BRISTOL COVID-19 STATEMENT

From Bristol COVID-19 Local Engagement Board, Health Protection Advisory Committee, Health and Wellbeing Board and One City Partners

On Monday 21 February the Prime Minister announced the national strategy for living with COVID-19. This signals a significant change to the way the government will monitor and manage the coronavirus pandemic in England. We are moving away from having legally mandated restrictions in place, to a situation that relies on individuals taking personal responsibility to protect themselves and others.

The removal of the restrictions that we have been used to over the past two years will inevitably result in some increase in levels of infection. However, thanks to the success of the vaccination programme, the introduction of a range of new treatments and the actions of individuals, the government is confident we are in a position to begin to live with COVID-19. We need to continue to do what we can to reduce the spread of the virus and remain prepared for outbreaks and the emergence of new variants.

Keeping Bristol safe and open for business remains a priority. Today we published our Bristol 'Living Safely with COVID-19' Framework, which sets out our plans to prevent, protect, treat and respond to the virus over the coming year.

Without testing, it becomes even more important that people do not mix with others if they are unwell. This will be challenging for some individuals and families without the **Test and Trace Support Payment Scheme**, and so we ask employers to consider how they can support their staff to avoid spreading infection in the workplace.

Some settings, such as health and care, will continue with extra infection control measures for COVID-19 and other infections. Education and childcare settings will continue to focus on providing education safely, working with children, students, families, and staff to protect those most at risk.

We recognise that, for many people, these changes are very welcome. However, some people will feel anxious and more at risk. As we move together into this next phase, there are many simple actions we can all take, to help protect each other. These include:

- getting our vaccinations
- good hand hygiene
- wearing a face covering in busy and enclosed areas, such as inside shops and on public transport
- keeping indoor spaces well ventilated
- if unwell, avoiding contact with others

Small actions can make a big difference, so thank you for everything you continue to do to protect Bristol. Not because you have to, but because you care. #WeAreBristol

VEHICLE PARKING CHARGES TO LAUNCH IN THREE BRISTOL PARKS

Parking charges aimed at raising investment for Bristol parks are set to begin at **Blaise Castle Estate, Snuff Mills** and **Oldbury Court Estate**next month. All revenue from vehicle parking will be used for improving and maintaining the parks which have seen a large increase in visitors since the start of the Covid-19 pandemic.

The new charges launched on 3 March and will operate between 9am and 6pm every day. Car users will be charged £1 per hour or £3 for five hours, with alternative charges for minibuses or coaches. Overflow parking may be implemented at busy times, and these will also be subject to the same charges as the main car parks.

COMMUNITY WANTS TO KEEP COTHAM HILL PEDESTRIAN ZONE

Results from a survey on the newly pedestrianised zone on **Cotham Hill** show overwhelming support for keeping the zone in place. Residents were offered three options on the future of Cotham Hill. Option A and B proposed continuing with the road closure with slight variants, while option C would see Cotham Hill reopen but only for one-way traffic.


The clear winner was Option A, with 63 per cent of people choosing it. Option B came in second with 27 per cent, meaning 90 per cent of people are in favour of keeping the road closure in place along with a series of other measures.

Located next to St Nicholas Market (St Nick's), the event will be spread across St Nicholas Street, Corn Street, Exchange Avenue and All Saints Lane, bringing the Old City to life.

From **5pm to 10pm** visitors will be able to enjoy a wide selection of stalls selling food and drinks from local producers and suppliers. The market promotes sustainability and intends to build on Bristol's Gold Sustainable Food City status.

There will also be a host of family-friendly entertainment throughout the evening, including a fantastic musical line-up featuring local musicians and DJs, dance classes, circus performers, light installations, a garden party, lantern workshops and more.

Ambitious Vision for Western Harbour Published

Draft vision for Western Harbour proposes 50 per cent of affordable homes in all new developments and conversion of a bonded warehouse to a mixed-use cultural hub for the whole city. It has been inspired by community feedback, the vision builds on the area's heritage and identity and will guide detailed masterplanning later in 2022. Riverside Garden Centre and pump track would be accommodated within the area.

Until 22 April, Bristolians who visit, work in and travel through Western Harbour - and those who don't yet - can share their views on the commitments identified within the draft vision.

Motorists Can Now Check Online if they Will Need to Pay to Drive in Bristol's Forthcoming Clean Air Zone

Bristol Clean Air Zone will start operating in Summer 2022. The Zone has been added to the national clean air zone vehicle checker. The vehicle checker has been developed by the government to help drivers plan and check whether they will need to pay the charge in each zone. Bristol's zone is a central area where pollution is highest. No vehicles are banned. Only older and more polluting vehicles will be charged to travel inside the zone.

Charges will not apply to:

- Euro 4, 5 and 6 petrol vehicles, roughly 2006 upwards
- Euro 6 diesel vehicles, roughly end of 2015 onwards

Shelter - Not Here!

The Cotswold Community Association has started a campaign to get a shelter built at the bus stop outside the hall in Dursley Road. The lack of a shelter has been highlighted by several residents after the recent wet and windy weather.

Dave Parsons, Chair of the Association said, "Many of the people who regularly use this bus service are elderly and some have mobility issues. The community believes that a shelter is needed and will be a great improvement."

The Association has written to "Passenger transport at Bristol" to ascertain the current position and to establish if the erection of a shelter is planned.

Dave continued, "We all believed a shelter was to be built but this has not transpired. We hope that by highlighting this local people will not have to stand in the wet, wind and cold for much longer."

The Cotswold Community Association Committee will keep residents informed when we receive a response.



£1.8 Million Funding Boost to "Your Holiday Hub Activities"

Bristol City Council's Cabinet has approved £1.8 million to fund "Your Holiday Hub" (YHH) activities and food programmes for school-aged children entitled to free school meals.

The funding, provided to the council by the Department for Education, will enable Bristol's successful YHH programme to continue for children and young people across the city. It will support activities being run during the spring, summer and winter holidays only, for the 2022/2023 financial year. The YHH programme provides a healthy and nutritious meal for children at every activity, alongside food education.

The funding will also be used to increase access to holiday clubs for vulnerable children who don't currently qualify for free school meals and children with Education Health and Care Plans.



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
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St Mary's News - April 2022


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CLIMATE NEWS FOR APRIL 2022:

Back at the end of February I read a story by Matt McGrath, BBC News Environment correspondent, about the latest report from the IPCC, the UN's Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change. The report tells us that "many of the impacts of Climate Change are now irreversible". Over 40% of the world's population are "highly vulnerable" to climate. Extreme weather events like floods and heat waves linked to climate change are hitting humans and other species much harder than previously thought. If temperatures rise to between 1.7 and 1.8C above the 1850s level, then half the human population could be exposed to life-threatening climatic conditions arising from heat and humidity. Coastal cities and communities are likely to disappear.

Now here we are, four months on from **COP 26**, and no further forward toward meeting the pledges this government made to reduce carbon emissions, especially by reducing our dependency on fossil fuels.

As we prepare for Easter, Interfaith Climate Activists are inviting us to join them for Bristol's Interfaith Earth Vigil from 11am to 1pm – College Green every Saturday leading up to Easter.

Earth Vigils are a peaceful and powerful action for anyone who is concerned about the climate and ecological crisis. We come together and sit in silence, witnessing to the suffering of our earth, with compassion and hope for her healing.

As a silent presence, we make no demands. We are simply present with the situation as it is, our grief, fear and love for the earth and all her people,

in solidarity with all those who suffer from the injustices of the climate and ecological emergency, and all those who sacrifice their time, their freedom and too often even their lives for our sacred earth.

Everyone is welcome! Wear warm clothes and if you can bring a stool or camping chair to sit on. We sit in prayer or meditation with one or two people keeping watch, handing out cards explaining what we are doing and talking to anyone who wants to chat. After half an hour we have a break and switch round. You can join for as much or as little as you like.


