### **FACE COVERINGS MUST NOW BE WORN**

COVID-19 spreads from person to person through small droplets. Droplets can be picked up from the surfaces they land on if you touch that surface and then your face without washing your hands first. This is why regular hand washing and covering your mouth when you cough and sneeze is so important in reducing the spread of the virus.

The best available scientific evidence is that, when used correctly, wearing a face covering may reduce the spread of COVID-19 droplets, helping to protect everyone.

In England, face coverings must now be worn in shops and shopping centres, in transport hubs and on public transport.

In other indoor settings where a face covering is not legally required, we strongly recommend continuing to wear a face covering, particularly if those settings are crowded, enclosed, lack good ventilation or are places where you may come into contact with other people you do not normally meet.

Please be mindful and respectful that some people may not be able to wear a face covering, and the reasons for this may not be visible to others.

### RAPID TESTS AT BRISTOL LIBRARIES

Lateral flow (rapid) testing kits are now available to collect from your local library. From this week, all but two Bristol libraries (Avonmouth and Hartcliffe, which are currently closed) are stocking rapid COVID-19 home testing kits, which are free to collect.

Regular testing, particularly before visiting a vulnerable person or attending an event in a crowded or enclosed space, is strongly recommended to help reduce the spread of COVID-19. It is quick, easy and helps to identify people who do not have symptoms of the virus but might still be infectious. The test does not need to be sent to a laboratory, meaning you will have a result in about 15 to 30 minutes. Should a result come back positive, please follow the guidelines to self-isolate and book a PCR test via the government website: www.gov.uk/get-coronavirus-test

To pick up your rapid COVID-19 testing kit, simply go to your local library and ask a member of staff at reception. Please check the opening hours.

Due to their popularity, pre-booking tickets for Wildlife Photographer of the Year at M Shed (www.bristolmuseums.org.uk/m-shed/whats-on/wildlife-photographer-of-the-year-2021/) and Grayson's Art Club at Bristol Museum & Art Gallery (www.bristolmuseums.org.uk/bristolmuseum-and-art-gallery/whats-on/grayson-perry-art-club/) is highly recommended to avoid disappointment.

During your visit, please wear a face covering unless you are exempt. It is now mandatory to wear a face covering in the museum shops but we ask that visitors continue to wear one in all parts of the museums.

## **MUSIC AND MURALS**

With regard to the poem in the November issue and the matters discussed by Mrs Waters and Mr Pace, there must be a mural in Shirehampton dedicated to music.

Music has always played an important part in any human community throughout the ages and the earliest villages are no exception to this. It has enhanced community life with dancing in the villages and entertainment from the wandering minstrel. It has also enhanced and inspired the religious services of the early village churches to the present day.

Shirehampton must have had a maypole on the village green in very early times, around which village maidens danced to the sound of a piper or fiddler. And, in pre-Victoria times, the parish church would be filled with parishioners singing lustily, accompanied by the village band, also played country dances for the common folk, probably in the Tythe Barn. The gentry and their wives and adult children would have attended (by invitation) more formal dances at the Elizabethan Manor House or Kings Weston House.

In Victoria times, when bands were banned in country churches and organs took their place, the Vicar and the organist were held in high regard. We must not forget the little boy working the manual bellows, before electric bellows were invented. The congregational singing would be led by the church choir, which sometimes performed in concert. Nowadays, this has expanded into the Area Choir, the numbers being somewhat depleted by the effects of the Covid Pandemic.

Early in the twentieth century, when the general public attended concerts people from the village and Avonmouth Choral Society. At one of these concerts in 1920 Vaughan William's now famous Lark Ascending was first performed in public.

The Public Hall has always championed music in the village in all its forms. After World War II and prior to the advent of public television, the local Gilbert and Sullivan Society produced marvellous productions, including The Pirates of Penzance, performing to packed houses. In the 1950s, the 191st scout Gang Shows contained lots of singing by the massed cubs, scouts and rover scouts. Most recently, The Grainger Players have been singing their hearts out for our entertainment in their revues and lately, their pantomimes.

Again, after the war and pre-TV, there was other musical entertainment to be had in the village. Singing songs around the piano was very popular especially at Christmas and even adult carollers in Victoria costume, paraded through the village. Of course, in the forty's young carollers, saw this as a way of adding to their pocket-money at Christmas and went door-knocking in the streets of Shire especially the Big Houses in Station Road!

There are other singing groups in Shirehampton, but the biggest is comprised of all those people who feel The Green, with their Shire centrefold, for Carols on the Green at Christmastide.

All the above provide ample images for a gifted muralist to use to fill one of the blanks walls of Shire. I hope it is not too long to wait for this to



This past year has been hard for us all, and I would like to pay tribute to the resilience, generosity and care shown by everyone in Bristol throughout this pandemic. The new year is a time for optimism, and I am excited about the promise it brings. I know many of us are concerned about the new variant. But I am confident we will rise to this challenge, just as we have done before.

We held our first in-person Christmas Coffee Morning since 2019, and it was great to chat with so many of you about issues from public transport in Shirehampton to national questions on climate change. Together we raised over £100 for the Bristol North West Foodbank, which has been doing incredible work throughout the year. Thank you to Amanda and Reece at the Shirehampton Public Hall for accommodating us all!

Many of you shared feedback about your experience of dental care in Bristol with me earlier in November. It's clear that right now it's too difficult to get registered as an NHS Dental Patient in Bristol, with many people forced to contact several dentists before joining the waiting list. Our survey results also raise questions about value for money and wait times for treatment. Our dental practices in Bristol work incredibly hard, and I've supported them in Parliament to get them support packages during the pandemic. However, I think it's time for the Government to get serious about funding NHS dental care, and that is something I will be working on this year.

## **Bee Happy Shire Bulb Planting Party**

On Saturday 6th November BEE Happy Shire held a bulb planting party on The Ridge in Shirehampton. If you live in the area, you most probably saw people with gardening tools digging up pieces of grass and filling them in again that morning, even with the threat of rain looming. Volunteers planted over 900 bulbs including daffodil and narcissi mix, giant crocus, snowdrops, anemones and grape hyacinths.



"SCAF has supported the BEE Happy Shire Project from the beginning. We have discussed different projects for the benefit of the bees and pollinators including various planting community events. We have also paid £123 for the bulbs from our SCAF Community Plans Funds" said Ash Bearman.

"Bee Happy Shire was set up in Autumn 2019 to turn Shirehampton into a 'Pollinator Friendly Village'. All our pollinators are in decline and any small part we can play to help them in the urban environment is important. Our first Planting Party was planned for the 4th April 2020 but it was cancelled because of Covid-19. Instead, we sent out seeds to local residents, to plant their window boxes, planters or gardens with pollinator friendly wildflowers. This was a great success, over 80 square meters' worth of wildflower seeds was sent out, and the results can be viewed on Bee Happy Shire's Facebook group" said Sara Cech-Lucas, founder of BEE Happy Shire.

"This was our first event and between us all we planted 900 bulbs in one hour. The plan is to create a long flowering season from the snowdrops in late January followed by crocuses, daffodils to anemones and grape hyacinths that flower through until May. This will give our pollinators a flying start in 2022."

"We welcome anyone to join our Bee Happy Shire Facebook group and volunteers to help us plant Shirehampton with flowers that will provide food for pollinators from January through to December as well as making the village a ray of colour during the seasons". said Sara.

Following the audit results, we have also instructed Carbon Footprint Ltd to offset our total CO2e emissions to zero. We've done this through supporting a **UK Tree Planting Project**. With this, **Carbon Footprint Ltd** also plants trees in the Amazon as part of their **Tree Buddying initiative**.

Paul Harris, Managing Director says, "We are proud to say that this is not 'greenwash', we are learning and adapting as quickly as possible. We are by no means satisfied with offsetting our carbon and leaving it there. This is the start of our journey to improve how we operate to reduce the impact our business has on the environment and our society."





## Library

The Friends of Shirehampton Library was set up in early 2019 after Bristol City Council Library Services went out to all 27 libraries, looking for ways of involving the local communities more, with the hope that some "Friends of Libraries" group evolve from the consultation. Well, even though Shire Library is one of the lesser used libraries in the city, a group of us were determined that it should be supported in every way possible.

Since then, we've created Shire's Living Room, which meets every Tuesday from 3pm till **5pm**, when the library service is shut. All folk are welcome to come along for a friendly chat, a cuppa and a biscuit, play a board game, do a jigsaw etc. – at least 50 people have participated in this since it started.

We had two hugely successful evening sessions before the lockdown, an Introduction to Family History, using the Ancestry website, which was then free via the Library Internet. We also had a talk on the History of Kings Weston House with Norman Routledge, the former owner, to which 40 people crammed into the library. We had more talks planned with local authors, but these were scuppered by Covid.

However, we had successfully applied for monies from the Libraries Innovation Fund before the lockdown, have now received them, and are in the process of purchasing some laptops, a printer, projector, and other peripherals. This equipment will be used in early 2022 for a new Family History Group, with expert help for folks to learn how to do their own family background research.

One of our remits was to help reduce "Digital Exclusion." This means providing help and access for folk who may never have had the opportunity to use a computer before. So, we shall be running courses for beginners in using a computer: how to turn one on, access the internet, create an email account, send an email, access Council and Government services, safe online shopping, viewing TV and/or streaming services etc. This will be available for people of all ages, from 4 to 94!!

It's also our Annual General Meeting at 6pm on Thursday, 6th January 2022 in Shire Library, all are welcome to attend and find out more about the project.

All we can do is make sure




