shows the enormous character and determination that this team has more than Charlie does. His doggedness, determination and never say die attitude seems to lift everyone around him. Well done Charlie and well done to all the lads when we had the odds stacked against us in this epic match."

Liam is right when he says that you can't teach character, but that underestimates the work that he, Dom and their colleagues do. You can't teach it, but you can recognise it, encourage it, develop it and help it to flower into an unstoppable force. In the words of "Magic" Johnson, Dom, Liam and his colleagues give our kids help, hope and they believe in them. If we believe in them, they will learn to believe in themselves. The future is bright for our "Beautiful Game!"

Squat – 82.5kg and a silver medal.

Bench press – 52.5kg which was a massive personal best and a bronze medal.

Deadlift – 147.5kg and another personal best and another silver medal.

Overall, I came 2nd to secure a silver medal and, as a team the Masters 3 Category secured a gold medal. I had the best time and met some amazing people and am very proud of my achievements.
