# All Change at Kings Weston House For Impermanence Last Show

On the 1st August, Impermanence put on a variety show outside Kings Weston House - called 'We'll Meet Again' -- it was an afternoon of coming together, top-notch performances and a glass of Prosecco or two! It was the final show in their 5 years of living at the house, during which they have run daytime cabarets for over 55s, as well as evening performances and parties, including Da-Da-Darling as part of the city-wide festival, Mayfest in 2016. A new chapter is beginning for Kings Weston House, with the new owner, John Barbey (right), moving in on the 1st September. John is still working out the details, but hopes to continue weddings and events throughout the year.

Norman has taken on St Michael's on the Mount Without, a church on St Michael's Hill, devastated by fire four years ago. Norman has repaired the roof, and is transforming it into a creative space for dance, theatre, music, weddings and events. It is now mandatory to wear a face covering in indoor settings, including places of worship, cinemas and museums. A full list of the places can be found on the **www.gov.uk**. Please be mindful that some people are not able to wear face coverings, and that the reasons for this may not be visible to others.

- stay at home and get tested if you feel unwell.

#### **NEW CYCLE LANES**

Prioritising safe routes for cyclists and pedestrians during this pandemic is crucial to support social distancing in public places. New protected bike lanes have been put in place in and around the city centre, with ongoing discussion in communities around further measures to be introduced across Bristol.

#### **LIBRARIES**

Henbury Library will be open from 11am to 4pm on Mondays, Wednesdays, Fridays and Saturdays for returns, limited browsing and borrowing, pre-booked computers.

Central Library will reopen to the public on Monday 7 September Monday to Saturday, 11am to 4pm to browse in a limited area, borrow and return books, and use pre-booked computers.

For information related to returned items and library procedures, changes when you are inside our libraries, protecting our staff and customers and our call & collect service please see our website or the email you'll receive if you are a Library member.

#### **PARKS:**

- We can now work with volunteers over the age of 70 and in the clinically vulnerable category.
- People in these groups must be able to work in a distinct area from others to ensure social distancing is maintained at all times.
- People in these groups must **not** be responsible for handing out, collecting in or cleaning equipment for the group.
- We are still **not able** to allow people to volunteer in parks if they are in the clinically extremely vulnerable category.
- Social distancing of 2m is still in place for everyone and **all other measures remain the same** (max 6 people, avoid sharing tools, do not provide refreshments).

We are still very much sending all volunteers the message that volunteering in parks in a group is absolutely not expected during this time. We know that personal circumstances are unique and we support groups whatever they choose to do. Please get in touch if you are planning to relaunch activities and have worries or concerns.

# **Update from Darren Jones, MP**

As communities feel the effects of the coronavirus pandemic, it's important that, now more than ever, there is support for local jobs and people and that we continue to support our local high streets.

I recently hosted an emergency local jobs summit with other Bristol MPs, Mayor Marvin Rees, Deputy Mayor Craig Cheney, the Western Gateway and Business West, and trade union officials to discuss what support is available to you and what further support needs to be put in place for local redundancies.

Following the local jobs summit, I met with the regional manager of West of England Combined Authority (WECA) - who is responsible for delivering support to redundant workers - to stress the importance of having adequate support readily available to meet the needs of the increasing number of people facing redundancy. I will continue to call for support and do all that I can to help to make sure those support services are available for local redundant workers during these difficult times.

I know how invaluable the high street is to our community, so it is also vital that we continue to support our local shops and high street by shopping locally. I recently visited Ruby Jeans to hear from owner, Mark, about his experiences through Coronavirus and how they've been open to the community throughout. It was also great to see how local businesses and shoppers on the high street have adjusted to life under social distancing.

Throughout August, I met with local essential service providers across Bristol North West to thank them for their hard work and dedication during a very challenging time. I met with First's Operation Manager and bus drivers at the Portway Park and Ride to thank them for their service and learn about the safety measures being



put into place now that lockdown restrictions are being lifted, so that you can use the service safely and in confidence. As bus services are now being increased, it's important we help keep each other safe by wearing a face covering (unless exempt) on public transport. The Government also recently announced further funding for the Portway P&R railway platform which will not get started soon.

I've missed talking to so many of you outside the Co-op with my street stall and at local coffee mornings but I continue to hold online or telephone surgeries, Facebook Live Q&As and other online events if you'd like to discuss anything with me. # **Liveable Neighbourhoods for Bristol**

Liveable Neighbourhoods are residential neighbourhoods that contain traffic filters such as bollards or planters. The filters stop cars, vans and lorries from the bordering main roads and using the streets as rat runs.

Residents and local businesses still have full. They want to kickstart local conversations about access and can get deliveries. Traffic reduces and Liveable Neighbourhoods across the city. # Bristol City Centre's First COVID-19 Testing Site Open

#### The centre is located at the University of Bristol's Victoria Rooms

The first walk-through testing site has opened in Bristol to help residents get a free test as quickly and as easily as possible if they develop symptoms of coronavirus.

Located in the car park at the University of Bristol's Victoria Rooms near the Triangle, the site has been set up to provide an easily accessible and central location for more people to get tested for the virus.

Anyone with symptoms, however mild, can get a free swab test that takes less than a minute. Tests should be booked or ordered as soon as symptoms begin at nhs.uk/coronavirus or by calling 119 and results arrive the next day.

Christina Gray, Director of Public Health at Bristol City Council, said: "This new walk-through testing site, our first in the city centre, will help encourage more people in Bristol to take the test if they are unwell. Its central location means that those who were unable to get to other sites can now access testing more easily to help limit the spread of the virus.

"New reports of COVID-19 in Bristol are monitored very carefully by Public Health teams in both Bristol City Council and Public Health England. "Our residents have shown great support and effort in following the guidelines, however we need to remain vigilant. I urge anyone who has symptoms of the virus to book a test as soon as possible so we can continue to prevent the spread."

Councillor Asher Craig, Deputy Mayor of Bristol with responsibility for Communities, Equalities and Public Health, added: "The people of Bristol should be proud of their efforts in helping limit the spread of the virus. "The new site at Victoria Rooms, which we hope will be one of many in Bristol, will make it so much easier for people living in the city to get a test done simply and quickly. Everyone needs to do their bit and getting a test if you have any symptoms is key to preventing further infections."

Testing is available to everyone, with additional support for vulnerable groups and people with disabilities.

It is advised that those being tested do not travel to the site by taxi or public transport and they should follow social distancing, practice good personal hygiene and wear a face covering, including for travelling to and from the testing site.

Anyone testing positive for the virus in England will be contacted by NHS Test and Trace to help them track their contacts. This will help people to

identify who they may have been in close contact with, protecting others from further transmission.

Close contacts of those testing positive will also hear from NHS Test and Trace, advising them to stay at home for 14 days to prevent them from unknowingly spreading the virus. They will be advised to also book at test if they develop symptoms.

The main symptoms of COVID-19 are a high temperature, a new, continuous cough and a loss or change sense of smell or taste.

# **Changes to Prescriptions**

Shirehampton Group Practice is going paperless. You will have seen notices up around the surgery and on our online outlets that we will be introducing a paperless prescription request service. This change will mean that we will no longer be able to accept paper requests for prescriptions and that the prescription request box outside the surgery will be removed.

This procedure started in early-August and we are encouraged that a lot of our patients have embraced it and have been requesting their online access accounts or emailing us. We appreciate,

however, that some of our patients haven't been aware of this change as they perhaps don't use the internet or don't attend surgery as they are currently shielding. We hope that by posting this information in The Shire, we can reach out to all of our patient community and together we can transition to a paperless system.

We will be extending our deadline to move to a paperless system to Friday 11th September 2020. After this date, we will no longer accept prescription requests on paper.

You will have three ways of requesting your prescriptions as follows:

By email: bnssg.shirehamptongrouppracticeprescriptions@nhs.net

**On-line:** Via your own Patient Access account. Please contact us to set your online account now. It is the easiest and safest way to request your prescriptions.

**From your nominated Pharmacy:** Please speak to your pharmacy and register for their repeat prescription service.

We would encourage all patients to get in touch with the surgery as soon as possible to register to get your online access or to understand how easy it is to send your requests via email. If online is not your thing, then please get in touch with your local pharmacy. Pharmacies in our area can help by managing your repeat prescription requests themselves. These procedures are being put in place for your safety and for that of our staff. As always, our staff are here to help and support you during this transition.

# **Shirehampton Climate Emergency Group**

"The UK has the least energy-efficient housing anywhere in Western Europe, and our homes currently pump out almost a fifth of the UK's total carbon emissions."

### In early July, Chancellor Rishi Sunak announced a new £2 Billion **Green Homes Grant**

Owner-occupiers and landlords will be able to apply online for energy efficiency vouchers to cover works such as loft, wall or floor insulation, double-glazing for windows, energy-efficient doors and lighting and maybe new energy-efficient boilers. Grants will cover two-thirds of the cost of work up to £5,000 and it seems that low-income households may be eligible for grants up to £10,000 covering the full cost of work.

In September, homeowners will be able to apply online for recommended energy efficiency measures. Details will be forwarded to accredited local suppliers, who will undertake the work.

Rishi Sunak said he expects 650,000 households will be helped by this grant, which will typically save £200 a year on bills.

The payback time of an energy saving measure is how long it takes before the money you save on your gas or electricity bills covers the cost of the work. Payback times for energy-saving measures depend on how energy-efficient your home is to start with. For example, if you have no loft insulation at all then the payback time for loft insulation is reckoned to be between one and three years. With the government paying two-thirds of the cost, you should definitely get it done because it will save you money after just one year and make your home more comfortable to live in during the winter! If you have a hot water tank, getting it properly lagged could save you money within a year. Many tanks already have a built-in foam layer around the tank, but you can still save money by fitting an insulating jacket around the tank. If you can see the bare metal of the tank then you are using your hot water tank to heat your house even in the summer, when you don't want to make your house hotter, and keeping your hot water hot will cost you a lot more than it should. You could fix both of these problems by getting the tank lagged.

Even if you aren't planning any major works there are plenty of simple and cost free ways to reduce energy use. The Energy Saving Trust suggests these:

- If you can't install double-glazing, hang thick curtains and draft proof your doors

# **Asian Hornet Week Tynings**

# 7-13th September

The tabloid papers have been whipping up a fury of anxiety with phrases like "Giant Murder Hornets" which make for good headlines, fortunately this is far from the truth and confusing different species of hornets. The truth is a bit more straightforward.





Canada and the USA have seen small numbers of an invasive non-native hornet, Vespa mandarinia, commonly known as the Giant Japanese Hornet, which like all other hornets and wasps are quite happy to leave you alone unless you get too close to their nest. This hornet HAS NOT been seen in Europe or the UK. We do however have Vespa velutina present in most of mainland Europe now, and this hornet does represent a significant risk that it might become established in the UK, to the considerable detriment of our own native insects. This hornet is known as the **Yellow Legged Asian Hornet,** and has been in France since 2004, where it has done considerable damage and cost millions of Euros. We are very keen that it does not become established here in the UK. There have been several cases in the past 3 years where it has been imported from Europe and set up nests, but so far we have destroyed them and been able to stop it establishing here. So far this year there have been no confirmed sightings.

We do need the general public to be aware of this hornet, and to report it should it be spotted. It is relatively easy to identify, but it is essential that you try and get a photograph of



any hornet you see. Ideally catch it in a jam jar or something similar and put it in the fridge for half an hour, whereupon it will not be able to fly off, and you can safely photograph it. The key things to look out for are:

- Largely black body
- Yellow bottom half of its legs
- One large orange stripe on its tail end
- Orange / Yellow head

In size it is only slightly bigger than a wasp, and a

lot smaller than our native European hornet. This second photo shows all three insects together, the usual yellow wasp being the smallest, and the very red/brown and yellow European hornet the biggest. If you really do see an Asian Hornet, you must report it with a photograph, ideally using the Asian Hornet Watch app available for mobile phones which also has useful identification helps, or by e-mail to alertnonnative@ceh. ac.uk If you have seen something you are not sure of, you can contact the local Asian Hornet Action Team, who can help, via bristolahat@gmail.com



# **Field Says** It With Wildflowers

Meadow orchard: letting grass grow; how to do it, without encroaching grass or weeds, which are too many. This needs planning because it's not a case of just letting it grow. If left, it will bulk.

First decide on your wild flowers, your seeds or plants which should mimic or be as near as possible to your historic habitat; so research is needed on what type of agriculture existed on that land, also the area or coastal or woodland or farmland inland soil type etc.

These need planting at least 3 years before you allow the grass to grow and can be added to. Over the next few years, cut it down regularly as this encourages root and flower spread, not grass bulk. Never be afraid to mow.

On the third year or fourth you can let it go during summer. Cut in late August, September and October. Use a strimmer and scythe in stages to allow seed to drop. Cut down as much grass as possible. Don't leave it to rot on the ground; stack it.

The result of a correctly managed wildlife orchard will be beneficial to the pollination and health of fruit-bearing trees but grass around the tree roots must be kept down, if they are new. In order to mow our meadow, there are tasks ahead. Let's make hay while the sun shines and we can do rain!!



These are just a few examples of the wildflowers we had the pleasure of seeing, after three years' worth of planning. Many seeds were added here, before we decided to the 'not to mow policy.' You can see Vipers Bugloss, Corn Marigold, Corncockle, Daisy and Valerian.

Now we have a winter cut down.

# St Mary's News

Hi Folks! September has arrived and children are returning to their Classrooms after a long break from regular school lessons. We all hope the prediction of a possible second wave of the Covid19 virus when they return proves not to be the case!

The church re-opened for Sunday Holy Communion services at 10.00 am on Sunday, 26th July. Although the welcome is just as warm, the church does look different. So a summary of the current safety measures are:

- Upon entering via the West Door, someone will record your name and telephone number in case we need to trace you.
- Your temperature will be taken at the door; anyone showing a high temperature will kindly be asked not to enter the building and to consult their GP.
- All persons must wear a face mask, unless you are in an exempt category.
- At this point you must sanitize your hands.
- You will be directed to one of the plastic chairs which are spaced out to comply with social distancing.
- There will be no books issued but using a screen projector instead.
- No hymns are sung Tim our Organist will play two or three verses of the hymns we would normally sing.



# **Extended Shopping Experience For Our High Street**

As we continue to adjust to the new way of life I spoke with three more local people on the changes they have put in place to re-open to the public again.

Georgina Lloyd is the Bar Manager at Shirehampton's Men's Social Club on the High Street. "It's not been as bad as we first thought, the customers have been brilliant at social distancing, sanitising, providing the track and trace information and following all the rules. I think it's because they just want to get out and are getting used to our new normal with using supermarkets and essential shops during lock down.

Clare Barker is the Manager of the Break charity shop in the High Street. "Lock down wasn't easy. I missed work and talking with our regular customers. "It was strange to get ready for re-opening. We still had our winter stock out in the shop so we thoroughly cleaned the shop and put our summer stock out! The protective screen was installed on the counter and masks and hand sanitizer made available. When entering the shop we ask all our customers to wear masks and sanitise their hands and upon leaving. The hand sanitiser is on the table by the doorway'.

Alex Richards is Chairman of the PBA Club Committee in Nibley Road and has reopened with new look and rules in place. "We have worked really hard to make it safe for our staff and customers by maximising the outdoor space as the safest way to socialise and constructed an outside bar for drinks and potentially food which we hope to serve in the near future."



"We have hand sanitising stations at each entrance to the building and a one way system for use of the toilets. Our cleaner cleans the building and outside tables after each use. Staff wear masks when pouring drinks and we have introduced a one way ordering system inside the club. You order drinks at the ballroom bar and collect them in the main bar, using the socially distancing queuing system. We take temperature tests and contact details of everyone to help with tracing if necessary."

with a smile on their face. Every now and again I have been known to make a cup of coffee or tea for a customer especially if they have been down in the dumps. Providing a listening ear costs nothing, even if I am putting out stock on the shelves".

"We sell a wide range of items in the shop, books, CDs, DVDs, household goods, electrical goods that are PAT tested, toys, picture frames, bric-a-brac and good selection of

women's, men's and children's clothes, all of which are steam cleaned before going on the rails."

"The High Street is very important to me as I grew up in Shirehampton. It has changed so much over the years and not for the good. Our shop is at the quieter end and, since we've lost the bakery shop next door, there really isn't anything extra to draw people to this end of the High Street. We need individual, different shops to provide variety and interest but that doesn't seem to be happening at the moment."



"Now that we are open again, people can continue to bring in donations each day between 9am -10am and then 4pm -5pm, but no more than two bags. Donations are then quarantined for three days after which we sort through the items to put out for sale. Please don't leave donations outside the shop as they end up being thrown away. That is such a waste." Said Clare.





If you are interested in taking part with 'Painting Poppies At Home', they are easy to make and includes upcycling plastic bottles, such as cola and water bottles where the top and bottom can be cut off and shaped into poppies. We were putting acrylic paint or ready mixed bottles of paint or spray paint to colour the poppies.

> We will of course provide a collection box at Shirehampton Public Hall in due course where your home made poppies can be dropped off for inclusion in the displays. We will also spray varnish the poppies to seal them and prevent the paints from running.
