REMEMBRANCE 80 Years Since VE Day and VJ Day

On Sunday 9th November Remembrance Day remembered the fallen of two world wars and those that returned home. It is often said that the war dead are the real heroes who gave their lives for freedom of the then, future generations. However, to anyone who returned, they are heroes too because we wouldn't have democracy, freedom of speech as opposed to suppression and dictatorship. It is those who returned we can learn from as war is a horrific thing to face. Although some never spoke of the atrocities ever again.

This year marked the **80th anniversaries** of **V.E Day** on 8th May and V.J Day on 15th August, that provided an opportunity for the nation to come together to honour and pay tribute to the Second World War generation from across the UK and Commonwealth.

Back in 1945 the Allies accepted the unconditional surrender of German Forces and was signed on





7th May 1945 at General Eisenhower's headquarters in Reims, France. It came into effect at 11.01pm central European time. The people celebrated the end of a 6-year brutal conflict. Despite rationing, neighbours came together for V.E day street parties sharing what food they had. I was told by mum who remembers that day, that my Uncle Bill decorated the old oak tree with lights in the street. I won't reveal the electrical source though. Celebrations went into the night.

V.J Day marked the end of the Second World War as the Asia Pacific war continued at a pace until 15th August 1945. It came to a dramatic end when two atomic bombs were dropped on the Japanese cities of Hiroshima and Nagasaki. Horrific in itself.







The Remembrance Service at the top of the hill attracted a huge number of people showing their respects and remembering everyone no matter what their role.

The Brownies, Guides, Cubs, Scouts, Rainbows and two representatives from Avonmouth Sea Cadets stood alongside veterans from the Armed Forces of more recent years. Each placed a poppy wreath on the Cenotaph with grace and respect. St. Mary's Church did the Remembrance service with high regard to all the armed forces that we should never forget.

Thank you to everyone who joined me in early November for my first 'in conversation with...' event, where the need to open up opportunities in the arts and culture for the many, not just the few, was the topic of discussion.

I was pleased to be joined by two prominent figures in Bristol's arts and culture scene to discuss the topic: **David Sproxton, the Co-Founder of Aardman Animations** – the studio behind *Wallace & Gromit* and *Morph* – and **Simon Wales, the Chief Executive of the Bristol Beacon** – a charity that not only hosts big city centre performances, but also leads on music education in the West of England.

The event was a great networking opportunity, with many creatives from across Bristol North West gathered together in one room, including a Shire resident who shared with us that he runs an established monthly open mic night for spoken word poets and comedians, called **Riot Act**.

I hope the attendees continued to connect in a dedicated post-event **WhatsApp group** that was set up to hear people's thoughts after the event. This is something new for my events, with the link to the groups only emailed to





CLIMATE NEWS

As I write this *Cop30 is opening in Brazil*. Cop is the United Nations' annual climate summit; nearly 200 countries gather to negotiate and make decisions about tackling climate change. In *Paris in 2015* the nations agreed to undertake carbon reducing measures that would keep rising global temperatures below 1.5 degrees and thus avert the worst consequences of global warming.

The UK hosted **Cop26** in **Glasgow** in **2021**. Several people from Shirehampton joined a pilgrimage walk to Glasgow to support our government's efforts to "KEEP 1.5 ALIVE". Even then we saw that while wind and solar power were gaining ground and fossil fuels were declining a great deal more needed to be done by government if we were to keep to a rise of 1.5C.

The news from Cop30 is not good. We have to acknowledge that we have failed to limit global warming: carbon emissions are in fact increasing.

We see the catastrophic consequences of that failure to reduce emissions in the devastation caused by Hurricane Melissa. And there will be more such storms. But what can we do? 'Just Stop Oil', of course. But much as we reduce our individual carbon footprints we know that real change can only come from government action to support green industries against the hugely powerful and wealthy fossil fuel industries. For each of us perhaps now is the time to "tell the truth" about climate change, huge and frightening as that truth is.

Not a very cheerful message as we approach Christmas. But we are also coming to the end of this year, preparing for the Solstice and the return of the sun and light. It is a time for new beginnings acknowledging the reality of what's happening to our climate and what we need to do.

Fight Fly-Tipping and Keep Britain Tidy!

Bristol Waste Company and Bristol City Council are teaming up with Keep Britain Tidy with a new campaign to crack down on rogue waste carriers, or 'white van' operators.

Fly-tipping costs councils across England millions of pounds every year in clean-up costs, draining money that could otherwise be spent on essential local services. Bristol City Council actively investigates anyone who illegally handles or dumps rubbish.

Bristol Waste Company and Bristol City Council are supporting Fight Fly-tipping with a local campaign for the people of Bristol to protect themselves and their communities from falling for a #RubbishDeal – low-cost, unlicensed services offered on social media by organised waste criminals.

There are 3 simple steps to avoid a #RubbishDeal:

- 1. Ask for a waste carrier registration number.
- 2. Check it on the Environment Agency's public register at https://environment.data.gov.uk/public-register/view/search-waste-carriers-brokers or call 0300 065 3000.
- 3. Check you'll get a receipt



There is no excuse for fly-tipping. In Bristol, there are lots of ways to dispose of waste. We have three household reuse and recycling centres, which residents can visit for free. The Council also offer bulky waste collection services, and the city has a range of reliable, licensed private waste carriers.

People should report fly-tipping using FixMyStreet - https://fixmystreet.bristol.gov. uk/?filter_group=Flytipping,Street+cleansing

Anyone caught fly-tipping could be charged with a criminal offence and receive a fine of up to £50,000.



History Man

A profile of John Barbey of Kings Weston House

John Barbey, the current leaseholder of Kings Weston House, has come a long way. Born to a family of successful garment manufacturers in Pennsylvania, he moved to California at the age of nine, migrated with his family from there to French Switzerland, then moved to France and from there to England before returning to San Francisco to work as a campaigning journalist for 30 years. John has travelled all over the US in search of the perfect place to live, but finally, aged 60 and weary of the tumult of journalism, decided to base himself in Europe.

An unapologetic Anglophile with familial roots in **England's West Country** as well as **Italy, Scotland** and **Ireland**, he lived in London for several years before finally moving to Bristol and Kings Weston in 2015, becoming the leaseholder of Kings Weston House and its four acres of land four years later. He has since dedicated his 'retirement' to restoring, maintaining and operating this historic gem as a going concern.

John has always had a keen interest in architecture and the restoration of historic house interiors, including during his years in California. In Britain, his favourite building is **Castle Howard in Yorkshire** (like Kings Weston House, part-designed by the architect and dramatist **John Vanbrugh**) and if he had to return to any period it would be the late 17th and early 18th centuries, the period when Kings Weston House took much of its current form.

It's all a far cry from the garment manufacture on which his family's wealth was built (the Barbey family had interests in diverse fields, owned a significant portion of eastern Pennsylvania, and at one point even brewed a very well-regarded beer). Counting **Thomas Jefferson** and **Pocahontas** among his ancestors, John

was considered a 'black sheep' and almost completely disinherited by his family, but continues to plough his own furrow and pursue his chosen path.

Anyone who has looked inside Kings Weston House will appreciate the painstaking care and devotion that has gone into keeping the property immaculate and true to its original sumptuous appearance. Since taking on the lease of this magisterial mansion, however, John, together with his business partners **Josh and Katty**

Garcia, has had to overcome immense struggles to keep the business afloat, not least a seriously defective roof, windows that needed replacing and an ongoing and highly expensive issue of water ingress.


Despite these trials and tribulations, John valiantly persists in his mission, having recently obtained permission to install a lift for the disabled and with plans to expand the café. The funding for all this comes from operating the house as a top-notch wedding and events venue and as a location for filming.

Now 80 years old, John has no plans to move on. He 'adores' Shirehampton and is respectful of the local community; as he puts it: 'I've had a remarkably charmed life, but am at "the last act" and wanted to make some good of it all.'

So let us salute John Barbey's invaluable contribution, not just to the local landscape but to the country's national heritage.





Boys Rugby; Under 12 Avonmouth OBRFC v Clifton RFC Sunday 2nd November 2025

We at Shire are always delighted when we are invited to cover a match at our local community rugby club. There is always a warm welcome for those who wish to share in what this friendly, inclusive family centred club has to offer. This is the first time that Shire has covered a boys match and we were interested to learn about the further progression into contact rugby at this age group. We consulted the *RFU* regulations for information and discovered the following:

Girls and boys separate at this age group. As far as rules of play are concerned, teams are 12 a side maximum, pitch size is not more than 60m x 43m (normally half a full sized pitch), there are 20 minutes in each half, there are 5 players in a scrum, there is no limit on numbers contesting for the ball including in the maul and ruck and the hand off below the armpits is now allowed. The boys are already used to full contact tackling, the tackle and hold element having been introduced in the u9 age grade.

It was a keenly fought and tightly contested game; Clifton gained the upper hand early on with the first scores, but Avonmouth fought back with great spirit, fiercely contesting scrums, passing the ball swiftly out along the back line and putting in some crunching tackles. The points for and against began to rack up, it was very easy to lose count and I duly did. No matter, the result is not the point of playing the game at this age grade. It's all about fostering youngsters' love of the game, keeping them active and engaged and continuing their development in a world where community is everything.

At the end of the game I spoke briefly to joint captains **Sully** and **Elliot**, asking them what they love about their club and the game. Sully has been with the club for 7 years, ever since he was eligible to join **Tots Rugby**. His reply was a single word, "Community". Elliot has been at Avonmouth for 3 years and his reply was equally brief, "Everything." I realised that the boys were keen to get into the clubhouse for their post-match lunch, but I felt strongly that their single words were genuinely and strongly felt. Put them together and you summarise what lies at the heart of this club: "Community is Everything."

In 2011 he participated in **Ashton Court parkrun**, the first parkrun in all of Bristol. He has taken part in **The London Marathon**. His wife also participates in ultra marathons.

The event displays a variety of people all working together to keep it running. It is run entirely by hard working volunteers who dedicate their Sunday mornings to the family event. There are often teens volunteering for their **Duke of Edinburgh Award**. The run itself is attended by children, parents, grandparents and even ex-runners.

Children have the opportunity to receive awards for their hard work and commitment to the parkrun. But the rewards aren't just for runners, volunteers too can win their very own t-shirt after volunteering 25 times.

Arabella Phillips, Robin's daughter, has been attending parkruns with her parents since she was in a buggy as a young child. She joins in at the Kings Weston Junior parkrun every week, either with various friends or on her own. She decides what part she wants to play each week. Sometimes she scans barcodes, sometimes she walks instead of runs. Whether it's running or marshalling, she always has a great time.

Because the event is a run and not a race, the atmosphere is very relaxed. It's not just a parkrun; it's also a social event. It's a great way to get out, see some

Blind "Groundhopper" Visits Avonmouth F.C.

John Stancombe lives in Oulton Broad, in Suffolk. As a result of a genetic condition, he has been totally blind for 18 years. This has not in any way diminished John's passion for and dedication to following grass roots football.

On Saturday October 11th, John made his way to Avonmouth for his 1883rd visit to a "non-league" ground in 15 years. On the day before, John had travelled to Pontypool to notch up his 1882nd ground, visiting Goytre F.C. for the visit of Chepstow. He then stayed overnight in Cwmbran and travelled to Avonmouth on Saturday morning. After the game, he travelled back to Oulton Broad via Bristol, Paddington, Liverpool Street and Ipswich, where he took the 10:15pm to Oulton Broad, arriving a little before midnight. That is a daunting journey for anybody travelling alone, but John has a level of courage and positivity that drives him on to follow his passion, whatever it takes.

I was lucky enough to meet with and chat to John in the clubhouse, before the game against **Devizes Town**. I also accompanied him to his seat in the stand and gave the pre-match commentary until **Club President Dave Rowley** was able to join us. John wanted to know everything, so that he could get a picture in his head; what colours were the teams wearing, how exactly was the stand laid out, where was it situated and where was he seated in relation to the pitch were just a few of the things that John

wanted to know. It was an honour and a privilege to be able to relay this to him as best as I could, before taking up my position to take photos.

This is what Dave Rowley said to John in a follow up email to thank him for his visit after the 1-1 draw with top of the table Devizes Town:

"I know you were disappointed with the game quality but that was probably down to my lack of match feedback quality and I think I will stick to assessing refs as a coach! I hadn't realised just how difficult commentating on a game is.....Very best wishes to you and your **Groundhopping** exploits."

All credit to clubs like Avonmouth for making John and others like him so welcome. Grass roots football is the lifeblood of the game that people like John love so passionately; without it, the stars of the future would not have the chance to play, to be nurtured and to grow their ability, love of and dedication to the "beautiful game."

Fencing: The Things Change Doesn't Change

The picture is of a *Visconti* or "pistol grip" handle; not everyone's idea of a sword but then, most people's idea of a bicycle was once a penny-farthing.

There are similarities between swords and bicycles; each is a delivery system that transfers human intentions, as expressed through the body, to a distant, external effect.

Bicycles and swords are inanimate; neither of them moves themselves except under gravity. More accurately, they are part of delivery systems. The rest is us. Our bodies provide the power and our will sets them going. That means, like the pedals and handle bar of a bike, the nubs, hooks and surfaces of that weird looking handle respond to our bodies, as our bodies respond to us. Mastering the bicycle isn't enough, understanding how it works is useless unless our bodies are used in a way that works them - sword or bicycle.

So, understanding how your body works and getting it used to working properly lets you ride your bicycle like it lets the fencer hit without being hit - the difference is someone is trying to stop us doing the latter; as if you were riding in a very rough cycle race where making you fall off was the aim of the game.

That skill goes back further; to managing the emotions and perceptions in the fight - and influencing those of the opponent.

It's that mastery that's the point of sport to a large extent - at least to me. Our palaeolithic selves are happy doing, facing up to and overcoming problems. Someday, cars will drive themselves, AI drones will fight our wars. Maybe we'll be neutrally linked to those drones and feel we are flying but we'll never be as good as the robots because we have human qualms. It's the managing of that human nature that gives us point and purpose. Without it, like the computer in the Sci-fi classic film, *Dark Star*, we have nihilism.

You aren't a problem; you are the most fascinating puzzle you will ever try to know and fencing or any other sport, can help you come to know it
