Local Band Raises
Money For NHS

Bristol's favourite ska band and Shirehampton residents, The Emperials, have been running Lockdown DJ sets to keep people entertained during lockdown.

Faced with the prospect of no live gigs for a while, they thought it would be a fun to virtually 'hang out' on the first Saturday night of lockdown. Lead signer Steve Horton turned DJ for the night, playing ska & reggae hits live from his music room in Shirehampton. The guys presumed it would be just be a one-off bit of fun with a few friends, but hundreds tuned in, had a great time and demanded it happen every week.

The second week the band advertised a fundraising link where viewers could donate towards frontline NHS workers. Donations came flooding in, the band matched these out of their kitty, and £1,000 was raised in 2 hours. This money was immediately sent to **Bristol Food Union to support Bristol's frontline NHS workers**. Week five has just passed which was fancy dress night, with many viewers donning their best (and worst!) outfits and sending photographs.

The live streams continue every week of lockdown, with hundreds tuning in live every Saturday night to enjoy the music, chat comments and dancing in their living rooms. Staying true to the bands style, the nights always begin with ska and reggae but often genre hop as the night goes on... Disco





RECYCLING

Bristol City Council reopened Reuse and Recycling centres Monday 18 May Recycling centres are open from 8am to 6:45pm.

You must live in the Bristol City Council area and will be asked to show ID.

Strict social distancing measures will be in place, including:

- only allowing 6 vehicles in at once
- only allowing 1 person out of a vehicle at a time, unless more than one person is needed to move the waste
- 2 metre floor markings with only 1 person allowed within the markings at a time.

PARKS

Time spent outdoors in green space is crucial to mental and physical health. The latest Government advice now recommends that parks and green spaces are used **as often as an individual likes.**

We know that people wish to undertake simple actions in parks to help with their day to day maintenance and we fully support this.

Carrying out volunteer activities, for example litter picking, weeding, clearing, either on your own, with members of your own household or one other person who remains at least 2m away at all times is of great value to both people and parks.

However, at present, all our group volunteering sessions must remain postponed.

Finally, we've had some concerning reports of a number of "mass gatherings" being organised in Bristol Parks on Saturday. We are liaising with Avon and Somerset Police on this and would strongly

discourage people from attending these events. Fines have increased to £100 for the small minority who break the law.

Pedestrianising Our Streets

Bristol City Council says:

Our plan to pedestrianise the Old City and close Bristol Bridge and Baldwin Street to through car traffic is a real step forward to cleaner air and improved public realm, so we have accelerated those plans while the travel patterns have changed. These changes will be made by the end of the summer as an experimental traffic order, and we will use that as a bridge to consult fully on more permanent changes. This will provide opportunities for significant walking and cycling enhancements.

We are amental health support service currently offering telephone support to people living in Bristol and South Gloucestershire. We are wanting to reach out to people living in the BS11 postcode area as we have not yet had anyone contact us for phone support from this area and we believe there may be people who are struggling that don't yet know about us.





We are usually a face to face mental health service but are currently operating a telephone support service only, 7 days a week from 4-10pm. This is for people living in the Bristol and South Gloucestershire area who are in emotional distress or struggling with the day to day impact of COVID-19. We are able to work with those aged 16+.

SOCIAL CLUB DONATION FROM SHIRE GRATEFULLY RECEIVED

Dear Editor,

On behalf of Shirehampton Men's Social Club, may I thank you for your very kind donation of £200 which will be used to make much-needed repairs to the fabric of our Clubhouse at Lower High Street. The fact that your donation has been received whilst the Club has been required to temporarily cease operating during the present COVID 19 emergency has made it especially welcome.

The Club was formed in the early 1950s and initially occupied the Kingsweston Estate Offices situated at the corner of High Street and Waverley Road. Unfortunately, this fine building together with a picturesque row of cottages and shops on the opposite side of the High Street which included the premises of Mr. Dawes the Dentists were later demolished to enable road widening and required the Club to move to our present premises at the Lawns. We are fortunate to be in possession of a number of old photographs of Shirehampton village showing many of the old buildings that have since, regrettably, been demolished.

In normal times the Club provides a friendly and safe environment for residents of the district to meet socially and hosts Skittles and Darts teams and the Bristol Poker League play here every Wednesday night. A full-size Snooker Table and Pool tables are available for the use of members and a BT Sports Package is provided. Live musical entertainment is provided at a modest

cost each Saturday evening together with Bingo on Wednesday evenings in the large Lounge Bar, which is also available to non-members for Private Parties, Christenings, and Funerals, etc. on other days of the week. To try an increase membership this year, subscriptions have been reduced to £5 per annum and new or prospective members will always be welcome to drop in to view the amenities. Opening hours including the week end are from 10.00am till midnight

At present the Club is in Coronavirus lockdown so it is unable to trade and our staff are furloughed. However, we continue to incur necessary expenses for such items as insurance and fire/intruder alarm systems, etc. We have received the £10.000 grant from the government to assist us in the lockdown. Molson Coors, our brewery, have kindly agreed to replace all, out of date barrels, free of charge when we know our reopening date

Nevertheless, we are determined and look forward to re-opening following the lifting of the COVID restrictions and again providing a focal point for the social life of local residents. In the meanwhile, we wish everyone to stay safe and well until we can all meet again.

And we are going further, with new cycle lanes in central areas, including Marlborough Street, Park Row, Victoria Street, Lewins Mead and the Clifton Triangle. We know that to make walking and cycling an inclusive and accessible option for as many Bristolians as possible, we have to go beyond the centre and shift focus to other areas of the city. So we are also announcing measures in many other areas such as pavement widening in Bedminster Parade, Stapleton Road and Henbury to make these safe to use and provide local shopping options for people, supporting our local high streets.

These changes will take just a matter of weeks to implement.

Many of the schemes announced today are already mapped out through the £400m infrastructure programme in the West of England Local Cycling and Walking Infrastructure Plan. Because of this, these interventions are evidence-based, building on the work we have already done. We have taken time to explore potential unintended consequences on people shielding, their deliveries, or requirements for disabled access and the safety of junctions. We have to be mindful of the effects on emergency vehicles and displacement of traffic that these interventions have, so we will be watching the impacts (especially on air quality) closely.

To cope with the need for more social distancing, and also proactively approach the challenge our network will face as more people start to move around the city, we are bringing forward additional measures.

The road to recovery is difficult to predict, but it is clear that our public transport will be heavily impacted. Operators are experiencing a steep drop in demand, but also a significant change in their capacity as social distancing means buses take reduced number of passengers. We are committed to supporting our bus operators as part of the combined authority, and through the City Office by helping co-ordinate plans for returning to work.

Surveys by Transport Focus have shown that while many people will consider walking and cycling as options to get to work in future, even more will look to use private cars. It found that while 51% of people would be 'more' or 'very likely' to cycle or walk more often, 60% are also 'likely' to take more car journeys. In a city like Bristol, with congestion, clean air issues and a historically neglected transport network, that is a huge challenge.

We've always known that people need to have realistic and reliable alternatives to private car travel – we cannot simply force them out. This is why we've led on work with our bus deal, and will still



work towards the mass transit system Bristol so clearly needs. Our bus network is vital for people, and we need it to succeed in the long term if we are to reach our air quality and carbon neutrality targets.


Finally I want to thank everyone involved in keeping Bristol moving, especially when recent **government figures** show that it is our taxi, bus and coach drivers who are disproportionately affected by the virus. We are committed to working together with operators and the public to make sure everyone in Bristol feels safe on their way to, from and at work.

CLIMATE EMERGENCY NEWS

As we begin to come through the Corona Crisis people everywhere are asking: What next? What do we want our 'new normal' to look like? MPs, business leaders and concerned citizens have been writing to government urging it to prioritise green economic recovery measures. They think the recovery programme should invest in sustainable and resilient green industries and not subsidise or bail out polluters.



With so many people suffering and dying from the virus, it's been hard to imagine what we ought to be doing to keep people aware of just how serious the climate crisis is. We see that governments often ignore repeated warnings and fail to implement recommendations from scientists about how to respond to dangers in the natural world. And it begins to feel as if trying to inform people about the reality of climate change and the magnitude of its effects is a hopeless task. But at the same time, we hear commentators of all kinds saying that now we

have a unique opportunity to bring about real social and environmental change. So what to do? I think it's time, now while we have time, to think seriously about what kind of world we really want, about how we would really like to live. I think we should tell our representatives what kind of world we want to become the 'new normal.'

I think we should support the calls for the recovery programme to be guided by the urgent needs of the environment.

The clean air and clear skies brought about by the lockdown remind us every day of how the world can be if we change our ways. The Corona Crisis has forced us to change our behaviour and shown us that we can change in ways that benefit us all.

Tynings Field News

The group are very busy.

Gianna has re-seeded the poultry run and people have bought every single plot into growing use. Everyone has planted on one communal plot with spare seeds.

The pear trees donated by a member of the local community have grown to intertwine and so have the other fruit trees you all kindly donated at the beginning of the field

Many of our group are healthcare workers working long shifts - 12 hour per day - many days a week -in the thick of the Covid 19 pandemic leaving them with very limited time for allotments and horticultural things but exercise air is vital to our health and an hour or two gardening on days off is steady exercise.

So during the "clap for care workers" it's great to stand in the field hearing everything and banging the bin on the field for our colleagues keyworkers.

The field is a haven of peace. The blossom looks healthy on the trees this year. Hens are laying and nature is ruling.

The sky is unscathed by aeroplanes. Buzzards have been seen. Tawny owls call at night.

Wild meadow for the orchard with strimmed paths in between lets the wild flowers reset as there is less air pollution from which our community has benefited. However, the number of cars on the Portway seem to have increased which is worrying.

The bees are able to recognise faces. They are not happy around midday as hot days trigger their aggression but two hives were removed so they are now calm. If you see a swarm don't worry if they are busy they will leave you alone. Please contact us so we can get beekeepers Carl or Csaba to come and get it.

Somewhere in nature we may find the cure for SARS_CoV-2 it's not the only zoonotic virus, there are others. In the field and in farming in general a few years ago we had to take measures against a bird flu epidemic. We also had to follow procedures on foot and mouth. Zoonotic viruses can be spread across land carried by small animals or in water so virus is not new to us at Tynings Field and we follow our routines. We receive texts from Defra about this along with information on vegetable diseases like locations for clouds of Part time digger potato blight.



So in science vaccines for Covid 19 are being tested by brave volunteers. Our immunity can also be built by exposure to clean air, small doses of germs, and vitamin rich food.

Many of us have lost residents from care homes or relatives, friends or co-workers. But we must not forget in that collective grief that as a group we are dealing with issues not of our personal choosing but the result of man's destructive environmental practices.

The nation is short of farm vegetable pickers. Supply may not meet demand. Large farms now need to train the British workers to pick vegetables and this seems to be impossible.

Our choice is to take control of our food and grow as much of our own locally as possible on our

This was at the original Avonmouth Green on the site of the

The club was soon playing league bowls and surprising some of the opponents. The first league victory was on Brandon Hill against Cabot who were a very good and well-respected team. It was a very warm evening and a couple of the PBA Team, although resplendent in grey trousers sported fashionable coloured vests. This met with looks of disdain and much whispering from the opposition and this grew as the scores pointed to a victory for the visitors. After this, correct dress was very much order of the day.

Sea Cadets Shine a Light for Nurses

To mark International Nurses Day today, 12 May, nursing leaders asked the public to 'shine a light' and recognise the extraordinary work that nurses are do every day but especially in the fight against coronavirus. The day also marks on the 200th birthday of Florence Nightingale, who founded modern nursing and pioneered infection control. She is perhaps, also most famous for her lamp.



Florence Nightingale found fame in the military hospitals during the Crimean War where she was appalled by the poor sanitation and conditions leading to needless death and suffering.

Sadly, some of those sailors lost their lives. At that time sailors moved between the Royal Navy, Merchant Navy and fishing fleets. A father trained his sons in the skills of a sailor. The Sea Cadets were originally founded to train the sons of those who had paid the ultimate price in the Crimea.

Petty Officer (SCC) Batt of Thornbury Sea Cadets decided to show his support for all nurses but especially his shipmate Lt (SCC) Sidwell RNR who is a practicing nurse. She one of the three Thornbury Sea Cadets' volunteer staff who are key workers.

Petty Officer Batt said "Nurses play a vital and often underplayed role in the healthcare system. In the 400 Sea Cadet units in the UK there are many who also are working on the front-line including my unit, TS Battleaxe in Thornbury and my daughter's unit, TS Enterprise in Avonmouth."
