Luigi Armato has been running his business, 'Luigi's Barber Shop' in Shirehampton's High Street for just over six years.

Luigi originally trained as a women's hairdresser and a barber. "It took four years to train with three years doing women's hair dressing and then a year barbering. I prefer to be a barber and originally set up my business in Clifton village. I stayed there for three years before I decided to sell up and move to Shirehampton. It's been an excellent few years here. Business went a bit quiet when The Original Factory Shop closed but it has picked up again since B&M Express opened."

"I like the social aspect of being a barber. Chatting with our customers on whatever subject is popular at the time. We talk about work, hobbies, interests for example. If the customer wants a change of hairstyle then there are hundreds to choose from. The trends keep changing and we keep up with the fashion so everyone looks modern. If someone is unsure what they want then we can advise on haircuts but in the end it's down to the customer what he wants. It's very much a customer orientated barber shop."

"We do student discounts and OAP rates for our customers. We can do babies haircuts but our age range is varied from young children to our older senior citizens. There are a lot of father's and son's haircuts too. I just hope our customers enjoy their time with us, like our attitude and approach to barbering. We like to welcome our customers anytime."

When asking his thoughts about the High Street Luigi said. "We have the Co-op, that is always going to bring in customers but with B&M Express and the High Street Market, that should bring in more customers and increase footfall for the area. Of course the High Street is a bit up and down at times but hopefully things will turn around for the better in the future for Shire".



Group met with Councillor Asher Craig recently to discuss progress in delivering on the Community Plan. Councillor Craig was impressed with all that has been accomplished so far and promised her support for the High Street Markets and for efforts to improve the street scene on the High Street, which have been delayed. Why Local Libraries Are Important

As a former member of Bristol Library Service staff and a professionally qualified librarian, I'm a big supporter of public libraries. Here's my case for keeping all our branch libraries open, and bringing back services to places that no longer have them.

What Do Libraries Offer?

Public libraries have always offered free access to books and information. If you want to read for pleasure, research a topic for school or college, or simply find local/contact information, you would visit the library, where you could find a book or ask a member of staff.

Of course we now live in the 'digital age'. We can find out whatever we want to know online and, instead of reading, relax in front of a box set so some might ask why do we still need libraries or books?

Reliable Information

The problem is that we often don't know what's true and what's 'fake news' from an internet search. That's one reason why I think we need libraries more than ever. Bristol libraries have subscriptions to a variety of online information sources, from trusted providers, via the 24 Hour Library. Many of these resources are available from home for library card holders but for those who don't have access, or just aren't sure, library staff can help you use them in branch.

They are also a good place to go for anyone who doesn't use the internet, or needs help using it. If you don't have a computer/smart phone/tablet, there are bookable computers in every library in the city and there's usually someone who can help you use them

Reading

Literacy is still one of the most important life skills and you can never be too well-read! Reading for pleasure is proven to be beneficial to mental and emotional wellbeing for young and old. It is also increases empathy, another important life skill.

Older people can benefit from continuing to read and there is evidence that it could slow down the onset of dementia.

Young children love to touch and hold books and they also love being read to. Not all parents are confident readers but a visit to the library, to a rhyme-time or story-time session takes the pressure off the adult. It is fun for the child, encourages creativity, helps them understand new ideas and gets them ready to start reading themselves.

Public Space

Libraries are open to everyone and they can often be the only place that people can go to where they won't be asked why they are there or be expected to buy something. Libraries are wheelchair-accessible and welcoming to people who might not otherwise see anyone all day. They provide informal meeting spaces, as well as welcoming groups, such as book clubs, knitters & natterers or local history groups. They give lonely people a reason to leave the house.

Why Local?

Central Library is great and I would recommend everyone visits and uses it as often as they

can. However, if you are elderly or disabled, have young children, or are on a low income, a trip to town is not always an option. Having a local library service, a short journey from home, can make a real difference to your quality of life.

Community Hubs

A more recent idea is to combine a variety of local services, including libraries, in one building. A community hub is about to be constructed in Lawrence Weston, which has been without a library for many years now. I, for one, really hope that we can bring this important service back to a community of nearly 11,000 people.

The Future

The current Labour-run Council is committed to retaining all of Bristol's libraries. A new strategy is being written as we speak, with a focus on keeping libraries in the heart of communities, with users having a say in how they are run and what services they offer.

So, if you're not already a library user, visit your local library and join. If you love your library service, or even if you think there's room for improvement, why not join your local library's 'friends' group and help make it the library you want it to be.



Coincidence do you think?

There is a lot of squirrel activity everywhere at the moment, especially here on the Cotswold and at Kingsweston, as they start stocking up their winter larders. My terrier goes into hunting mode very quickly when we walk up at the woods, but luckily for the squirrels, he's not a silent hunter!!

Sustainability

Means living off the land.

Here we have two meals from one of our free range cockerels. Everything on the plate comes from the field.

For a family of 4 scrambled egg with chicken liver and cockerel broth.

I hear "I worry about climate change and want my children to learn how to survive, how to grow, kill and prepare their own food". We also get that Brexit will affect food prices farming and the like.

At the field we are getting ready by providing for ourselves by rearing our own meat and growing fruit and veg.

If you wish to learn the skills needed, we have people in our group who grew up on farms here,



willing to teach. You will learn less is more less meat. Only eating meat once or twice a week, eating eggs and veg, and the meals that can be made including how to prepare a bird from scratch without going near a shop or market.


