# Mrs Jean Archer (1922 – 2021)

It is with great sadness that the "Shire" has learnt of the passing of Jean Archer. Jean was married to one of our local GPs, Peter who worked in Shirehampton from 1960 to 1986. She was born in Saltford near Bath and married Peter, whom she met at Bristol University in 1953. She had been associated with the Shire Newspaper practically from its inception in 1972 when it was started by Rev. John Smith and a few others, as a means of communication within the village. Early copies show that Jean was on the committee in June.

After spending time as Vice Chairman in 1975 she became Chairman by 1982. In her time Jean had been involved with getting new advertisers, finding printers and editing on a regular basis, not to mention compiling "What's On in Shire" every month for many years. Without Jean's enthusiasm, energy, personality and driving force maybe "Shire" wouldn't have the success that it enjoys. In the words of Jean 'The strength of 'Shire' is due to the many unsung volunteers, the counters and deliverers, as well as the contributors and advertisers. Without them 'Shire' would be nowhere'.

In 2006 the first ever Awards for Excellence for Bristol Community Newspapers were presented and Jean received an award for length of consistent service to the Shire paper. The award was presented to Jean by local broadcaster Richard Wyatt, who was a very popular, well-known figure at the time.

When Jean moved from Shirehampton to Portishead she could easily have severed her ties with the paper but it is a measure of her dedication and commitment that she continued to serve and this meant regular

trips to Shirehampton for editorial meetings, collecting copy from the library, sorting out the What's On section and meeting with fellow editors – often several trips a month.

Jean leaves behind 3 sons, Simon, Paul who took over from Peter as one of the local GPs and Mark. She was also a devoted grandma to 6 grandchildren.

She passed peacefully on 1st June 2021 after a long spell in a nursing home.

### **PUBLIC INFORMATION FOR AUGUST**

### **COVID-19 Restrictions Lift July 19th**

From 19 July the majority of legal COVID-19 restrictions end. This does not mean that the threat of the virus has gone away. We are currently seeing very high case numbers in Bristol and many people are unwell.

Responsibility for protecting Bristol now lies more with the individual choices we make.

We recommend you:

- wear a face covering in indoor spaces, such as on the bus or in a shop, to show your respect for others, including frontline workers
- wash your hands, give people space, open windows when you can, and choose to leave crowded places if vou feel uncomfortable
- use regular rapid tests and get your vaccinations
- continue to isolate if asked

We especially ask you to show kindness and consideration to others as we all take this next step together.

#### From Monday 19 July:

- Majority of legal COVID-19 restrictions will be removed
- All businesses can reopen, including nightclubs
- There will be no limits on visitors to care homes, sporting events or theatres
- Double vaccinated adults and all under 18s will not be required to quarantine if returning to England from countries on the amber list
- Employers can start planning a safe return to the workplace

#### From Monday 16 August:

- Fully vaccinated people and those under the age of 18, will not need to self-isolate if they are identified as a close contact of someone with COVID-19
- Schools will no longer be required to implement "bubble" systems or enforce wearing face coverings

Although restrictions are lifting, this does not mean the virus has gone away. Vaccination, testing and selfisolation are the three most important tools we need to protect ourselves and others.

### **Quarantine Free Travel from 19 July**

From Monday 19 July, people who have been fully vaccinated with an NHS administered vaccine in the UK (plus 14 days), and are returning to England from amber list countries will no longer need to quarantine. Children under the age of 18 will also be exempt from quarantine. Proof of vaccination will need to be provided to the airline in advance of travel.

Anyone returning from amber countries will still need to complete a pre-departure test before arrival into England, alongside a PCR test on or before day two after arrival. They will not have to take a day eight test or self-isolate.

The current recommendation for people to not travel to amber countries will also be removed from 19 July. For more information, visit the GOV.UK website.

### **Changes to the International Travel List**

From 4am on Monday 19 July some countries are being moved onto the red, amber and green travel lists. **Red list changes:** 

Cuba, Indonesia, Myanmar and Sierra Leone are being added to the red list

If you return from any of these countries after 19 July, • NHS Test and Trace contact tracing website: you must quarantine in a government facility.

#### Amber list changes:

• Balearic Islands and British Virgin Islands will move We encourage everyone to please cooperate with to the amber list

Monday 19 July do not need to quarantine. If you are when necessary.

NOT fully vaccinated, you must isolate in your home for 10 days even if you feel well. This means you should not leave your home for any reason, except to get a test for COVID-19.

#### Green list changes:

• Bulgaria and Hong Kong are being added to the green list, while Croatia and Taiwan move to the green watchlist

Green watchlist countries are at risk of moving back to the amber list at short notice, so travellers who have not had both doses of the vaccine may have to isolate upon their return, subject to changes.

### **Clinically Extremely Vulnerable Guidance**

From Monday 19 July, as national restrictions lift in England, we will be advising clinically extremely vulnerable people, as a minimum, to follow the same guidance as everyone else.

However, if you are clinically extremely vulnerable you may wish to take extra precaution to reduce your exposure to COVID-19, including:

- limiting the close contact you have with those you do not usually meet with
- receiving your COVID-19 vaccination, and considering whether you and those you are meeting have been vaccinated - you might want to wait until 14 days after your second dose of a COVID-19 vaccine before being in close contact with others
- washing your hands regularly and avoid touching your face
- taking regular rapid tests and asking friends and family to take a rapid test before visiting you
- wearing a face covering, especially when there is close contact between people in enclosed and crowded spaces
- meeting outside if possible or making sure the space is well ventilated if you meet inside

### Isolating and Contact Tracing Update

From 16 August, fully vaccinated people in England won't have to self-isolate if they are identified as a close contact of someone who has tested positive for COVID-19.


Until 16 August, if you test positive for COVID-19 or have been identified as a close contact of someone who has tested positive, you may be contacted by NHS Test and Trace or Public Health.

You will be asked to provide some vital information to help NHS Track and Trace and Public Health understand and slow the spread of COVID-19. This is called contact tracing and is a very effective way to protect people and slow the spread of infectious diseases.

You will be contacted via text message, email or phone, asked to sign into one of two portals and provide details about where you've been and who you've seen:

The Main Hall dimensions are 51' by 30', excluding the stage. The stage is the width of the Hall, and is 12' deep. The Hall includes a tiered balcony, which seats 70. The maximum capacity of the Hall is 200 people. It is licensed for public dancing, singing, music, indoor sports, and theatrical performances. The Hall contains a piano.

The Penpole Room measures 20' by 19'. This upstairs room was formerly the children's section of Shirehampton Public Library. It is particularly suitable for meetings, presentations and art/craft classes.

The Springfield Room is on the ground floor, and measures 12' by 15'. A small room which would be a great office space or small meeting room.

There is a small kitchen which is suitable for preparing hot drinks and light refreshments.

### **CELLULOID MEMORIES... SAFE**

#### Dear Editor,

With reference to Nic T's letter titled Celluloid Memories I am able to answer his query. The black and white film of the old church burning down and the building of the present one was taken in 1928/29 by Mr. George Dawe, the local Dentist, who lived in a house called The Hermitage, a Georgian House, which before it was demolished stood opposite the Co-op. The fire was discovered by a local Policeman - PC Bertie Sparks (whom I knew when he was retired and I was a child). He was on his night patrol checking the security of properties and was at Shirehampton Golf Club. He looked down the hill towards the Village and saw flames coming out of the Church roof. He cycled quickly down the hill to Shirehampton Police Station and called the Fire Brigade. The cause of the fire was later found to be an electrical fault. Despite the name Sparks I am assured he had absolutely nothing to do with it!!!

The black and white film, together with the coloured films, disappeared for about 20 years, despite me making enquiries and making an appeal in "Shire" for information. Ralph Hack and I had a mutual interest in local history and the archive films were the property of St Mary's Church. I approached Ralph and asked him if he had any idea of their location but he said he had no knowledge of their whereabouts. Sadly, towards the end of his life Ralph began to suffer from Dementia. However, I was convinced he knew but couldn't remember.

When Ralph died, his nephew knew of my interest in locating these films and allowed me access to his house to look around for them. Success! In the top drawer of his Desk in his Study were the missing films.

The three coloured films were taken by Mrs Dixon the wife of the Rev. Clement Dixon, who was Vicar at St Mary's from 1920 until he retired in 1948.

I was concerned the films because of their antiquity, would deteriorate and be lost for ever. I searched around to locate a reliable Company capable of transferring them onto DVD and found one in Portland Square, St Paul's. All four films are now on DVD with four copies of each made. The films, accompanied by the DVD copies are now in the possession of the City Archivist. The second set are now stored in the Church. The third set I gave to Ralph Hack's nephew, who gave me access to his house and the final set belong to me.

So, rest assured Nic T - they are safe and sound! *Christopher M. Eynon.*

### **DESCENDANTS OF HEROES**

#### Dear Editor,

My late father married his first wife in 1918 and they lived in Meadow Grove. Sadly she died young, in 1935 and he then met my mother and they married in 1937.

There was a son of the first marriage, Kenny. On a school holiday day in early June 1933 Kenny, aged 12, cycled to a spot near Rockenham bridge - on the road to Severn Beach - for a swim in the Severn. Tragically, Kenny drowned. (His death increased local pressure for a public swimming pool to be built in Shirehampton and Shirehampton Baths, now also, sadly, gone was opened in 1935.)

My daughter has unearthed reports of the tragedy in the Western Daily Press of the time. At the inquest the coroner praised the efforts of two of Kenny's mates, also of Meadow Grove, to try and save him. Their names were Thomas Davis (aged 16) and Leslie Uzell (aged 12). They were described as "two young heroes of the tragedy."

I am wondering whether any descendants of Thomas and Leslie still live in the locality.



# Channel Swim 14.6.21

### By Dean Curtis

I was asked to do a solo English Channel swim 30 years ago but I declined as at the time I was having success in Master's swimming events. I never thought that at the age of 60 I would have a chance to be part of a 5-person Channel swim relay team. I needed to pass a medical and prove I could swim for 2 hours in open water to qualify for the team. Now fully recovered, I have had time to reflect on the story. Here are some memories that stand out for me:

- swimming 147km in 2 months, either at Clevedon pier / Marine Lake or Henbury pool, often swimming twice a day, sometimes finishing at 10pm.
- 2. Starting at Samphire Hoe beach at 1.17am and attached to their wetsuits for safety reasons.
- 3. My first hour long swim at 4.17am in semi darkness and slowly seeing the sunrise and the sky getting brighter as I took breaths.
- 4. Two of the team suffering from the cold for at least an hour after their first swims. Despite this they were still totally prepared to go back in to the water. Some teams do not complete the swim mainly due to the effect of the cold water.
- 1. The intensity and obsession of my training; 5. Doing well and on course to complete within 8. The celebrations beginning as we return by boat 15 hours, we had another option. However, it would mean swimming much faster, for a shorter period. We accepted this and the team put the afterburners on in our next swims to get us close to the French shore.
  - most of the team swimming with light sticks 6. Suddenly being hit by a huge wave right at the end of my afterburner swim; a speed boat had passed very close to us and I had been swamped by the wash.
    - 7. The great feeling as 2 members of the team land on the French soil. I am in shock when told we have swum 34 miles in total and it's taken us 13hrs 27mins. Not bad for a team with an average age of 54!

I would like to dedicate both my training and swim to my dad, Tony Curtis, who died in May 2019. Finally, thank you to my wife, Sian, for all her support.



### Couple of questions or three.


How did an animal, only minutes out in the big wide world know the international 'hop on my finger' gesture?

# Greetings from Shirehampton Baptist Church


During August we will be thinking about our Autumn Programme. We have been promised no more lockdowns but will still have to be vigilant which means we may have to do things a different way.



# E G R F P A G **CLIMATE NEWS FOR AUGUST: Extreme Weather!!!**

Here we are at the end of July and as I write we've been hearing of unprecedented heat waves along the west coast of North America, temperatures up to 50 degrees in Oregon and British Columbia. This is the Pacific Northwest, temperate rainforest with a long coast line and cold ocean currents. Now Oregon and British Columbia have joined California and Australia with a wildfire season, a season that starts earlier every year. Chard just down the road in Somerset was seriously flooded by heavy rain, and there were thunder storms and flash flooding all over the country in the first weeks of July. It's no longer news. 'Severe weather' is now a regular event. This is global warming. This is climate change.

We're beginning to see the effects closer and closer to home. Now it's not just subsistence farmers in sub-Saharan Africa who are being displaced from their homes, it's people we know in affluent North America or neighbouring Somerset. And yet very little action is being taken to end our burning of fossil fuels - the main source of atmospheric CO2, which is the main cause of global warming. The G7 failed to commit to any significant effort to slow the rate of warming. This why COP26 is so important - a last chance to ACT.

### **COP26** in Glasgow

The UN Climate Change Conference will take place in Glasgow in November. There are five main areas of response to climate change up for discussion:

- Helping people, especially those already severely affected by climate change, to adapt to their evolving circumstances
- Reducing the impact of climate change by restoring nature
- Transitioning from fossil fuels to clean energy
- Increasing use of clean transport eg walking, cycling, or electric or hydrogen vehicles
- Channelling global finance

Governments, national and local, must address all these issues. But what can we as individuals do in our daily lives to support the transformation we need?

Looking at those five 'areas of response' we can see that we too will have to adapt to climate change. Here in Shirehampton we can help 'restore nature' by protecting our green spaces and creating more. Even the smallest front garden can become a wildflower meadow supporting pollinators, or contain a sink or barrel pond providing water for small creatures and birds. We have relatively good public transport here in Shirehampton and each of us could commit to using it more. In some ways electric scooters are a menace - you can't always hear them coming! - but they reduce air pollution and with better regulation and safety training they are a force for good.

It's important that we ALL begin to understand how serious the Climate Emergency is so that we ALL can bring pressure to bear on our leaders, at every level, to take action in response to the crisis. That's why the Shirehampton Climate Emergency **Group** is organizing a...

We'll have a presentation on COP26 which will include a brief history of global climate agreements and the Paris conference of 2015 and explain again why COP26 is SO important. The pilgrimage is organized by faith groups to draw attention to the conference and create an opportunity to reach out to everyone along the way to remind them of how serious our situation is.

The camouflage was pretty impressive I have to say, and it stayed perfectly still while we excitedly talked about our good luck in spotting it.


I rushed home to get my wildlife of the British Isles off the book shelf, and I think this beauty could be a Red Underwing Moth! It was a special moment.

Although I tend to discourage the larger birds, when necessary, I did like watching a young, very noisy, Crow with its parent recently. They were on our back wall near a bowl of seed, and the youngster was bawling its head off! Said parent stood it for a while then decided enough was enough and off they went! Happy days!





More rowing sessions are being planned with the **Gig Club** in the Docks during July and August.


