### Lifeboat Rescued

A group of locals have recently taken over and begun a significant renovation project of the Lifeboat Inn in Shirehampton High Street.

Admiral Taverns had the lease of the Lifeboat on the market for six months, but with no interest being shown, there was a very real risk of the premises being turned into flats which would have meant another piece of our local history lost forever, along with The Rising Sun, the Snooker Hall, the Swimming Baths, the Bingo Hall, Robin Cousin's Sport Centre etc.

To avoid this, a group of nine locals, who all have history with the place, have banded together,

### **PUBLIC INFORMATION FOR JULY**

### **Current Covid Information**

Bristol's current rate of infection as of 14 June was 41 COVID-19 cases per 100,000 population. We are seeing a sustained increase in cases. The increase in infection rate is a cause for concern, not alarm. We encourage you to take up the offer of regular rapid testing which is open to everyone in Bristol. Please also book your vaccination when you are eligible to do so.

If you're meeting with friends or heading to the pub this weekend, please remember to follow the COVID guidance in place. Meet outside rather than inside where possible, and please be kind and patient to hospitality staff who are doing their utmost to keep customers safe.

### **Vaccine Cohorts Opening Up**

People aged 21 and over are now eligible for the COVID-19 vaccine.

One dose of the vaccine helps to protect you against the virus, but you need to have both doses before you are fully protected. The second dose gives stronger protection from severe illness.

If you are eligible, there are two ways to get a COVID-19 vaccine:

- use the online service to book appointments at a vaccination centre or a pharmacy (www.nhs.uk/conditions/coronavirus-covid-19/coronavirus-vaccination/book-coronavirus-vaccination/)
- wait to be contacted by your GP surgery and book your appointments with them

There is slightly less capacity for first dose appointments at the moment because the focus is on bringing forward second dose appointments.

If you can't find a suitable appointment using the online service, please keep trying because new appointments are added daily.

### #GetTested4Bristol

There are still many conveniently located sites in Bristol to get a test if you have symptoms.

Victoria Rooms, Netham Park and Hengrove Leisure Park sites are open until 1.30pm each day. They become community collect sites for regular lateral flow (rapid) testing at 2.30pm. Brislington Park and Ride and Temple Street testing sites are open for symptomatic testing all day. If you have symptoms of COVID-19, you should self-isolate and book an appointment to get tested at www.gov. uk/get-coronavirus-test As many as one in three people with COVID-19 do not display symptoms, and lateral flow (rapid) tests help identify people who are positive and highly infectious.

- Some local pharmacies
- Any of our collection sites (www.bristol.gov.uk/coronavirus/guide-to-rapid-testing)
- Bristol Rapid Testing Centre our friendly staff can also show you how to take your tests safely and properly.

### **Remember to Register Your Rapid Test Result**

Regular rapid testing is available to everybody in Bristol without symptoms of COVID-19.

If you are opting to take your rapid tests at home, please remember to register your test result within 24 hours on the GOV.UK website or by calling 119.

If your rapid test result is positive, you need to:

- Self-isolate immediately
- Book a follow-up PCR test (which is analysed in a laboratory) on the GOV.UK website or by calling 119.

Support is available to you if you need to self-isolate. You may be eligible for an NHS Test and Trace Support Payment (www.bristol.gov.uk/benefits-financial-help/covid-19-financial-help/test-and-trace-payment-support). If you need help to get food or do other essential tasks, please call the We Are Bristol helpline on 0800 694 0184.

#### **Countries Added to Red and Amber Travel Lists as of 8 June**

RED LIST: Afghanistan, Bahrain, Costa Rica, Egypt, Sri Lanka, Sudan, Trinidad and Tobago.

If you return to Bristol from any of these countries you must quarantine in a government-approved hotel. You must take a COVID-19 test on or before day two and on or after day eight of your quarantine.

**AMBER LIST:** Portugal was moved to the amber list June 8th. If you are returning from Portugal, you must self-isolate at home for 10 days even if you feel well. You must take a COVID-19 test on or before day two and on or after day eight of your quarantine.

If you are self-isolating you may only leave your home to take a COVID-19 test. You may not have family or friends over. If you need support during this time, please contact the **We Are Bristol helpline** on 0800 694 0184.

## Twenty-Five Year Old Club at Risk of Closure - Help Us Celebrate, Not Close!

Lawrence Weston and Shirehampton Out of School Activities Club risks closure and needs your help!

The pandemic has impacted many people in many ways, including our local after school and holiday play scheme.

Lawrence Weston and Shirehampton Out of School Activities Club (LWOOSA and SOOSA) is a mainstay of our community, but it is now at risk of closure. The club, which is based at Shirehampton Primary School and The Rock Centre, has been looking after local children for over two decades. In fact, it celebrates its 25th anniversary this year and would so love to carry on serving the community for another 25!

Providing critical after school care for the children of **Shirehampton**, **Lawrence Weston and Avonmouth**, it is the only club of its kind in the BS11 area, providing much-needed support for local families.

As a small, independent charity, the club relies heavily on donations and grants so that it can continue to provide these services. However, due to the pandemic and reduced capacity, the club is currently running at a loss of around £2,000 a month and could be forced to close within the year.

Should this sad situation become a reality, the families of Shirehampton, Lawrence Weston and Avonmouth would have no other options for childcare. Ensuring this club stays open really is crucial for so many families in BS11.

Rita Rich, project manager, said: "We want affordable childcare to be a right not a fight!! Our track record of affordable, quality childcare in a safe, nurturing and fun environment is at the heart of everything we deliver. We want to continue to support local families for many more years. If Lawrence Weston and Shirehampton out of school

activities was to close it would have a detrimental impact on the local community as a whole."

purchased the lease, and are investing thousands into the project. The plan is to run the Lifeboat as a not for profit, multifunctional community pub, offering teas, coffees, cakes and snacks in the days, somewhere where you could take your laptop and work for an hour or two, but in the evenings, becoming a traditional pub, with outdoor seating, sports, live music on weekends, and basically somewhere you'd like to spend an evening with your partner or friends.

It was clear the old place was in dire need of a face-lift and the decision was made to completely start again, even as far as reconfiguring the layout which has been in place for as long as anyone can remember! A lot of hard work has been put in over the last few weeks, which anyone passing by would have glimpsed through the open doors. Firstly, the bar area was returned to a 'blank canvas' but then the skills of builders, plumbers, electricians, carpenters, tilers, decorators, floorers, plasterers, glaziers etc were required. There was an appeal to the local community on Facebook and the response has been overwhelming. This has really struck a chord with people of Shirehampton,







and the local community has responded in fantastic fashion. The team have been inundated with offers of help. The target is to hold a grand reopening event around the end of June or early July when hopefully all covid restrictions will have been lifted.

Local people will know that the Lifeboat has had its issues in the past, but with the help and goodwill of the community, and A LOT of hard work from the new leaseholders, the hope is that Shirehampton will be left with an establishment we can all use and be




Every year Portishead Coastguard are called out to investigate sightings of red distress flares, and subsequently find they have been fired from land and did not indicate a genuine emergency. While the team is thankful that there is no vessel in distress, it must be emphasised that red or orange distress flares are intended to be used only in the case of a maritime emergency when immediate assistance is required. Because of their nature and what they mean, it is highly illegal to fire any red flare on land or in a harbour. The misuse of flares can incur severe penalties.

Most recently the team was called to deal with some time-expired flares that had been found abandoned on a beach. Flares have a serviceable life of only three years from the date of manufacture, yet the abandoned flares had expired six years previously! It obviously follows that a time-expired flare may not function as originally intended. That might be just that it fails to fire at all, but it might also be that it could leak some very nasty chemicals, or it could misfire and propel white-hot phosphorus in an unexpected direction. The dangers are pretty obvious.

For boat owners, the issue of disposing of timeexpired pyrotechnic flares can be a difficult one. In the first instance, owners with out-of-date flares should try to return them to the place they bought them or where they are buying replacements. Many chandleries offer this service. Now there is also a fresh option in the Bristol area. LGS at Avonmouth will take your time expired pyrotechnics and dispose of them for a small charge. With this service so close by, there really is no excuse for flares just being abandoned, dumped in normal rubbish or left outside coastguard, RNLI, police or fire service premises, all of which are against the law and dangerous.

Aside from issues of illegal firings and illegal disposal, it's also important to remember that flares are sometimes fired for genuine emergencies. Anyone seeing a red flare should immediately

### **News from Darren Jones MP**

Darren is back after a small break due to the local elections with a busy summer ahead working on transport, jobs, the environment and housing in Shire and across Bristol North West. As the restrictions start to lift, you'll start to see him out and about again in person, including on the Saturday street stall outside of the Coop. There will continue to be online events though, as these have allowed lot of residents to take part at the same time.

The Iron Bridge, which has been closed for far too long, was a key feature of the recent local election campaign. Hats off to those residents who have put so much energy into getting on the agenda of every candidate. Darren's main priority at this stage is getting the council to submit the planning permission it needs to secure to start work. It was promised this would be done and, now that the elections have happened, it has been escalated to the mayor's office. The expectation is that this will now be done shortly.

Local transport is still a big concern for residents. Some good news is that the Portway Park and Ride has secured some investment following an agreement with the owners of the new Bristol Arena to fund local transport upgrades and will ensure that works are done in a way which also supports the local environment.

Darren thanks everyone that took part in the **Safer School Journey survey** last month. There were over 550 submissions from parents and guardians across Bristol North West, including many with children at Shirehampton and Nova Primary Schools. The survey confirms that many parents worry about dangerous and difficult roads near schools, improper parking and a lack of crossing points. Feedback in Shirehampton shows that **Springfield Avenue**, **St Mary's Road and the high-street** are problem areas that need addressing. Darren will be sharing this feedback to school headteachers and with **Bristol City Council** to lobby for improvements. If you'd still like to submit evidence to the survey, you can do so at: **www.surveymonkey.co.uk/r/w2school**.

Darren has also been really pleased to see investment in our high street in Shire. The team at **Ruby Jean's**,

who are expanding their small coffee shop into a full-scale restaurant in the old Natwest building are doing great work as are the volunteers reviving the Lifeboat into a community pub. Darren believes that high streets are the vibrant heart of our local communities and wants to pay tribute to the Shirehampton Community Action Forum for their engagement with residents in pulling together a plan for Shire.

As ever, do get in touch with Darren if you need any help or have a question. During the pandemic, the MPs office has seen a significant increase in requests for assistance, which have taken them longer than normal to respond to. 

### **Put Dogs** in Nappies **Proposal**

Are you tired of playing dodge-thedog-poo on public footpaths? Arubbish collection company has started a bold new campaign to force dog owners to put nappies on their furry friends - or face steep fines. This is a growing problem across the UK including the streets and parks of Shirehampton. Since lockdowns began in March 2020, the amount of dog poo has increased 200% on Britain's streets.

Divert.co.uk spokesperson, Mark Hall, said: "It might sound like a joke, but this is deadly serious - dog poo is a blight on our streets and owners must be held accountable one way or another. Dogs in the UK produce 900 tonnes of poo every day and we don't want that to start finding its way to our streets, parks, and footpaths. We all love our furry friends, and they bring a lot of joy into owners' lives, but it should not mean someone else has to deal with the tell-tale piles of poo that seem to follow behind. It's not only the disgusting - and annoying - aspect of this poo-explosion that have driven Divert.co.uk to call for nappies on dogs. Dog faeces contains a dangerous bacteria called toxocariasis which can cause blindness.

Divert.co.uk's proposal is that much like some dog owners do when their female dog is in season, owners are required to put a nappy on their dog when walking in public spaces. A drastic move, but not the first legal requirement put in place to stop dog owners fouling up our streets. A law passed in 1982, The Control of Dogs Ordinance, states it's an offence to fail to clean up a dog's faeces while in public - and no excuses, such as not having poo bags or not knowing the law, will wash when trying to challenge a prosecution or fine.

We don't want to get to a point where dogs are seen as a public nuisance - they're man's best friend, but not when they're messing up pavements, getting stuck in pram wheels or all over your shoes.


## Hello from Shire Methodist

In June, we met face-to-face (with face-masks and social distancing) in our church building for Morning Worship, for the first time in a long time. Please contact us to check the arrangements if you are planning to attend in July.

Who knows what July will bring? Perhaps we might even beable to sing hymns again in our church building. We all miss singing: many Methodists consider that Methodism was born in song and Methodists are known to be enthusiastic in their hymn singing. The founders of the Methodist Church, John and Charles Wesley, realised the power of singing to strengthen faith when they were travelling across the Atlantic to Georgia in January 1736. There was a terrible storm at sea, but a group of German Moravian Christians inspired the brothers with their confidence in God. They preached and sang hymns together and the Wesley brothers realised their own faith was much weaker. Charles Wesley was inspired to write 6000 hymns in his lifetime. Probably the most famous is the Christmas carol "Hark the Herald Angels Sing", which some people think Charles wrote at his home here in Bristol.

We have continued to work on trying to become an Eco Church in our mission to look after God's creation. We have been delighted to see different species of bees, important pollinators, making use of the viburnum and alkanet. In past years we might have considered pulling up all of the alkanet, which many people would call a weed. Taking time, to notice it is providing a café facility for bees has helped us realise we need to take care of these wildflowers along with those that we have planted. We have also introduced a little Bug Hotel and plan to add a bee drinking station. If you have any ideas for making our garden more wildlife friendly, please let us know! Some old photos of the church show there used to be a large, lush front garden between the High Street and the church building. Perhaps you remember those days. The concrete was probably added to make life easier for the Church



members. Do you remember this happening?

### **CLIMATE NEWS FOR JULY:** G7 Summit in Cornwall

G7 Environment and Climate ministers met in May to prepare for the G7 summit which took place in Cornwall in June. The G7 or Group of Seven are Canada, France, Germany, Italy, Japan, the United Kingdom and the United States. The Climate and Environment Ministers' Communiqué in May said:

to strengthening implementation of the Paris Agreement [on Climate Change] and to unleashing its full potential. To this end we will make ambitious and accelerated efforts to reduce emissions to keep a limit of 1.5°C temperature rise within reach, strengthen adaptation to the impacts of climate change, scale-up finance, ... support, protect, restore and sustainably manage nature, and enhance inclusive and gender-responsive action. We affirm our commitment to work with these objectives in mind towards a successful COP26 in Glasgow and beyond.

We reaffirm our strong and steadfast commitment All G7 Climate ministers have signed up to the global '30x30' initiative to conserve or protect at least 30% of the world's land and of the world's oceans by 2030. They have agreed to phase out government funding for international fossil fuel projects, starting by ending new finance for coal power by the end of 2021. They have committed £1.4 billion to helping poor countries transition away from coal power and they are increasing support for solar and wind energy.

> It is good news that the G7 have made these commitments. But, as Prince Charles pointed out in the speech he made at the Eden Project, climate

change and species destruction are two aspects of the same environmental degradation. That is why the IPCC (International Panel on Climate Change) demands that governments clearly say **HOW** they are going to reduce carbon emissions and WHAT measures they are taking to protect and restore natural habitats. As Prince Charles said, business and government must ACT together and act NOW to reduce dependence on fossil fuels. It will be up to us ordinary people everywhere to hold leaders to account and insist these commitments are fully honoured.

The Climate Emergency Group is planning a morning event in the Public Hall for Saturday 4th August to learn more about the COP 26 Climate Conference in Glasgow in November. We'll say more about COP 26 next month.

Following World Environment Day on 5th June, data from the Department of Business, Energy & Industrial Strategy has been analysed to reveal which regions in the UK produce the most renewable energy.

As countries across the world begin to announce across the UK, with the South West holding the climate emergencies, generating energy in a renewable manner has never been more poignant. There are 871,608 renewable energy site sources sites for every 1,000 households in the South West.



## Veg Growers at Tynings Field







Tony was a **GP14** sailor (at one time he owned two) and he was a regular at the club almost every Saturday morning clearing the slip. Though Tony retired from sailing around 12 years ago he continued to help with the particularly important job of clearing the slip into his late eighties. Tony was a character at the club and no doubt around Shire village where he lived.
