The Golden-Oldies Charity would like to record our thanks to the Shire Publications Community Grants fund for supporting our work during the period 1st June 2020 - 31st May 2021. The funding has supported our online service, enabling us to continue providing activities throughout the pandemic, ensuring the sustainability of our charity.

The Project

With all community-based Goldies activities forced to close in March, hundreds of our beneficiaries high risk older vulnerable people - became more isolated than ever. Goldies had to adapt quickly to the change in circumstances with the launch of our first ever digital service. This was a whole brand new way of working for our charity and involved a steep learning curve for core staff. We undertook a 12 week Digital Solutions training course by CAST, which supported the rapid development of GoldiesLive into a robust, more professional digital service with lots of user feedback and interviews. A full report on this is available on request.

The second challenge was reaching out to older isolated people, from chatting on the phone to our session leaders and participants as we found that many of our existing participants were unable/unwilling to access the internet. As the months progressed, more of our pre-COVID attendees have engaged with the support of family members and carers. With this in mind, in October we trialled an advertising campaign on Facebook, specifically aimed at people

aged 45-55 who would likely have an older relative they could support. We are delighted with how well GoldiesLive has been received, in December 2020 over 4000 people engaged with us online. Our Facebook pages had a post engagement of over

2600 people and our website had 595 page views. YouTube had 989 video views and, interestingly, 30% were men, a far greater percentage than at community based Sing&Smile sessions.

PUBLIC INFORMATION FOR JUNE

Bristol Moves to Step 3

As of Monday 17 May, people can meet outdoors in a group of up to 30 people, and indoors with six people (or two households). People are also allowed to stay overnight at someone's house who is not in their household or support bubble.

The most significant change comes as the government has announced **that people should make a personal choice** on whether to socially distance from their friends or family when meeting up. We must be mindful that for some people the risks of close contact may be greater than others - **please be kind to one another.**

Other changes:

- holiday accommodation will be open (as groups of up to six or two households)
- indoor hospitality venues such as restaurants, pubs, bars and cafés can reopen with COVID-secure measures in place
- up to 30 people can attend weddings, and legal limits on mourners at funerals have been removed, capacity will depend on the venue
- care home residents can receive up to five named visitors (two at any one time)
- higher education students can return to in-person teaching

Guidance on International Travel

You should not travel to any countries on the red or amber list, unless there are special circumstances, for example for work or medical purposes.

If you are returning to the UK from:

- a red list country you must quarantine in a government-approved hotel. You must take a COVID-19 test on or before day two and on or after day eight of your quarantine
- an amber list country you must self-isolate at home for 10 days. You must take a COVID-19 test on or before day two and on or after day eight of your quarantine
- a green list country you must take a COVID-19 test on or before day two after you arrive. You do not need to quarantine unless the test result is positive

Self-isolation means not leaving home for any reason. If you need help self-isolating, please contact the We Are Bristol helpline 0800 694 0184.

Easing Pressure on Our Hospitals

The NHS is now vaccinating anyone over the age of 38. If you fall into this age group book your appointment by visiting the NHS website or calling 119.

Help the NHS and think before you go to A&E. Even though COVID-19 cases are continuing to decline in our area, hospitals remain very busy.

Ease the pressure by getting the right NHS care for you and your family's needs. If you think you need medical help but it's not an emergency, speak to your GP or contact NHS 111 by phone or online. The NHS 111 service is available 24 hours a day and, depending on your need, can connect you to a clinician for a telephone consultation, or book you into a local urgent care service. You should still call 999 or go to A&E if you have a life-threatening illness or injury.

£500 Grants Available for Eligible Workers

You can apply for a £500 grant if you have lost income due to self-isolating. You must be in employment or self-employment and unable to work from home. You can also apply for the grant if you are caring for a child who is self-isolating.


To be eligible for a Test and Trace Support Payment you must either:

- have been told to self-isolate by NHS Test and Trace or the COVID-19 app
- be looking after a child under 16 years of age who usually attends an educational or childcare setting but is self-isolating on or after 8 March 2021
- be looking after someone under 26 years of age with an Education, Health and Care Plan (EHCP) who usually attends an educational setting but is self-isolating on or after 8 March 2021

You must also be receiving one of the following: Universal Credit, Working Tax Credit, income-based Employment and Support Allowance, income-based Jobseeker's Allowance, Income Support, Housing Benefit and/or Pension Credit.

If you don't receive one of the benefits, you may still qualify for a discretionary payment. The Department of Health and Social Care has made extra funds available so we can help more people.



Subject to Covid 19 regulations, we hope to host a Shirehampton Public Hall AGM in July. Please come along! Everybody is welcome!



Safer Roads for Bristol with Roll Out of the 'School Streets' Pilot

Plans for car-free pick up and drop offs during the school run are being rolled out at two schools in Bristol.

Bristol School Streets is expanding. The project involves opening roads to pedestrians and cyclists by closing them to motor traffic at the start and end of the school day, encouraging more active commutes by making it easier to walk, cycle and scoot to the school gates. The new restrictions, which are being implemented temporarily initially to pilot the scheme, went live on Wednesday 26 May.

Cows Mooove into their New Stoke Park Estate Home

A group of cows have been welcomed to Stoke Park Estate as part of the city's continuing drive to address the ecological emergency declared by Bristol last year. Following the success of grazing goats at this historic park and garden alongside the M32, 20 cows arrived 11 May to help care for the landscape through conservation grazing. Made up of Shetland, Hereford, British Blue and Holstein cows, the herd will improve the biodiversity of Stoke Park and provide a more sustainable and natural way to manage the land.

Cattle can often get to places that machinery cannot and they also help stop the spread of scrub and invasive, more dominant plant species. This allows other plants, including wildflowers, to thrive, which will encourage insects, which in turn provide food for birds and mammals. Wildflower grassland is not only a beautiful landscape to enjoy, but a rich habitat for many species including butterfly and bee populations.

A whole host of wildlife will also make a cowpat their home - more than 250 species of insect can be found in or on cattle dung in the UK and these in turn provide food for birds, badgers, foxes and bats. The cows came to Stoke Park Estate from a local farm in Frampton Cotterell and are checked daily by the herdsman and park rangers.

Last year's **One City Ecological Emergency Strategy** unveiled a 10-year plan to protect wildlife, ecosystems and habitats in the face of the rapid decline in wildlife locally and globally. **Among its objectives was a commitment for at least a third of land in Bristol to be managed for the benefit of wildlife by 2030.**

THE GREEN PAGES TWO YEARS AND COUNTING

The Shirehampton Climate Emergency Group has been going for TWO years now! We came together at a public meeting about the threat of global warming and climate change on May 14, 2019. Around forty people were at that meeting and continue to support our mailing list. A smaller group has been active over the last two years. We wanted to educate and inform ourselves about what we could do to mitigate climate change. We invited speakers on local sustainable energy provision to our open meetings, we had a stall outside the Coop once a month over the summer of 2019, we liaised with other local climate groups and supported citywide climate action. In March 2020 we organized a large public meeting on flood defences in Shirehampton. And just two weeks later the first lockdown was announced! From March 2020 until now we've been unable to meet together in person and forbidden from joining in collective actions.



Nevertheless, over the past year many of us turned to individual environmental projects. People did private litter picks, created ponds and wildlife meadows, planted pollinator friendly flowers. We supported the national **Bee-Friendly campaign with the Ridge Community Garden Project** and we are planning an **Autumn Bulb Planting** event there. We took part in **Bristol's One Tree Per Child** initiative, helping to plant nearly a thousand trees in the Daisy Field. All these efforts will help restore the environment, encourage and protect biodiversity, and build resilience to climate change.



And now while Covid continues to be the top story in the media, climate change has been making itself felt. April was the coldest April on record with frost almost every night. It was also one of the driest Aprils: it only rained once that whole month. These are examples of the changes in our normal weather patterns that can be traced back to changes in global temperature. Anyone lucky enough to have a garden will have noticed the effects of this extreme weather.



Climate Change was, rightly, an issue in May's local elections. **Bristol Green Capital Partnership** organized on-line hustings, asking each of the candidates for Bristol Mayor and for the West of England Authority about their plans for a sustainable green recovery. And Climate will continue to be an issue over the next few months in the lead- up to the **UN Climate Conference - COP26** - in November. The world will be watching the government and its climate and nature commitments and here in Shirehampton we will continue to do what we can to keep Climate Change in the forefront of our minds. *Renée Slater*





Tynings Field News

In the July 2011 the field was young and Caroline and Jim Penny set about work with a small handful of people dedicated to their task. They petitioned the Council, planted tiny fruit trees that were donated by residents of Shire and some were purchased but all were dwarfed in the landscape. Then on cold weekends we cut brambles up to sunset until we finally called in a ploughman to help. In the Spring we dug up grass until our hands froze, 4 days a week, every week. We laid the hedge in February and wassailed in January and attained awards. These pioneers turned a plain grassy field into a place of productivity.



Like a field of dreams over the years, people will arrive if you build the pitch and the hard work is done so the growers keep coming.

Tynings Field is independent of council allotments and is a member of Social Farms and Gardens. Now 10 years on, it is buzzing at Tynings Field Community



group, the bees collect pollen from the orchard blossom and things begin to grow and hatch. We had a successful month of work with the Good Gym runners on bramble clearance to allow more wild flowers to grow and clear an area for a bench in the thicket. The orchard is soon to reach full bloom with vipers bugloss, oxeye daisy and corncockle en masse which are now part of our wildflower meadow, some of which were kindly donated by Bee Friendly members in Shire. One of our members has planted two new fruit trees. Member **Nick** repaired the chicken coop roof which was storm damaged. We are still looking for someone to make the bench from the logs of wood we have in the field. Do you have the skills and want to showcase your work?



We are very grateful to receive a £400 donation grant from the **Coop Community Fund** towards the field. In September we are opening our gates to the public once more as a **Get Growing Trail Day**. Lockdown brought few challenges and it meant that the field provided a safe haven while other sites were closed. Footfall is heavier now which is not so good for the animals. Most of our members work in other jobs so we always need more help from volunteers to assist in maintaining the field and cutting the grass. You are always welcome! Here is a place you can keep yourself fit and grow vegetables almost free of charge. A full April moon is a sign of a good harvest year ahead. Why not spend some time helping out here this summer?



ENRICHING WOODLAND AT TYNINGS FIELD

Good Gym paid us a visit and assisted in clearing brambles to plant more wild flowers in the orchard; with team members Lee and Caroline, they made enough space without disturbing the hedgerow.

By clearing a space behind the edible hedge which the community planted 6 years ago, light now streams in on the nut trees and so we are asking for contributions of bulbs and donations of wild flower seeds for planting here.

The Avonmouth Severnside Enterprise Area (ASEA) Ecology Mitigation and Flood Defence Project, has issued its latest Progress Report, May 20th. The project, the biggest of its type in the West of England, covers an extensive area, stretching from Aust in the north to Lamplighters Marsh in the south.

Since the beginning of the year, and despite the challenges of Covid-19, they have made substantial progress delivering flood protection.

In the north of the project area, they are installing a flood defence wall at **Aust Wharf Road** and expect to complete this work by this winter. They have installed a new filter drainage system at **Passage Road** and are constructing ramps to cross the road. Improvements to existing earth embankment flood defences are in progress from Passage Road to **New Passage** and will be completed in autumn 2022. They are also working at **Cake Pill outfall** to raise the structure and expect to complete this section of work in the summer.

Work has also begun on **Lamplighters Marsh** where a new earth bund is being built to protect the **Severn Beach Railway Line**. As work proceeds we may find that local footpaths in Lamplighters Marsh are temporarily closed but the finished project will include footpath improvements.

The project managers have engaged with local communities in the areas in which this important work is taking place. They have met with members of local parish councils and with Friends of Lamplighters Marsh at online meetings to provide an overview of the scheme. Local groups have had

the opportunity to express any concerns and provide their thoughts on the ongoing works.

To engage further, the project is setting up a **Community Forum** to provide a channel of communication between the project team and representatives of resident, business and community groups. They will also be launching a new **Environment and Economic Forum** to provide an opportunity for major employers and other organisations in the area to engage further in the project.

A new, dedicated **ASEA** project website will be launching shortly. This will have all the most up-to-date news on project progress as well as other information, and general details such as the ecological, economic and flood defence benefits that will be realised when the project is complete. A key purpose of the flood defences is to enable the mix of industrial and former industrial areas and vacant sites in ASEA to become viable for commercial development and generate 12,000 new jobs by 2026. 




