RECENT COUNCIL ADVICE AS OF 18TH JUNE

Bristol has followed public health guidance well so far, however, we must continue our efforts to limit the virus being passed on to others and avoid a second spike. The risk to our health still exists and our message remains the same:

Stay at home as much as you can, keep maintaining good hygiene such as hand washing;

Continue to work from home and only visit shops when absolutely necessary;

If you are travelling, please walk or cycle if you can, avoid peak travel times and prioritise public transport for those key workers who need it most;

Social distancing is still one of the most important prevention measures, so please keep your distance and wear face coverings, especially when near a lot of people or in enclosed spaces;

If shops or shopping areas become too busy and you cannot safely socially distance, please leave the area.

EASING LOCKDOWN


Saturday 13th June at 10am, single adult households (adults living on their own or single parents with children under 18) will be allowed to form a "support bubble" with another household, and be able to interact with each other without social distancing.

Monday 15 June "non-essential" retail such as clothing shops and department stores, including our major shopping areas, Cabot Circus and the Galleries will re-open. Please try to limit visits where possible to avoid risk of infection. Please continue to walk, cycle or drive if you can; only using public transport if you have no other means of getting to your destination.

Please continue to stay home as much as possible, maintain handwashing and if you are in a public place, avoid the risk of infection by leaving the area if it is busy. We must also continue to prioritise public transport for key workers, by staggering the times we are travelling and going out.

PARKS

There are a number of changes being made in our parks to respond to the relaxation on restrictions from government. These are:





- Play with a maximum of six people in your group
- Do not share equipment
- Keep 2m apart at all times.

Remember not to visit the areas if you have coronavirus symptoms, and please wash your hands as soon as you arrive home.

Under government guidance, play areas and equipment remain closed.

We continue to look at how we can safely reopen public toilets and we are working with the Police to reiterate message of not going to the toilet in public spaces.

Food/refreshment outlets in our parks have now reopened.

PLACES OF WORSHIP REOPENING

From **Monday 15 June**, places of worship will be permitted to open for individual prayer in line with social distancing guidelines. We recognise this will be long-awaited good news for people of all faiths, who have shown enormous patience and have been unable to gather to mark significant moments such as Easter, Ramadan, Eid, Passover and Vaisakhi together.

Communally led prayer will not be possible at this stage, and individual places of worship are able to open at their own discretion, when they consider it safe to do so.



Help for the Visually Impaired

With non-essential shops due to reopen on 15 June, it is expected that these will use visual markers to signify the correct distance from others, one-way systems and designated queuing areas.

With social distancing now part of everyday life it is important to highlight that not everyone can maintain the required distance as easily as others.

People who are blind and partially sighted can struggle to know when they are getting closer to someone, or if someone is approaching them. And guide dogs, of course, aren't trained to help in this regard. In general, people are supportive, but there have been occasions when individuals with

sight loss have been challenged or even shouted at for coming too close to others, when the reality is they simply weren't aware of it.

In such uncertain times, tensions over distancing can rise. But we would ask that if you feel someone seems to be ignoring the restrictions, consider for a moment whether that person, rather than being careless, might not be able to fully see you.

Hundreds of thousands of people in England are living with a degree of sight loss. Please be aware that some people do need just a little extra thought.

Public Hall Newsletter

Dear all user groups and friends,

The Trustees hope you are keeping well, and safe in these abnormal times. The hall trustees have been trying to use the time effectively and we want to use this opportunity to bring you up to date. We have agreed as an exception to let the food bank use the hall itself for distribution purposes, with them being responsible for Covid compliance. They apparently give 40% of their supplies to the people of Shirehampton. I hope you agree this is a good thing to do.

We do have a circulation list for updates but to comply with GDPR rules, we can't say who all recipients are. If you are reading this and would like to be on the distribution list, please let me know.

Building Work

During the period of lockdown we had the great news that the Council will be making a major investment to stripping and replacing the roof which should ensure that the building is structurally sound for the foreseeable future. We are aiming to time this with getting the roof fully insulated, installing potential wiring for new chandeliers, getting the clock repaired, and using the scaffold to refurbish the rendering. This it may of course lead to a period of disruption again, unless it can be done before we reopen. We are awaiting information from the City Council on the implications, and timescales and will keep you informed. As the original plans for the building were rejected by the Planners (primarily the new toilet block on the side of the building) we will have another set of draft plans ready for consultation soon.

The trustees are keen to form a subcommittee for this building project and would welcome the involvement of any users. We would particularly welcome skills in writing grant applications or other fund-raising expertise or a willingness to learn these skills. Please contact us if you, or someone you know, might be able to help.

User Group Forum

Before the Covid 19 outbreak, we were keen to form a "User Group" forum, with the chair of that group having a seat on the board of trustees, giving our valued users a stronger voice. This is still the objective, and any ideas/volunteers would be very welcome. Please send any thoughts to myself, or Gail Amphlett. When life returns to normal, we will set up a series of user group meetings. It is vital that what we do for the hall is for the current and future users, so please do get involved to make this a success.

People

We are fortunate to have a good team of staff in the Hall and are pleased to be able to retain their services and ensure they receive their standard salaries under the furlough scheme.

Website

We are in the process of developing a new web site to push us forward for the next few years. John Bradford from the coding club has kindly volunteered to lead the project. Anyone with an interest is welcome to join in the design/development of it. Please get in touch if that is you.

AGM

Under the current circumstances the AGM will be postponed until safe to hold it. However, we would encourage you to renew your membership if possible, which will benefit the hall and allow voting



at the AGM. A copy of the membership form can be obtained from shirepubhall@yahoo. co.uk or see below.

Charges

We have obviously suspended all rental charges for the time being and are using reserves as required. When the Hall reopens, for our regular users, instead of individual monthly invoices and individual payments, it will keep (all) our costs down if we move to automatic standing orders. We will, of course reimburse your bank account for any overpayment if the Hall is closed for (say) elections. Your comments on this will be welcome.

In summary, whilst it appears that the world has stopped still for the hall, there is a fair bit going on, which I hope we can all participate in to make it even more lively and good to be part of.

If you know of any of our hall users (or others in our community) that can be helped in any way by the Shirehampton Public Hall trustees, please do get in contact.

Hi Folks!


Having been in "lock-down" now for 3 months, much of the news I have for you is what I have been able to find out from other people. Three months is the longest period in my life I have never set foot in the church. The longest period before is 3 Sundays when I have been on holiday. Jill and I have found Sunday so different from normal and we have had to suffice our normal worship by listening to the 8.00 am Morning Service on Radio Bristol, Morning Worship on BBC 1 followed by Songs of Praise. Revd Helen has also written a Reflection for each week for us to read and think about, as well as recording a sermon each week that can be found on our website and Facebook page. Eleanor, our Administrator, has even managed to set up a Dial-A-Sermon service so that those who don't have internet access can hear Helen's sermon on the phone.

Duncan Jennings from his dining room at this will also be somewhat different, probably with Thornhill, Southampton where he is Vicar of that parish. Duncan will be known to many of you as the former Organist & Choirmaster at St Mary's many years ago, and as the Head Teacher at Avon School (now known as Nova Primary School), Barracks Lane.

The Government has indicated that churches may re-open for Private Prayer during June, but St. Mary's may not re-open until early July as some refurbishment is being taken to the interior decoration. As soon as it is open, there will be notices on our noticeboard and on the church door to let you know and we shall send out emails to those on our contact list. We have also been fortunate to pick up a **Holy** Government that it is safe to do so. I suspect that Communion Service online led by Revd when the church is open again for Sunday Worship social distancing measures and no singing, due to concerns over the risk of spreading infection!

> But do not despair - have you noticed our Tree of Hope in the Churchyard facing the High Street? This is a place where you can come to be reminded that you are part of a wider family of Christians, despite us being scattered and isolated. A place where you can reflect upon the truth that our lives are always a mix of blessing and challenge. A place where you can do something tangible to express your sorrow and lament for all who suffer as a result of the pandemic, and also to give thanks for the ways that you are experiencing God's goodness and provision through this season.



You are invited to take a stone in your hand - being aware of its weight, coldness and hardness. To reflect on the things that are heavy and hard for yourselves or for others. To lay the stone down at the foot of the tree as a visual symbol of Jesus carrying our burdens. You can then take a strip of material and pause to reflect on the good things in your life (signs of God's blessing). Tie the material to the tree as a visual act of prayer. Over time the pile of stones and the number of ribbons will continue to grow, and this is a visual reminder that we are still a community of believers together

As some of the lockdown restrictions have loosened, we have continued to follow the government guidelines in keeping our church building closed. We have continued to meet as a church family in many different ways: via WhatsApp messaging, Zoom, phone calls, email, YouTube and information through the post. Two of our members recently had surgery and were very encouraged to have our church family on a prayer rota. This was especially appreciated because no one was allowed to physically accompany them into the hospital.

Our minister, Reverend Patrick Stonehewer, has been videoing himself leading a time of worship each week, with a bible reading, prayers, a hymn and words of encouragement. The most up-to-date video can always be found on the church Facebook page or Revd Patrick's YouTube channel. It usually takes a little while for the website to catch up!

The end of May was marked by two special Sundays in the Methodist Church. The first was **Aldersgate Sunday (Wesley Day)** when we remember John Wesley's conversion at a Moravian Church in Aldersgate, on 24th May 1738, when he felt his heart strangely warmed and he became aware of God not only in his head but in his heart: he went on to form what became the Methodist Church. The second special Sunday was **Pentecost**, which falls 50 days after Easter Day, when we celebrate God sending the Holy Spirit to Jesus's disciples,

who became empowered to form the Christian Church and spread the message about God's love. We believe that even today we can each call on the Holy Spirit to help us when we feel weak and powerless.

Many of us have been involved in conversations around the Black Lives Matter movement. The Methodist Church has spoken out about this, welcoming and endorsing radical action in addressing the causes of injustice. Revd Dr Barbara Glasson, President of the Methodist Conference, has apologised for all the times the Methodist Church has not spoken out against the everyday injustices that are experienced by people from Black, Asian and Minority Ethnic Communities. She also apologised that the Church has not listened carefully enough and has not challenged the assumptions that come from



white privilege and bias. Our churches should feel like a safe sanctuary for everyone whatever their background. We believe that we are all made in the image of God.








SHIREHAMPTON CLIMATE EMERGENCY GROUP







City and Port of Bristol Bowling Club THE STORY OF PBA BOWLS CLUB (Part 1)

This article was previously printed in the June online only edition of Shire. We present it again for readers who may have missed it with the story continuing on the following page. We have also included photos from original newspaper cuttings of the new club being built in the early 70s taken by and with thanks to © Colin Momber.

In a season when, for unprecedented reasons, the chances of bowling look unlikely it is good to look back and reflect on better times and to the origins of the club.

bowling green at the PBA Sports and Social Club was opened. Built by En-Tout-Cas and started in 1973 at a cost of about £7500 it provided a home for the club founded years earlier by a few men who were keen to try this bowling lark.

Paul Bywater is the clubs longest standing member and he was one of the men who wanted to give it a try and did so initially in Canford Park during lunch breaks from the port.

Paul remembers how in about 1969 a group of people from the PBA Avonmouth Office (including himself) ate their lunch early so as to be at Canford Park by 1pm. Once a week became twice. The original bowlers were Paul Bywater, Dave Winstone, Pete Tarrant, Keith Thompson, Bruce Tilley, Malcolm Leach and Pete Stevens. The idea caught on and soon lads from the workshop - Ian Wilson, Howard English and Nobby Whitehead joined in.

From that point serious consideration was given to forming a team that would apply for friendly fixtures and hopefully be accepted in the more serious bowls league. All of the aforementioned


To many, the club started in 1974 when the individuals were allocated a job. Paul became Match Secretary. Everybody did their bit to get things rolling but it was Ian Wilson who took a leading roll and incredibly arranged a green share with Avonmouth Bowls Club. This was at the original **Avonmouth Green** on the site of the **Avonmouth** Football Club. PBA were made very welcome at Avonmouth and flourished with the arrival of more members. Ernie Lee and Ken Culverwell from the PBA Police. Arthur Horley and his brother Ernie plus Joe Kidd, Eric Lishman and Ray Cooper were non-PBA people. Bert Sweet, Neil Wilson and Ken McCullock came from **PBA Workshops. Ivor Simmonds** came from the PBA Locomotive Shed and Roy Simmons was from the PBA Offices.

> With a full fixture list Paul remembers a highlight being the game against Cope Chat in Stroud.

> The club was soon playing league bowls and surprising some of the opponents. The first league victory was on Brandon Hill against Cabot who were a very good and well-respected team. It was a very warm evening and a couple of the PBA Team, although resplendent in grey trousers sported fashionable coloured vests. This met with looks of

disdain and much whispering from the opposition and this grew as the scores pointed to a victory for the visitors. After this, correct dress was very much order of the day.


City and Port of Bristol Bowling Club THE STORY OF PBA BOWLS CLUB (Part 2)

The first part of the story ended on a high with the men's league team recording their first win, away at Cabot. So, what happened after that?

Moving on several seasons **Paul** remembers a cup game against **Redland Green** on the new but very ropey green at the PBA Club.

Redland Green had some particularly good bowlers and they were not at all impressed with what they were being asked to play on. At this point one of the Redland Green players, with a tobacco-less pipe in his mouth stepped forward and said, "but it's the same for both teams". That player was the best of the best - **David Bryant**, a name synonymous with bowls everywhere - a great player and a real gentleman.

In the years that followed the club name changed from PBA to City and Port of Bristol. In the early 1980s the first ladies joined what had until then been an all-male club. The first two ladies to join were - **Ivy Gingell and Angela Simmons**.

Ian Wilson formed a club league from all sections at the port and that, at its greatest was played on Monday and on Tuesday evenings.



The club had 140 members - so, putting your name down as available next weekend didn't guarantee you a game. Apparently doing a tea duty this week did help with selection the following week!!

In 1982/83 the Bristol Ladies League was formed, and the City and Port team was very much a part of it. Irene Whitfield was the first Captain, Shirley Parker, Secretary with Pat Warren, and Irene Jenkins selectors. The ladies did very well then and in the years that

followed, never dropping below division two and competing in **Top Club and Inter Club Competitions** each season.



So, that was how it all started and developed. Now - more than fifty years on from the beginnings in **Canford Park**, bowling is still being enjoyed albeit with smaller numbers than were seen in the 1980s.

The 2020 season is different to any other - into the third month since the scheduled start and not a wood has been bowled due to Coronavirus.



But, in May came some good news from the **Sports Governing Body, Bowls England**. Firstly, that greens may open and two weeks later a set of conditions, approved by the appropriate government department allowing bowling to start in a limited and controlled way. This means that up to six bowlers at a time can once again enjoy being on the green, observing conditions as set out by Bowls England.






