

## **The Lives of the Cockle Lady**

Back in January Shire ran an article at the unveiling of a mural of the Cockle Lady on the wall of the former Hawkins News building in the High Street. Now, as Wayne Harvey tell us, that story has gone round the world!

"Months after the unveiling of the Cockle Lady (Lillian Rees) we have been contacted by Lillian's Niece Eiry Goldsmith. It's incredible that Twitter and social media can be such a useful and powerful platform to spread a story around the world about what is essentially happening in our village. Here is the correspondence we received. Hope you enjoy the insight into our beloved Cockle Lady. Now we have the conundrum of changing the name plaque on Joe Westlake's incredible artwork. You can see from these pictures how accurate the artwork really is as we never had this picture to work from.

## Here is the letter from Lillian's niece, Eiry Goldsmith:

"Nice to hear from you Wayne. My daughter **Eleanor** came across info with regard to this mural of the Cockle Lady. Just one point of error, Wayne. She was actually **Lillian Davies (nee Jones)**. The younger generation made the mistake due to the fact that Lillian's daughter was **Rita Rees** as she'd married **Byron Rees**.

Lillian worked hard all her life. As well as selling cockles on weekends she used to have cleaning jobs too during the week. She lived with Rita and Byron

and their daughter Jane firstly in Forest Road, Kingswood and later (during the 1960s onwards) in Bath Road, Longwell Green.

Rita was well known in her own right as she received an MBE for setting up and managing the Headway Charity in Frenchay after daughter Jane suffered severe brain damage when, during the 1970s and at University, her car went out of control and hit a wall. Jane was left in a coma for several months. She had a reasonable recovery but her short term memory was not good.

Rita then arranged intensive physio with friends from Bath so that Jane did manage to walk again albeit slowly. Rita died about 5 years ago soon after I visited her at **Southmead hospital**. Since then Jane, who would now be about 3 years younger than me so in her late 60s, went into a care home where I believe she is very happy. That was the last time I visited **Bristol** as I now live with my husband in **South West France** in an old farmhouse.

I spent months in Bristol in 1967 when I first joined **Midland Bank** as I attended their training centre in **Clifton**. There was prearranged accommodation which had to be adhered too but I spent many a happy evening and every weekend at **Auntie Lil's**.

My contact with you Wayne and with Shire came about because my daughter Eleanor who lives in New Zealand found the articles via Twitter and copied me into them. Otherwise I'd have had no idea. I well remember from the 1960s how Lillian used to go with the cockles to Shirehampton and Pill. As I recall Rita would sell cockles in Bath at the same time. Selwyn's van would come up to the Severn Bridge on a Friday night and Rita or Byron would meet it there to take the cockles ready for the weekend.

Lillian was a wonderful aunt. She was one of about 11 children. Their father Llewelyn was a coal miner struck with pneumoconiosis at an earlyish age. Our grandmother Margaret was a fiercely strong woman in mind and body and went to gather cockles on a daily basis. These would then be sold on Swansea market some 7 or 8 miles away. One of Lillian's brothers (obviously another uncle of mine) was Professor Idwal Jones - an interesting link here https://biography.wales/article/s2-JONE-IDW-1899."





We are delighted to have received a Bronze Eco Church award. Over the past few years we have focused more on how to look after God's creation as best as we can, particularly with the threat of the climate and biodiversity crisis. The Eco Church programme offers churches a survey to complete on the areas of worship and teaching, building and land management, community and global engagement, and lifestyle.

We were particularly commended on our webpage, "Eco Church: Striving to be Good Stewards of God's Creation", which has more information on why we signed up to the award scheme, what we can do to better look after the Earth, where more information can be found, and prayers of adoration, confession, and commitment.

We had a very interesting visit at the beginning of May from a thermal imaging surveyor from the **CHEESE project**. One area in which we can all make a difference to our carbon footprint is to insulate our buildings more effectively. This leads to needing to use less heating, which is also good for money saving too! The surveyor used a little machine to show up all the places that we are losing heat in the church. We now have a very long list of helpful tips and tricks which we can gradually work through to make our church building better insulated.

In connection with the **JTE Hub**, we have many events happening in our building on weekdays: films, games, community fridge, benefits and jobs advice, and a new memory café which is particularly for people affected by dementia.

If you are unsure where we are located, our building is opposite Boots, Lloyds Bank and the Job Centre on the High Street. The entrance is on Penpole Avenue. There are three doors; the most accessible entrance is the white door a little way up the road. Please don't hesitate to ring the doorbell if the door is shut to keep the building warm and insulated!

## **Baptist Church News**

May 2023 will be remembered for some significant events chief among them the Coronation of Charles III, the street parties and the Eurovision Song Contest and sadly the dreadful Civil War in Sudan.

Finally, many thanks to the band of volunteers who helped make the running of the event go so smoothly this year.




























## **Old Barrow Hill Coronation Party**








Ken Davies about to deliver a wood in the first Mens League game of the 2023 season in Keynsham Park on April 27th – Keynsham C were the opponents.

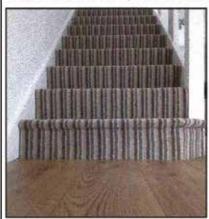
