

Shirehampton and its Street Market

I read with interest the article regarding the possibility of Shirehampton having a Street market which of course is a fantastic idea. I was a tad dismayed when I read that in some people's opinions, a weekday would be best as they considered the weekend to be in conflict with other larger markets. I'm not sure which other markets were being referred to, but I can't think of one close by. I think that Saturday is key because those who work aren't free on a weekday and the children are also at school. Prime time would be a leisurely morning start until mid afternoon. These hours would suit most at some time on a Saturday. Sunday is out of the question as most people enjoy an extended lie-in and only the hardcore go to boot sales.

To get the ball rolling, pitches could be free to allow sellers time to make a profit while footfall is initially low (after all, without the vendors there would be no market) and, once turnover and consumer awareness increases, then a contribution could be made towards the general upkeep and any licensing etc. More public and local shops/business consultation would be a great way to make sure that the market offers what the public might like from a market.

I also have some thoughts on general improvement of the high street.

One point that stood out for me was the planting of trees and extra benches. Trees have a natural calming effect aside from being beautiful and benches would enable our less mobile to get about more and spend their hard earned cash in our High Street. Last year the Sustrans group were in the high street asking what people's thoughts were on speeding etc. and if they had any suggestions for the local community; I wrote down 'some benches'. That was a year ago and still nothing!! Most areas in Bristol would die to have a village and a high street with the potential we have in Shirehampton, so how about it?

"Summer is a-coming in, loud now sing cuckoo!" is the first line of one of the oldest songs in the English language. Anyone remember singing it at School? Summer is the best season of all in our opinion, with holidays, fine weather and time to spend in the garden. Unfortunately the holidays, fine weather and time at the rear of your premises is just what the opportunistic burglar is hoping for. Holidays means homes where it looks like no one is there; fine weather means open windows and doors; easy pickings for criminals; if you are out the back, is the front of your home secure to stop walk in thefts? A lady we know had her handbag stolen. She left it near the front door and left the door open to let in some fresh air.

Taking security precautions is easy; being vigilant and thinking about crime prevention is what we call "target hardening" - making it difficult for those who want to take your possessions. Often they don't just take your new TV, DAB Radio or PS4. They smash their way in and leave a trail of heart-breaking mess too.

If you are going away, get your neighbour to park on your driveway and push any mail through your letterbox. If you have timer switches, put some lamps on them so the property is lit at night. Make sure any helpful implements to smash windows or gain entry like garden tools or ladders are put away before you go. When leaving your premises, close windows, even the very small ones and, if you are having a back garden BBQ, secure your home to avoid unwanted gate-crashers with theft in mind Don't forget, if you see anything suspicious or witness a crime in progress call 999 straight away.





TYNINGS FIELD NEWS NATURE

Branching out?

Ever wanted your local goats' milk and your brambles cleared at the same time?

Tynings Field news is about bramble clearance work done by a pair of goats and three human goats! At 8am Andy mowed the grass and Caroline started clipping. Then it rained and a few Jehovah Witness people dropped in on us. Street Goat unloaded two lovely female goats and we worked in the rain, cutting brambles in the goose pen.

You can find "Street Goat" on Facebook. They let goats go to work by munching on bits of disused land. You can also join their goat farm's milking shift coop and get all your milk fresh, unpasteurised for £70 a year. The benefit of goats' milk outweighs that of cows' milk.

We are a registered smallholding but we would also like to branch out.

If there are 4 to 6 people interested in a rota, either a part-time shift in keeping a Billy goat for land clearance, or two full-time females for milking and dairy plus munching; we have an ideal area of ground, just north of the goose run which will keep them fed and occupied. Street Goat can lend you goats or give advice on where they should graze. Goats don't eat expensive food and survive mostly on vegetation. They mellow with gentle handling and can be walked on a lead.

I hear you say 'What do I need?' I'd say a couple of buckets to start with. Then you need to talk to Caroline at Tynings Field Community Group and Street Goat.

NATURE NOTES



A stunning high tide the other morning, with blackberry brambles starting to flower! A very enjoyable start to the day with the dogs.

It has been a busy month for the breeding birds. Lots of young visiting the garden and surrounding grasses on the riverbank: sparrows, starlings, jackdaws, blackbirds, and, of course, the later arrival of my goldfinch chicks! They are now very expert at feeding on the Niger seed container, and are often there without their parents. The young starlings have been hugely entertaining, as they arrive every afternoon in a group, and queue up to use the bathing facilities offered by our water feature! I really must save up for a decent longer range camera to capture these special moments. The heronry is quieter now, as the parents have been able to leave the chicks for longer periods, and this morning it was difficult to tell if the nests were, in fact, still occupied.

The recent rain isn't always welcome, especially to us dog walkers! but it has been very welcome to gardeners, allotmenteers, and wildlife. The hedgehogs and badgers will find food more available just now, with the help of the softer ground. And worm and grub eating birds will hopefully benefit too.

That's all for now folks, so happy nature watching.

Celebrations At Shirehampton Men's Social Club

The 17th May marked a special anniversary for the local Men's Social Club, 65 years since it opened its doors on its present location in the High Street. The weekend started on Friday night with a race night, Saturday was party night with Sophie Silver singing and Sunday saw the club hold a pool competition with members vs. the committee. The winning team of course was the committee winning 5 - 3.

Georgina Lloyd is the Stewardess of the club and gave a brief history. "The first club opened in a tin hut in Walton Road about 1947. We are unsure of the exact date as it wasn't written down at the time. It later moved to some rooms in the Estate Office for a few years before it went through the hoop and in 1954 we were given the piece of land the club now stands on. And it's from this date we are celebrating".


John Scanlon along with his brother are trustees of the club. Their father Bill was a founding member and his picture along with other founders hangs up in the bar. "I was about 11 years old when the bar opened. Dad did shift work at the Smelting Works and I used to come up with a couple of empty lemonade bottles to get filled so they were available for dad when he got home. I used to knock on the back door and be frightened as to who was going to answer".

"I was about 17/18 years of age when dad first brought me up to the club on a Sunday lunchtime. There were guys playing dominoes and cards sat at their tables. He brought over the odd drink to me; needless to say getting up to go home, the mind was willing but the legs were weak and dad had to carry me home!"

"There are so many characters I remember. Our only entertainment was a piano in the bar that a couple guys used to play. One character was Chris Burfitt, who most probably had the worst singing voice you could imagine; my dad would stand up and say 'Everybody, cards and dominoes down Chris is going to sing.' He'd ask my dad, 'Bill, what do you want me to sing?' and my dad would say, 'I want you to sing Danny Boy in Polish!' Those were the days".

Of course the club has changed and now has an entertainment hall added (since1968) for parties and events. They've also done a lot of fund-raising for local community groups over the years. Hopefully future generations will keep this club going for another 65 years. Happy Anniversary!





Cancer Care

As treatments improve, more and more people are living with cancer in their daily lives. This means they need more than medical help; they also need practical, emotional and financial support. Our population is living longer with a diagnosis of cancer and beyond. The aim of care is not only treatment for the cancer itself but also for the effects of cancer on the body and on the mind.

For most people with a new diagnosis of cancer, the medical appointments and treatment are all at the hospital, apart from perhaps blood test appointments in our treatment rooms. - Increased risk of infection;
- Pain.

Our aim is to help you manage all of these with support as well as medication, and the excellent charities and groups that are available around Shirehampton.

Good nutrition and exercise play a vital part in helping to manage these symptoms and evidence shows that exercising up to five times a week for thirty minutes each time, even with simple exercise such as walking and swimming can have a positive effect on life expectancy and management of symptoms. Pain can be relieved by exercise alongside appropriate medication. A healthy diet can help manage anaemia, fatigue, mood and infection risk.

They can guide people through the system, supporting them every step of the way.
