Wildfire in Shire

The woods are a wonderful place to be when it is hot. A tree's canopy blocks out up to 90% of the sun's radiation and mean that we can lose more heat to our surroundings by cooling the ground beneath us.

We are so lucky in Shire that we have **Penpole Woods** just up the hill, five hundred metres from the **High Street**. In the **August heatwave** the kids and I went up early in the morning to enjoy the shade and have a drink stop at **Morgan's in Kings Weston House**.

What we found was wildfire burns on the grassy area opposite the **High School**, and an unnervingly dry forest floor. Patches of tree leaves were yellowing and dropping, a drought response.

If you're anything like me, the effect that climate change and intensive farming is having on our wild spaces and biodiversity is really, really scary. It is sometimes labelled 'climate anxiety'. This doesn't do it justice. Anxiety suggests a disproportionate worry. It isn't, and what many of us feel, at times, is more like climate terror.

Each of us hears the facts. They are hard to face, and sometimes knowing that my children are going to have a far more difficult life than I have enjoyed makes me feel sick. Fear is a very unpleasant feeling, so is guilt, It is so tempting to look away, block it out, keep it at

arm's length. Crop failure happens far away, so do floods, so do wildfires. Oh no, hang on...

As awful as fear and guilt are to experience, they are important feelings too. They help to keep us safe. They tell us, deep down, when something is not right. When we are not safe, something needs to change.

When our gardens are silent of bugs and birds, our paving slabs radiating heat into already hot homes, and our natural spaces are burning, it's time to look the situation in the face. It takes a huge amount of courage to face our fears, and our guilt, but it frees us, we stop being trapped by a terrifying situation that feels out of control. We can make choices about what we want for our children. About how we live our lives and how we hold our institutions to account.

One of the things I love about Shire is its sense of community, and a certain sense of independence. A feeling that as a community we can own our decision making and feel confident about what is important to us. That is a pretty strong foundation for facing up to reality and creating the futures we need.

Troubling Times for Shire Newspaper

We have just celebrated 50 years of publishing Shire during which time it has become a mainstay of village life keeping our community in touch with each other, campaigning on our behalf, supporting local activities, like "Carols on the Green" and other community groups through small grants out of the surpluses it made.



"Shire" has always been a **completely voluntary** run paper, from its **editorial group** who collate the articles sent in, and provide some themselves, making sure they reflect what is happening in "Shire" through to the **distributors** who each month, without fail, count and bundle the **5,000 papers** and pass on the bundles to the group who **deliver to all the households in Shire**.

In between these there is the management group, again voluntary, who ensure the smooth running, sorting out the adverts, providing photos, managing finances, keeping in touch with what is or maybe happening in Shire.

The main costings for the paper are the printing and set up costs that we have, plus some minor management costs like insurance, online services etc.

To pay for these costs the paper has used its advertising pages as its only source of revenue which has up to now been sufficient to cover these costs and provide a small surplus which has been reinvested back into the community.

The last two years have been difficult, coming out of the lockdowns, during which time we lost large amounts of revenue, and had to call on our reserves to cover that period.

Since then the amount of advertising has steadily declined with businesses closing, people retiring, and more use of the internet.

At our last **AGM** in **August** we declared a net profit of only *f*,414 for the year.

After a recent **increase to our printing costs** we have been advised that are likely to **rise again** in the near

future. In response to this we will now have to raise our advertising rates accordingly (see across) as we have no other costs we can cut.

However, we will work hard to continue to make the paper viable and would welcome any support you can give, whether by advertising in the paper, sponsoring some aspects of the costs or any other ideas that will help us to survive the next 50 years.



St. Mary's church was filled with celebration on July 17th, where a large dance show was finally held after a slight delay due to covid, to mark the 10th Anniversary of local dance company ConfiDANCE- a non-profit community group providing free and subsidised dance sessions to children and young people in the Bristol area.













Dancers aged 3-16 from 3 Shirehampton STOMP groups were joined by other ConfiDANCE groups including Patchway STOMP, Lockleaze ConfiDANCE Crew and Severn Beach ConfiDANCE Crew to put on a display that showcased everyone's hard work through a variety of routines whilst also raising money for local good causes.

The show was made up of current numbers from each dance group, featuring themed dances such as the Lion King, Pirates Sea Shanty, 100 years of dance styles, Candy Land, Street Dance routines and a Musical Theatre piece about celebrating uniqueness. Each dance group also learnt an older piece from the 10 years of ConfiDANCE to remember our dance journey over the years. These routines were significant to the dancers in different ways - some teen dancers wanted to bring back a favourite ConfiDANCE performance from their childhood, some had fond memories of learning the routines at a dance camp or performing it at the Colston Hall and one dancer even had an adult family member who was a dancer 10 years ago with us and wanted to learn a routine that they performed too!

In addition to the group pieces, dancers were given the opportunity to choreograph their own performance piece, choosing and editing their own music, sorting costumes, and creating their own moves. The dancers who took part in this challenge

showcased themes including Encanto, Friendship, Kung Fu Fighting, Spies, Sunshine and Moonlight, Beach Vibes, Cheerleading, Hip Hop, Street Dance, Musical Theatre and Tik Tok inspired dance moves.

To round off the show, we held a special award ceremony to commemorate the 10 years of

ConfiDANCE clubs in action, with every dancer taking home a trophy for their group work and choreography challenges. We were also able to give some special awards for dancers who have grown up with ConfiDANCE and have now developed into leadership roles of helping to lead younger classes, operating our tech systems and volunteering at shows and events. Finally, 2 dancers were awarded a dedication trophy for lasting the whole 10 years with us- well done!

A huge thank you to everyone who came and celebrated with us- we were able to raise £250 which will be split between ConfiDANCE and **Mental Health Charity Mind**. A big thanks also to our volunteers who have given up their time to ensure classes were able to run each week and thank you to the local families who donated trophies in order for us to be able to hold an award ceremony.

I have thoroughly enjoyed running all of the ConfiDANCE classes over the years, watching the children and young people grow in confidence, reach their full potential and perform at various church events, school workshops, community fairs and theatres- here's to the next 10 years of ConfiDANCE!





Climate Action Plan for Shirehampton

The Climate Emergency Group has joined forces with Shirehampton Community Plan and SCAF to develop a Climate Action Plan for Shirehampton. We'll be holding an interactive workshop to discuss local priorities and actions in response to climate change.

Interactive Climate Plan Workshop

Tuesday 13 September, Cotswold Community Centre, Dursley Road, 7:30 pm.

Bristol City Council has been encouraging communities to develop their own strategies for addressing climate change. We want to discover how we here in Shirehampton are being impacted. We need to find out what measures people would like to take to make Shirehampton more resilient.

One thing we can do is calculate our carbon footprint.

A carbon footprint is the total greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions caused by an individual, event, organization, service, place, or product, expressed as carbon dioxide equivalent (CO₂e).

When we know what our carbon emissions are and how we cause them we will be able to find ways to reduce them. As you can imagine, this will be a big project which will need input from everyone in Shire. The workshop will be an opportunity to say what YOU think needs to be done.

SCEG is also hoping to offer a morning of expert advice on heating, insulation and reducing fuel costs. This will probably be in early October, so watch this space.

Moving Bristol Forward

A number of us from Shirehampton and Sea Mills joined the Bristol on Board Day of action at the end of July.

Moving Bristol Forward is a coalition between Zero West and the Transport for Greater Bristol Alliance campaigning for integrated and AFFORDABLE public transport.

The hot weather saw a few trees begin to struggle in the orchard until, we were blessed with rain. We have started cutting the long grass down in stages. A fox had a picnic on a wood pidgeon and left the feathers for us!

I would ask people not to encourage or feed foxes in their gardens, they are breeding well enough and becoming prolific this in turn affects the ecological balance and predatory food chains in a negative way.

Much of our veg is ready. Plum and damson trees have done well and **Caroline** has set about making **Tynings Orchard** damson mead for Christmas and jam.

The orchard is available to the paid in members of the group but unless you are a member please don't help yourself with no permission, if you are caught it is theft. Free fruit can be found in the daisy field.

Chinese lanterns in full flame were seen flying overhead from the riverbank towards the allotments, posing a high risk of causing a wild fire. If this was you, you could face a charge of arson as they are banned.

We open our field for a work session on 17 and 18th September 2 till 5pm. Anyone can come on this day and lend a hand, buy eggs and whatever produce we have.

As the summer closes upon us we harvest the fruit from the orchard and make deserts. This year also we are making Tynings Field Mead, a fruit Wine which will be ready for Xmas.

One of the geese has already started enjoying windfall apples.

The desert below is made from baked plums and cut crumpets.



Our workday for cutting down the grass in the orchard will be coinciding with our open day 17th September 2 till 4pm.


We are incredibly grateful to **Reverend Emma** Langley for kindly supporting our church while Reverend Patrick was away.

This turned out to be something he had weaved earlier with thin branches in the shape of a fish. We all fell for it!

John Hastings, a member of Friends Of Lamplighters Marsh said "Steve never fails to educate and entertain. His 'down to earth' knowledge and attitude engages with all who come across him".

Whilst Steve England summed up the afternoon "It was great to return to Lamplighter Marsh once again leading a walk for FOLM. It is a wonderful place to explore and go for a walk along the river. There is always something exciting to see and I'm always finding new things. To show the local residents

some of the interesting finds that can be seen along the river, not many people realised that Sea Trout swim up the river or how valuable the mudflats are to wildlife. Everyone who attended the walk was thrilled especially when we foraged for wild Sea Beet an edible estuary plant. We cooked it after the walk and served with Marsh Samphire and butter, yummy."

We await for Steve's return and hope it won't be too long.
