Remembrance details Sunday at a Distance

This year marks the 75th Anniversary of the end of WWII and the 80th Anniversaries of Operation Dynamo (Dunkirk) and the Battle of Britain. This year's Remembrance Sunday would be marking each with respect and even our local gathering was expected to be its biggest yet, paying respect to all those who lost their lives and those who came home at the end of the war. With over thirty countries spread over three continents involved in WWII, peace was declared in Europe on 7th May 1945 and in Japan on 15th August 1945 (the USA commemorate this on 2nd September.)

Unfortunately Covid-19 arrived in 2020 and it's certainly left its mark. In the first lock down people around the UK continued to mark VE Day by having socially distanced parties in their streets remaining in their own space, sitting outside on their doorsteps and being sociable. Then the second lock down happened days before Remembrance Sunday. This meant no church services, no Remembrance Sunday at the local war memorials. To many this did not seem right. Even as I made my way to the memorial at the top of Park Hill Sunday morning I did wonder if any poppy wreaths would be there? Would people still be paying their respects at 11am?

The spirit of our local communities did not let us down. Poppy wreaths had been placed earlier that morning, Remembrance crosses were there too, social distancing was being adhered to by the small number of people who came and went

spending a few short minutes in silence. This was after 11am I must add. I was fortunate to see several veterans leaving the area and I called them back for a socially distanced

photograph and they gladly obliged. If that hadn't happened the picture accompanying this article would have been a very lonely war memorial with some poppy wreaths and that just didn't sit right with me. I wanted a photo that said 'they have not been forgotten' and with covid-19 still in our midst, 'they will never be forgotten'.

Corona Virus Info

In mid-November at time of going to press the country received promising news about the development of a coronavirus vaccine. But the vaccine is not ready yet and will take time to roll out so we must continue to keep following the guidelines to get infections down.

Remember – hands, face, space, and if you develop symptoms, get a test. You can book a test online, or by calling 119.

As part of a new scheme, Bristol will be one of 67 areas to receive rapid COVID-19 tests which will help to support and expand our local testing capabilities. The devices are called antigen lateral flow tests and they don't require a laboratory. We will use them to stem the spread of the virus in vulnerable groups.

This winter we are making sure everyone has a roof over their head. We estimate there are around 75 people sleeping rough in Bristol. We have three sites operating as supported housing and we will increase emergency accommodation available, particularly for those with higher support needs.

Finally, please continue to look after each other and your own mental health. A 24/7 mental health support line is available on: 0800 0126 **549.** Reach out to these services, and each other for support and care.

Get help with the EU Settlement Scheme during lockdown

Do you care for, work with or know someone from a non-UKEU country?

Due to Brexit, EU citizens must apply for the EU Settlement Scheme if they want to continue living in the UK after June 2021. Even if they have lived in the UK most of their lives. EU nationals who have lived continuously in the UK for five years or more should be entitled to settled status, meaning they are free to go on living in the UK indefinitely. We cannot know for certain how many people are outstanding in applying for the scheme, but we do know that without settled or pre-settled status, they will not have the same rights in the UK after Brexit UK as they do now.

We are particularly concerned about:

- Older People (only 1% of applications are from over 65s)
- Gypsy, Roma and Traveller communities (their OFFICIAL SETTLEMENT applications may take much longer due to needing to arrange ID)
- aware and have come through another EU country.

Due to current COVID-19 restrictions, our Citizens Service Point is unable to help EU citizens who need to apply for the EU Settlement Scheme.

Apologies for keeping quiet on the Lark Ascending! 15th December this year will be the centenary of the world premier of The Lark Ascending (piano and violin version) at the Public Hall. And the Bristol Ensemble are still planning to organise a concert at the Hall. However, due to Covid 19 restrictions, only a limited audience will be allowed. We are now planning on broadcasting the concert on the internet on the day of this important anniversary.

And I do have some good news for you. Bristol Ensemble have recently been awarded a grant for the Lark Ascending project and other already planned events in partnership with Shirehampton Public Hall. We are very pleased that the previous and current owners of Kings Weston House are very supportive of holding some of the events. We will continue working together and hope the events




will be able to go ahead next year or after Covid-19 crisis is over.



Census 2021 is Coming!

The next census is happening on 21st March 2021. So, what is the census and why does it matter? The census is a survey that happens every 10 years and gives us a picture of all the people and households in England and Wales. The census is unique. There's simply nothing else that gives so much detail about us and the society we live in. It tells us what our needs are now, and what they're likely to be in the future. It also gives a snapshot of how we live, for future generations to look back on. Knowing what your community's needs are helps organisations like councils plan and fund public services in your area.

Information you give informs where billions of pounds of funding is spent on things like transport, education and health. Charities and voluntary organisations often use it as evidence to get funding. It helps businesses to understand us as customers and, for example, decide where to open new shops. Plus, those doing research, like university students and people looking into their family history, use the information. That's why it's so important everyone takes part.

The census is run by the Office for National Statistics (ONS). They are keen to make sure everyone has the support they need to take part in the census. Census 2021 will be "digital first" meaning it will be mainly online. ONS will be offering a wide range of support services to make sure the census is as accessible and inclusive as possible. These include:

- guidance and support in many languages and formats
- help in local centres with trained staff and online access

- a contact centre to give help over the phone, in a webchat, webform, email and SMS
- field staff contacting households that have not yet filled in their form
- accessible census questionnaires, for example, in Large Print
- the option to request paper questionnaires.

We are working with Stefan Edwards, the Census Engagement Manager for Outer Bristol to make sure our community is represented. Stefan's role is to work with local leaders, community organisations, and charities to support communities if they have any specific needs. There will also be a large team of field staff on hand to help people across England and Wales. They'll have local knowledge and be there to encourage and support people to fill in their questionnaires. We will keep you up to date with more census related news over the coming months.





The City Climate Strategy

Here it is December. We're just coming out of our second Lockdown. It's getting colder, Christmas is coming, but there are still restrictions – the virus is still out there. And so is Climate Change ... though that's probably the last thing we want to think about.

Back in mid-November while we were still struggling to get Covid under control, Bristol City Council published its Climate Strategy, because one thing we do know for certain is that Climate Change is ongoing and will seriously impact our city over the coming years. The City Climate Strategy looks at ten key areas where action is needed **now** if Bristol is to become 'carbon neutral and climate resilient' by 2030.

We know that global warming is caused by Greenhouse Gas emissions and that those emissions are caused by burning fossil fuels – coal and oil. The **only** way to prevent climate change causing catastrophic damage to human society is to **stop burning fossil fuels**.

We know that 34% of each person's 'carbon footprint' comes from transport – from the fossil fuel, whether petrol or diesel, that we all burn when

we use our cars. And so the first key area the Climate Strategy looks at is transport. We are asked to switch to 'significantly more walking and cycling and to use zero carbon public transport. In the near future we will have to convert to zero carbon fuels like electricity for our cars – but for now we know how much we enjoyed the cleaner, quieter air during lockdown, the daily walks and fewer car journeys. We know this is a change we can make.

We each have a role to play in making the necessary changes: "Community climate action is a key part of the transformation to a carbon neutral world and all citizens have the opportunity to make this happen". So next time I'll write about another of the key areas where action is needed to make Bristol climate resilient so that we all can begin to see what we can do.

This long warm Autumn has caused young hedgehogs to still be out and about, and a friend and neighbour just the other day had cause to take one to the rescue centre across the river. I believe


it had an injury to one of its legs, so I hope they will be able to heal it.


