Poppies On The Green Display Makes An Impact In Shirehampton

Once again, the organisers for 'Poppies on The Green' have made an impact locally with their latest display that was placed on The Green, Shirehampton with the help of volunteers.

Each year local communities within the four villages area join in the 'painting poppies sessions' that were held at the High Street Market, Shirehampton Craft Exhibition, the Community Living Room, Cotswold Community Centre, and St. Mary's Church. Red and purple poppies were painted by young children, right through the generations to 80 years plus. This Community Display has grown and this year over 800 painted poppies have been added to the main display.

This year also sees the addition of two silhouette soldiers, **Paddy and Bill**, joining **Reg and Les**. All served in the armed forces during **WWI** or **WWII** and lived in Shirehampton. Several High Street shops and businesses were chosen to showcase a window display each - this involvement will hopefully expand next year, - to be part of "*Poppies On The Green*" event, whilst volunteers from **Shire Greens** have also added a display at **Shirehampton Railway Station**




Ken McCullock, who was born in **Avonmouth** and lived most of his life in Shirehampton, sadly passed away on 26 September 2023, aged 96.

WORKING AT THE SHIREHAMPTON REMOUNT DEPOT

Dear Editor,

I was interested in the film about the horse memorial at Shirehampton. My parents came to the village in1915. They had both been working in France and when the war started their employer, who was a racehorse trainer, and an American, decided to return to America. My parents decided not to go with him and came to England instead. They married in London and decided to move to Wincanton because there was a racecourse and Dad hoped he might be able to find work there. His life had only been with horses, he had travelled to many racecourses all over Europe as head lad, so that was work he was familiar with. He

had no luck finding employment because of horses being needed for the war, so my parents decided to move to Shirehampton because of the many horses being landed at Avonmouth docks. He enlisted in the army there and eventually was involved in the training of the horses many of which were wild. He went to France as part of what would be known now as logistics. Unfortunately, a couple of years after fighting there he was gassed during one of the battles and was returned to England to recuperate. He was ill for a long time as you can imagine.

He spoke a great deal to my eldest brother about the war (three of my brothers were in the second war). It was terrible enough seeing the thousands of men

being killed but
you can imagine how
he felt about the horses being killed after
he had worked with them most of his early life.
My parents lived in Shirehampton for the rest of
their lives. My father, John Shields, died in1951
and my mother, Alice Shields, in1975.All of my
brothers and sisters were born in Shirehampton.
I am the last and the youngest of my siblings
still living!!! A young 88-year-old and living in
Scotland. I hope that this is of some interest to

LITTER PICKING - MAKING A DIFFERENCE TO YOUR ENVIRONMENT!

Dear Editor,

In the last edition of Shire, the rising issue of litter in the area was highlighted (with a particular emphasis on the overflowing bins around the village). Having recently been involved in a couple of litter picks in the area it seems as though the problem of litter on the streets is not going away! Each of the litter picks mentioned lasted for about an hour and covered roughly one street, and on each occasion, we filled a bin bag to its capacity!

As a family we often go out for a litter pick over the weekend. It is nice for a few weeks to notice the improvement of the area. Our girls (aged 4 and 7) are usually (relatively) keen to go and are very aware of the impact that litter can have on the environment. They have recently signed up for **Bristol Waste's Little Big Tidier campaign** and have just received loyalty cards in the post. They will use this to record every pick that they take part in and after completing 6 picks will receive their own litter picking kit. We find going for litter picks is a nice family activity, we get to spend



time together outdoors, look after our local area, see instant (although, sadly, not permanent) results, and it is a chance to talk about the environmental impact of littering and the many wider issues associated with it. This ongoing conversation we hope, will have a lasting impact on the children's ethical decision making throughout their lives.

Dunk A Donut for Bristol Dementia Action Alliance

I met up with Lisa Dicker at the latest 'Dunk A Donut' event that was being held at the PBA Sports And Social Club. She is the Community Engagement Officer for Bristol Dementia Action Alliance that was set up over ten years ago.

BDAA was founded ten years ago by Tony and Barbara Hall. Barbara had been diagnosed with dementia and they wanted to do something to help other people and link in with other local and national organisations.

The Alliance has grown from strength to strength and one of the main things they provide are dementia aware activities and events. In Bristol five thousand people have a dementia diagnosis but there are many others who haven't been diagnosed yet. Dementia affects the whole family and the BDAA want people to be more aware of how they can make a difference in their loved one's lives and to know that there is help available.

This is the second year for 'Dunk A Donut' that is now an annual event that happens every October. Tony and Sam are the originators of the event and this year Lisa joined the team and put a twist on 'Dunk A Donut'. "I suggested that we could dunk people and anyone could nominate their boss, teacher, family member or friend as 'dunk the donut' to get more people involved. Unfortunately, I have been nominated by my family and earlier you saw me being dunked in water! It was cold and a bit of a shock and my daughter threw an additional bucket of water over me so I'm not babysitting tonight, (laughing) but it was worth it as it was for a good cause. All those pennies collected in sponsorship go towards the running of this small charity organisation".

I asked Lisa what other activities she was involved in "At the moment we are doing a project in Shirehampton. We want to **Shirehampton the first dementia aware** village in Bristol, so it's very exciting. It is a pilot project and once we get it right, we will roll it out to

other villages. Many of the High Street retailers have signed the pledge to say that they want to improve the experiences of dementia just by changing signage, by being more aware of the challenges that people have and how they can help. One of the first things people stop doing is going shopping and being involved in their community because they don't think they can, as they are not understood and we want to change that. We just want to make places accessible and welcoming for everybody".

"We do dementia awareness sessions for anyone who asks. We work with the police, GP surgeries community groups. We run a 'Memory Cafe' in Shirehampton the third Friday of each month at the Cotswold Community Centre and a 'Happy Days Cafe' in Westbury too. It's for people with dementia, their carers and their loved ones It just gives you a space where you know you're not going to be judged, relax, have fun and be with other people on that journey as isolation can be a killer."

This month has seen lots of pomp and circumstance. From the start of a new session of Parliament - the last before the next General Election - with the King's Speech in the House of Lords, to the annual Acts of Remembrance.

Each year, I rotate between the Remembrance Sunday service in Shirehampton, Westbury-on-Trym and the City Centre. This year, on Sunday 12th November, it was my honour once again to lay a wreath at the **Cenotaph** on behalf of the **people** of Bristol Northwest during the city's annual Act of Remembrance at the City Centre service.

In Shire, we recently celebrated our village's important role in WWI with the unveiling of the Shirehampton Warhorse statue - something that we should all be proud of and make sure that the stories of this history are passed down to our children.

It has also been lovely to see a return of Poppies on the Green and the post box toppers in Shire to mark Remembrance Day. I want to thank the many people and groups that contributed to these creative acts of remembrance.

We can certainly be proud of the strong sense of community spirit in Shire.

There are some, however, who seem set on spoiling our peaceful village life. Several Shire residents have contacted me recently about a group of youths who are making them feel unsafe. They have witnessed youths clambering over garage roofs and throwing fireworks.

My team has raised the matter with Avon and Somerset Police, and they've confirmed there has been an increase in anti-social behaviour in Shire of late. The police have increased patrols in the area and are now liaising with the local community and schools to identify the individuals involved although, it is worth noting that they are thought to be coming from surrounding areas.






Folm Warhorse Art Competition

Following the opening ceremony of the Warhorse Sculpture in the Daisy Field, Shirehampton in September, Shire News held a Children's Art and Writing Competition for children of primary school age, the results of which were published in the November edition of Shire. Simultaneously, children in Avonmouth Primary School, where the Warhorse study began, were doing work on the history of the Remount Depot. Sadly, they were unable to meet the deadline for submissions to The Shire competition, so it was decided that The Friends Of Lamplighters Marsh would sponsor an entirely separate competition purely for the children of Avonmouth Primary School.

We received five wonderful entries, which were judged by local artist, **Betty Marten**. They are all fantastic, so we decided to award all five children £10 book tokens, which were presented in school assembly. **Avonmouth Primary School** has a particular interest as some of the **Remount Huts** were on the grounds of the current school property. During the **First World War** more than 300,000 horses passed through Avonmouth on their way to the **Western Front**. **Shirehampton** was the scene of Bristol's own War Horse drama as over 5,000 horses at a time occupied the fields around the village.

These animals were cared for by over 1,000 soldiers and in 1916 one of these was **Charlie Day** who wrote letters home describing life at Shirehampton. Together with **Charlie's great nephew** and **Bristol Old Vic**, in 2013 **Local Learning** worked with **Year 6** at Avonmouth Primary School using Charlie's letters to explore life at Shirehampton in the First World War. Year 6 created a fantastic roaming drama, *Their Lives Beneath Our Feet*, which they performed on the site of the **Shirehampton Remount Depot** to parents, carers, and the wider community. Interest in the Warhorse Sculpture has spread around the area, and the **Platform**, an award-winning rail education scheme that works with schools to empower young people in accessing the railways, is planning to take groups from the wider area to visit the **Daisy Field**, and really put it on the map.













The Rain Fails to Dampen Remembrance Sunday

The rain didn't keep the crowds away for Remembrance Sunday on 12th November. Many were prepared with umbrellas to pay their respects to all. The Avonmouth Sea Cadets, local Rainbows, Brownies, Cubs, Scouts, and Veterans were all in attendance and St. Mary's Church led the service at the Cenotaph at the top of Park Hill. And poppy wreaths were laid to remember the fallen.

This year marks the 80th Anniversary of the end of the 'Battle for the Atlantic' that began in September 1939 and ended in May 1943. This was an extremely important corridor for Britain not only for food supplies, raw materials, but also artillery, troops, and equipment. If this trade route was cut off by the Germans with their U-Boats and ships with air support, then there would have been serious consequences for Britain.

The **Merchant Ships** had to be protected but great losses at the beginning of the war were proving a challenge with the U-Boats and Ships prowling the Atlantic. The Canadian Navy and Airforce escorted the merchant ships and by May 1941 a transatlantic

convoy system was in place. This would consist of several columns of ships totalling up to 60 at any one time. With the sinking of the German battle ship, Bismark that same month, the Americans also began escorting the merchant ships across the Atlantic, so began the demise of Germany's strength in this area.

By the Autumn of 1943 the German ships and U-boats retreated with an Allied victory in the Atlantic along with the opening of the Mediterranean for essential traffic later that year. There was also a significant reduction in shipping losses allowing
























Unite to Survive Nature Nites

Climate groups from all over the Southwest gathered in late autumn sunshine and mild autumn air. It was a festive occasion. Greenpeace and Christian Climate Action, Extinction Rebellion and Friends of the Earth, BAAN and Surfers Against Sewage, Kidicle Mass and Families for a Future, doctors in scrubs and scientists in long white lab coats... hundreds of people of all ages and every walk of life came together to beg our leaders to acknowledge there IS a climate crisis.

The Climate Choir led the march and stopped to sing on the lawn in front of the Royal Crescent. Tourists and shoppers stopped to watch. This was a joyful but also sombre event. And you could see that people passing in the street are beginning to share our grief and concern.

As the critic and philosopher John Berger said:

"Demonstrations don't just demonstrate something to people in power....they also demonstrate something to the people gathered on the streets. Those people come to realise they are not merely individuals with limited power... but [they] have a common fate and a common opportunity."

We are all beginning to understand that we need to come together in our effort to reduce our use of fossil fuels and mitigate the effects of climate change we already experience. In the Climate Emergency Group, you will find people who share your concerns, your fears and your hopes for our climate and our future. Shirehampton's First Pollinator Park Wins Bee Bold Award

Shirehampton Community Action Forum (SCAF) and Bee Happy Shire have won one of this year's BEE BOLD Awards. Bee Bold is an ambitious initiative created by Metro Mayor, Dan Norris, that is funding pollinator-friendly projects in the West of England Combined Authority (WECA) area.





The award will allow us to create Shirehampton's first Pollinator Park, where bees and other pollinators can find an all-year-round feast - we will plant wildflowers, shrubs and trees that will flower from January through to December.





The project's first on-site Planting Party was held on 21st October, when we planted over 100 kilos of spring-flowering pollinator-friendly bulbs. Next up on our Planting Timetable is a small orchard of heritage fruit trees, in December, then in the spring we will host another Planting Party for our Mini Wildflower Meadow, please watch out for your invitation in the **Shire newspaper** and **SCAF** publicity – please come and join in the fun in April 2024.

Every flower counts - we wish Penpole Lane Pollinator Park to act as a 'Library' for our community, where we can see all the plants that can feed and shelter our pollinators and be beneficial for all our urban wildlife.




