Bristol City Council

February saw the roll out of community surge testing in some parts of the city to help scientists and public health officials learn more about the mutated COVID-19 variant found in Bristol and South Gloucestershire. The variant, first found in Kent, is classed as "of concern", because it shares changes found in the South African variant that is being looked for elsewhere in country. The response to our community surge testing programme has been excellent.

Our rates of infection are continuing to fall, which is promising, but they are still high. Many of us are feeling the fatigue of lockdown, but we must continue to pull together and adhere to the guidance to get Bristol back up and running.

Vaccinations for Over 70s and Clinically Vulnerable

Appointments are currently available for people If you would like an appointment at a doctors' who haven't yet been vaccinated against COVID-19, and who are:

- over 70 years of age
- clinically extremely vulnerable and of any age (this means you've received a letter at some point asking you to shield due to a health condition)

You no longer need to wait to receive an invitation letter if you're in these groups. Getting vaccinated is your best protection against the virus, and the NHS is encouraging all eligible people to make a vaccination appointment without delay.

Organising a Funeral During Lockdown

If you have sadly lost a loved one and are planning a funeral, please work with the Bristol City Council crematoria service to reduce cases of COVID-19.

Current government lockdown restrictions allow 30 attendees at funerals. However, in order to facilitate social distancing in our chapels at South Bristol Crematorium and Canford Crematorium, we will only be permitting 20 attendees at funerals. This limit applies both indoors and outdoors, and does not include anyone working as part of the service.

We estimate that this will include approximately 7,000 more people in Bristol.

News from the Office of Darren Jones, MP

The vaccination roll-out now happening at pace across the UK has been remarkable and I want to pay tribute to the NHS and all those involved in getting Bristol ready for this next step in our pandemic response. In February, we started to see our efforts during this lockdown repaid with declining numbers in Bristol, but we must not become complacent now.

City Council have been working together with Public Health England and the NHS to set up additional community testing sites. This is to understand and isolate any new cases of the mutated version of the Kent variant of COVID19 that has been identified in some parts Bristol. Many constituents have written to me with questions about this, and the guidance on how to stay safe remains the same: stay at home, keep social distancing, wear a mask when shopping for essentials and wash your hands frequently. Bristol City council and PHE have been fantastic in providing up-to-date guidance throughout this lockdown, and I recommend you go to bristol.gov. uk/coronavirus if you have further questions.

As I write this update to you in February, Bristol I've also received enquiries about the remarkable vaccination roll-out happening in Bristol. Many questions are about how the vaccines work, how to get appointments and the vaccine's development. In February, I sat down and talked about these questions with the lead clinician for Bristol's roll-out. You can watch our video conversation at darrenjones.co.uk/vaccine. As this roll-out progresses, I am continuing to argue for vaccine prioritisation, so that our essential workers, including teachers and carers, on the pandemic's frontline can do their jobs safely.

> Thank you to all those that attended the Excluded UK Bristol North West forum in February. We need to ensure that our efforts to stop the spread

of this virus do not come at the cost of Bristol's vibrant local businesses or livelihoods of those excluded from government support.

Throughout the spring, I will be hosting more issue-driven online meetings for constituents; including a briefing on UK Environment and Agriculture policy later this month. You can find out more information, or request an event topic, at darren-jones.co.uk/events.

NEWS from the PBA Club

Dear members and community,

Happy New Year to you all, hoping you are well!

We are bringing you a further update on the charity and the formation of a new legal structure for the PBA Club so we'd like to introduce our board of trustees – Alex Richards, Emma Baldwin, Martin Preston, Alexis Woodward and Martin Ackerman who have all volunteered to assist steering the charity towards a sustainable and viable organisation for the future. The new trustees between them, bring expertise, local knowledge and enthusiasm to our fledgling project.

We have been meeting regularly on Zoom to have trustee training, manage the Community Asset Transfer, business development plan, and the financial modelling.

The strategic aim for the future is to secure a long term lease from the council which will allow development of the premises and grounds which will in turn benefit the local and city residents with enhanced facilities.

Our belief is that the key DNA of the club is a social and sports hub for the local community but we also aim to fulfil our new charitable purpose and increase our usage possibilities with other ideas. Our ideas could include a community/homeworker shared workspace, community kitchen/ education and training space, potentially a gym, crèche and space for our local youths.

The business development work has been funded by a small grant from Quartet, the grant has allowed us to get secure support from Voscur, who were very helpful, we've have had some architects plans drawn up and employed a business development UWE intern, the intern has been writing up the business development plans and has put together a Gantt chart (a project management tool) which will guide the trustees through tasks and time lines to finalise the project and present to the council by the end of August 2021. Our intern will soon be carrying out consultation amongst members, users, and other key stakeholders.

We have also been active with the consultation around the **Bristol Avon Flood Defence Strategy** which closed early December. New flood defences are to be constructed in the 2020's (indicative maps and consultation can be found on **bristol.citizenspace. com/**) and some are proposed for the field adjacent to the PBA and up along the path separating the houses from the club. Our ask is that the defences continue to stretch along the boundaries of the club thus protecting the pitches for generations to come.

The annual 2020 AGM has been postponed this year due to Covid restrictions. The finances for year this year will look very different but we have been closely monitoring cashflow, our suppliers have been supportive and offered us discounts, refunds, payment holidays, this alongside the local government support means the club's finances have been stable. All the staff have been put on furlough throughout closure, but we hope to welcome you and them back in the future.

Memberships have not been fully utilised since the club has been closed for most of 2020 so **memberships will not expire or be up for renewal January 2021**.



We have the possibility of an exciting new future and we are looking for volunteers and a club secretary to join us on our journey, we are all picking up new skills and contacts, it's a real learning experience. If you feel you could offer any or know anyone who could help, please do get in touch.

This has been a while coming, due to the various lockdowns, and was the result of grant funding from the Bristol City Council Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL), with particular help and support from Councillor Don Alexander. It was also one of the outcomes from Shirehampton Community Plan, and there will be some more arriving around the High Street in future months.


If folks locally want to advertise their events or activities on the noticeboard, contact details will be on the board. Let's hope there will be some to promote very soon!





Dr. John Templeton Bush

19.06.1929 - 01.01.2021



Many of you know that the Bush family experienced the sad loss of John Bush on the 1st January 2021 aged 91.

John's health slowly began to decline about eighteen months ago, and up until a year ago he was lovingly cared for by **Claire**, his wife at home until increasing frailty meant he moved to **Trymview Hall Nursing Home**.

The 30 somethings of Shirehampton are unlikely to remember John but if they asked parents or grandparents they'd be hard pressed to find someone who didn't have an anecdote about him. He was after all the **local GP for over 30 years**.

John and Claire came to Shirehampton to join the **'Ellis, and Archer'** practice in 1957. As junior partner he lived in Tregenna House, now flats, with his young family and with a small 4 roomed building attached, which was the Doctors Surgery. Then it was common for patients to queue outside down the driveway, to be seen in turn. John would remain there until the last person was seen. After house calls, his 'rounds' afternoon surgery would take the same format. Then if his turn he would be on call for the night.

John enjoyed being a member of the Shirehampton community, and his place within it, he was honest, straightforward, with the capacity to instil trust and confidence in those he cared for. He looked after generation upon generation, through their losses and celebrations.

The early 80's saw a move to a new health centre, about half the size of the one there now. This meant changes for John many of which he disliked in principle.... An appointment system!! A Practice Manager!!

John retired in 1989 after over 30 years of practice, which enabled him to spend long summers in Spain with Claire, more time with his ever enlarging family and more trips to **Westbury Mens Working Club**.

I have pondered how I shall remember John, the great debates righting all the wrongs of life, peppered with laugher and of course a glass of red. I know I shall recall fondly the snowy haired man with the rosy cheeks in the blue jumper, who became so dear to me, mellowing with age, sitting behind his paper listening and absorbing everything around him, offering practical suggestions, a kind word, a voice of sarcasm and reason, or simply that formidably raised eyebrow.



What is the **The Dasgupta Review?**

Some of you may have heard about the *Dasgupta Review on the Economics* of *Biodiversity* in the news at the beginning of February. We've all been hearing about the crisis in biodiversity for some time. We are warned that more and more species are becoming extinct, largely due to loss of habitat and climate change driven by human activity.

The Dasgupta Review – which was commissioned by HM Treasury – recognizes that ecosystems everywhere are adversely affected by human economic activity and "calls for urgent and transformative change in how we think, act and measure economic success to protect and enhance our prosperity and the natural world". It sets out ways in which we can take account of the impact of our economic activity – things like mining, agriculture, and deforestation – on the natural world.

What it comes down to is finding ways to name the economic value of the natural world and all its creatures so that governments and corporations will begin to see the value of protecting and preserving rather than degrading and destroying natural systems.

That may seem a bit remote to our daily lives, but we have opportunities every day to observe and learn more about our own local ecosystems – even those

in our own back yard. I wonder how many of you took part in the **RSPB's Big Garden Bird Watch**. I wonder what you saw this year and whether the numbers and species of birds you saw had changed much from last year. How are your birds doing? Mine are looking for nesting sites and eating the fat balls in this cold weather.

Flood Defences on Lamplighters Marsh

Many of you who walk regularly down the Yellow Brick Road will have noticed new barriers appearing in waste ground near the M5 bridge and perhaps wondered about the tunnels cut through the undergrowth at several points along the path. Avonmouth and Severnside Enterprise Area (ASEA) in partnership with the Environment Agency and Bristol City Council are carrying out 'enabling works', surveying and investigating the site in preparation for constructing new flood defences along the Avon to protect the Severn Beach Railway line.



The defences will come up from the riverbank and under the M5 bridge to the railway line. The proposals provide for a concrete wall under the bridge, a flood gate at the Avonmouth entrance to the **Yellow Brick Road**, and an earth bund running south parallel to the railway line.

The Marsh, a Local Nature Reserve, is home to rare mosses and lichens, protected animals like slow worms and badgers, and to a surprising variety of insect life and butterflies. The Yellow Brick Road is a well-used and well-loved walk that has been an important resource to people during lockdown. The Friends of Lamplighters Marsh (FOLM) have been working closely with the ASEA contractors to ensure that adequate environmental mitigation measures are in place to protect the plants and wildlife of the Marsh during construction. The Friends are also concerned to ensure that the Yellow Brick Road will remain accessible to walkers, especially those of you who access the path from the Avonmouth entrance.

The contractors are aware of our concerns and are keen to minimise any closures necessary at the Avonmouth end of the YBR. The expectation is that the major works will not start until late spring and the total closure time will be 1-2 months over the year, as the current plan requires several stages. Where possible the entrance will be diverted slightly to allow access. The contractors' team have promised to keep the Friends updated as the design and timescale of the works are finalised. And hopefully there will be advance notice of any closures.



It focuses on the God of Creation and our relationship with him and

SPORT IN SHIREHAMPTON へたたい City and Port of Bristol Bowling Club

The meeting on June 9th 1970 when it was decided that it was feasible to form a bowls club at The Port was the start of something that became organised and developed very quickly thanks to the people who were at that meeting and those who arrived soon afterwards.

Connection in those days was very much with The Port so it was inevitable that the first two Club Presidents were Port General Managers. Mr. G. E. Edney was approached to become the first President soon after the inaugural meeting. He accepted the invitation and held office from 1970-72. The Men's Four Wood Singles Trophy, competed for each season in the Club Competitions bears the name G. E. Edney.

Mr. G. Lowery took over

as General Manager and became Bowls Club President in 1973. He remained in office until 1976. There is no trophy with his name on but around that time **Mr. Stevenson**, a director at C.J.King did give a trophy to the club.

Mr. Stanley Turner became General Manager and was asked to become the next President but it appears from records at that time he declined as there was no mention of him following the request.

There was no President until **Jack Ashton**, when Port Policeman took office in 1987 and remained until 1990. The **Jack Ashton Triples** competition is played every season and the trophy with Jacks name on is presented to the winners at the Annual Presentation Evening.

Bill Deakin who worked at the Co-op Flour Mill was President in 1991-92. Bills daughters **Peggy and Jenny** followed him as players at the club. The **Bill Deakin Novice Trophy** is competed for each season by players without a previous trophy win.

Bill Evans who worked for councils in Gloucester and then Bristol took office as President in 1993 and remained until 2006. Bills son **Laurence and Daughter in Law Dawn** have both bowled for the club. Dawn is still very much involved as a player and as Competition Secretary.

John Brailey, a painter at The Port took office in 2007. He was a prominent bowler for many years and during his Presidency gave support in

numerous ways to individual members and the club in general. He often supported club bowlers in competitions and always took great interest in what was going on.

When John's term of office ended in 2009 **Roy Whitfield**, who worked for the Port in the Granary, became the seventh Club President and he also represented the Club as a representative on the main Club committee. His **wife Irene** was a bowler and very much involved at the club for many years.

David Hinksman took office in 2013 and is still President today. The PBA Bowls Club became City and Port of Bristol Bowls Club some years ago reflecting how things have changed over the years.

With numbers in need of a boost this year it is incredible to look back to 1985 when at the AGM a motion was proposed and agreed that membership should be limited to 120 (80 men and 40 ladies).

It is with regret that the 2021 Summer Tour based at Eastbourne in August has once again been postponed by a year. This is due to COVID-19 and matters related to it.


