

Reopening

Shirehampton Library is now OPEN for Click and Collect from 1:00-4:00 pm Monday, Wednesday and Friday.

Shirehampton Public Hall will not reopen until the week commencing 17th May at the earliest, in line with government guidelines.

PBA CLUB reopened its outside area **Saturday 17th April. The football club** has resumed playing and training, the **Zumba** section held their first outdoor session, and the **bowling** section also resumed playing.



Bristol City Council

Bristol Harbour Festival cancelled.

Breaking Bread, Bristol Comedy Garden and the Spiegeltent are small scale events that will help a steady reopening. Monday 21 June is the earliest that large gatherings will once again be allowed.

The virus remains in circulation, with new strains being identified across the world and in the UK. This means we need to continue to work hard to keep infections low. Please follow the COVID-secure guidelines in place at pubs, restaurants and shopping.



Road Closures

To allow businesses to reopen outdoors please note these road closures.

Cotham Hill has closed to give businesses outdoor trading space to support reopening amid COVID-19 restrictions.

Two sections of the road are now closed to through traffic - Whiteladies Gate to Hampton Lane and Hampton Park to Abbotsford Road. Loading, deliveries and disabled parking are possible at both ends of the closed sections. The road is fully accessible by foot or cycle.

It joins similar road closures in the **Old City and King Street**, with temporary barriers also being used across the city to create new bike lanes and wider pavements.



funding in place to make the front of the building robust and beautiful again, including sorting/painting the render, adding some subtle lighting and generally making the hall more welcoming from the outside. We inherited a grant to repair the clock, and that too will be carried out once the roof has been completed

The Railway Club has been very proactive in agreeing to move into the old basement space (previously housing the central heating boilers, which have been replaced with air source heating in the main hall). A survey has been done to check for asbestos down there, and between the club members themselves, with some help from the hall trustees, that space should become much better for them to meet and use. Once the existing room housing the trains/track has been freed up we will be able to create a much more welcoming office space for Amanda, our Hall manager, and Ash from SCAF.

Thank You

Thanks to all you very generous hall users, who raised over £7k through the "just giving" fund, we are able to do the first phase of the hall upgrade. Those kind donations, and the matched funding, have made a real difference. There is also a further £13k coming from Bristol City Council "S106" money, which will be useful in some initial works at the hall.

Of course, the "Big Money" will be required to build the main extension at the back of the Hall which will house the new bar and catering facilities. These will make the Hall a more suitable venue for community functions.

We Are Looking for Help in Raising the Money

So if you feel that your employer might be willing to contribute, or that you might have some time yourself to get involved with fundraising, please do get in touch with Amanda on the normal contact email address.

We are hoping that the **Community Asset Transfer (CAT)** process will be completed soon – freeing us to deliver the improvements to the hall that have been in planning for several years.

We are now going to be working with the conservation architect, Quentin Alder, to apply for Listed Building consent for refurbishment of the existing building. If you would like to know more and possibly get involved do get in touch, and be part of that journey!!






well as getting into nature making terracotta snails and learning about Spring, discovering how to grow cress without using soil.

Shirehampton Community Action Forum (SCAF) is a small, grass-roots community organisation based at Shire Public Hall. We are a registered charity and not for profit company limited by guarantee established in 2001 to work for the benefit of everyone in Shire and <u>SCAF Needs New Trustees</u>. We are looking for new Trustees to join our Board. When Coronavirus restrictions are fully lifted the Board will meet every 4-6 weeks on a weekday at Shire Public Hall.

Community Safety Action Group

SCAF supports the Community Safety Action Group working in close partnership with the Police, statutory agencies, local organisations & residents. Chaired by our Beat Manager, PC Mark Blackledge, this group sets the PACT (Partners and Communities Together) for Shirehampton. The current PACT priority is Anti-Social Behaviour. Other key areas of work include:

- Regular "walkabouts" in Shire logging everything that needs fixing. We work with our partners to put things right!
- Domestic Violence and Abuse.
- Licensing enforcement alcohol related crime is a significant issue in Shirehampton.
- Road safety issues including facilitating public.
- Community litter picks & clean ups.

SCAF Planning Watch & Group

SCAF Planning Watch produces a free weekly Planning Watch bulletin monitoring all planning applications/developments affecting community buildings & facilities, commercial/industrial/business premises in Avonmouth & Lawrence Weston ward.

- We support local residents concerned about new planning applications and large proposed industrial plants/developments in Avonmouth.
- We facilitate public consultations.
- We host housing developers' presentations at Full Forum Meetings.
- Shire Planning Group Meets Quarterly Jan/ April/July October on the 2nd Wednesday of the month 7pm at Shire Methodist Church, to review local planning applications of community interest.

Working with Bristol City Council

SCAF works with BCC on the redevelopment of **St Mary's Rec AKA Beachley Walk** park & children's play area. Phase 1 – new MUGA (Multi Use Games Area) Court completed. Phase 2 New Children's Play Area - scheduled to begin work on 26 April.

Shire Community Plan

SCAF works to deliver the 5 year (2018 – 2023) Shire Community Plan.

- PCRF Thriving High streets: working with Sustrans to improve Shire High Street.

Partnership with Young Bristol, Oasis Academy Brightstowe, Avonmouth CA, BCC Youth Services delivering a range of activities and projects for local young people. We hope to take over the management /running of 60 The Ridge – formerly Penpole Residents Association Community building.

Walking Groups

Shire "Nomads" - Free weekly (Tuesday) walking group for the over 55's, progressive walks up to 5 miles and 3 hours long. The walks are a mixture of town & country routes for advanced walkers who enjoy meeting like-minded people and keeping fit by walking.

Shire "Walkie Talkies" - This is a *Walking For Health* group for the over 55's providing a free weekly (Wednesday) walks programme. A mixture of town and country routes covering 2 - 3 miles and up to 90 minutes. Aimed at people who are doing little exercise at the moment, but who would like to become more active.

PUBLIC HALL RE-OPENING

Following a meeting of the Hall Trustees at the end of March it has been decided that the Hall should not reopen until the week commencing 17th May at the earliest, in line with government guidelines. This decision has been made largely due to financial constraints - the Hall has suffered enormous financial loss over the past twelve months, and despite furlough ending it would cost the Hall substantially more to reopen sooner in terms of running costs, e.g.. cleaning and administration, than it would to open later in the Spring.



A Life on the Tugs

Maurice went to school in Avonmouth and later Portway where at the time the boys' school was just a collection of huts and was very cold in the winter. He left school when he was fifteen and went to work for a printing firm but it wasn't for him, he wanted to join the merchant navy. Maurice started work as a deck boy for C. J. King tug in October 1955 but never did join the Merch. He rose up through the ranks becoming second mate then mate and finally captain when he was nineteen, the

youngest skipper in the fleet.

His Mother didn't want him to go to sea, and he also started dating me, but most of all he loved the job, and so he stayed. It wasn't all good, the hours were long and he could be called out day and night. Sometimes I didn't see him for days; he worked, ate, and slept on the tug.

The tug was to travel light Avonmouth ready dock a ship the morning. Maurice was mate at the time but had permission to take me for a trip down the river. Just past the Horseshoe Bend we saw the Campbell steamer coming toward us loaded with passengers, all waving, and ablaze with lights. I thought she looked beautiful and said so. Maurice gave a gasp and


said a few inches closer and we would have collided. Not so lucky on a cold November night on the tug Sea Prince. They were waiting to dock a ship called the Cato. The tug went to take hold, got too close and there was a collision. Maurice, who was mate at the time, tried to slip the rope but the tug capsized. Underneath the tug he had to kick his legs and hope to surface away from her, which he did but as he surfaced the fifteen year old deck boy grabbed at him sending him under again. He was lucky to survive. Not so lucky was the engineer who went down with the tug. She is still somewhere in the channel.

too was not all plain sailing as a wire snapped as they swung her in the channel and had the other wire snapped she would have been swept away on the tide: she needed very careful handling!

C.J. King branched into longer tows and Maurice did several trips away. The first was to Ireland during the troubles when, as he said, there were bollards everywhere, pub toilets had no roofs, they had been blown off, and he was so nervous he couldn't wait to get back on board. He did trips to Spain and Portugal and Scotland but another memorable time was when the tug was called to rescue some cadets on a Norwegian sailing ship. The ship was the Christian



Radich (which I believe was used in the television series The Onedin Line). Her back up engines had failed and they were off Lands End with no food or fresh water. When they reached her the cadets were up in the rigging and on deck cheering. After towing her in to Falmouth for stores they then towed her all the way home to Trondyke. Coming home they had to travel part of the way through the fjords because the sea was so rough.

Maurice towed the Royal Yacht Britannia to Bristol with the Queen on board. He was reprimanded by a member of her crew for looking at the Queen through binoculars but in all honesty he was more interested in the ship, a real beauty he said, and had no idea her majesty was on deck.

Over the years Maurice made some very good friends, who have remained so, although given all the pranks they played on each other it's amazing. It was a difficult decision when he decided to leave this job he loved and all his mates but he wanted to go in to business with his brother. I know though that many a time he hankered after his old life on the tugs.

Sadly Maurice became ill in June last year and passed away recently. He will leave a huge void in so many lives and will be greatly missed.



THE CRES PAGES CAMINO TO COP 26

We haven't been hearing much about Cop 26 lately. Covid and vaccines have dominated the news agenda for weeks, but Climate Change will not go away just because we have stopped talking about it. Now the UK is preparing to host COP 26, the UN Climate Change Conference, in Glasgow in November.

COP stands for Conference of the Parties. The Parties are all the countries which signed the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change in 1994. Back then it was agreed that we had to keep global temperature from rising more than 1.5 degrees Celsius if we wanted to avoid the worst impacts of climate change. That's how long the United Nations has been trying to get the nations of the world to agree on realistic means of reducing the carbon emissions which are driving

global warming and climate change. Burning fossil fuels is the main source of carbon emission. And we have not managed to reduce our carbon emissions anything like enough to meet our mandated targets.

COP 26 is an important opportunity for the UK to demonstrate what it is doing to reach net zero emissions as soon as possible. We know we must finally give up polluting energy systems: phase out petrol and diesel engines, transition to zero carbon transport, increase our use of renewables and energy storage. And, to make all this possible, we must accelerate the green transformation of the financial system.

People are preparing for COP now because the decisions taken there will affect all our futures. The Camino to COP will be a pilgrimage of Climate Witness organized by faith communities throughout the UK. Some people will walk from London to Glasgow to join the conference. They will be engaging with local communities along the road. Some people will walk from Bristol to Birmingham to join the main march.

Members of the Shirehampton Climate Emergency Group joined in a first preparatory walk to COP through Shirehampton Village in April trying to raise awareness and get people talking about the Conference.



"Shire Greens are a small environmental action group dedicated to the preservation and enhancement of open green space in Shirehampton. We have been an active partner with **Bristol City Council** in looking after and enhancing **Lamplighters Marsh**, now a



designated Local Nature Reserve and the Daisy Field where we planted a Community Orchard in 2005. We have sponsored hedgerow/bulbs and wild flower planting and intergenerational seating projects depicting the Shire Remount Depot in WW1. A few years ago we successfully started a new group - Friends of Lamplighters Marsh (FoLM) - to take on specific guardianship of this area."

"Main projects for Shire Greens include looking after the flower planters on Shire Railway Station which we adopted 10 years ago and which is part of the Severn Beach Line project entered into the annual Royal Horticultural Society It's Your Neighbourhood. There is also the Community Plant Project with Bristol Zoo and new projects coming in spring 2021 which include working with the BEE Happy Shire Project."

"We are looking for more volunteers to become part of Shire Greens, as our enthusiasm grows for plants and flowers to bloom and enhance our village. Hours and activity times vary and everyone is welcome. We have some exciting projects coming and it would be good to have new people to join our volunteer group. You don't have to be an expert gardener, just an interest in making our green spaces colourful, vibrant, cheerful and welcoming. We are looking forward to the Calendula (Marigold) project, improving the Grove Leaze grassland area and our New Street Scene project this year so there is plenty to do and look forward to" Said Ash.





We are gradually moving to life as it used to be, but will it ever be the same? Who knows? One piece of good advice comes from The Sermon on the Mount




